The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTE A -- Description of plan and significant accounting policies

The following brief description of Wilderness Hotel & Resort, Inc. Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The participating employers adopted the Premier Retirement Partners LLC's Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan originally effective on November 1, 1999. The participating employers have subsequently amended and restated the Plan with the most recent restatement effective January 1, 2022.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan with elective deferral 401(k) features covering eligible employees of the participating employers, all of which are part of a controlled group, (Wild Golf, Inc., Wilbar, Inc., Wild Lake, Inc., Wilderness Hotel and Resort, Inc., Glacier Canyon, LLC, Sundara Spa, LLC, Sarento's Restaurant LLC, Del Canyon LLC (DBA Fields at the Wilderness), Wilderness Development Corporation, and Air Wilderness, LLC) -- (herein collectively referred to as "the company") who have completed one year of service and have attained age 21. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Trustees oversee governance of the Plan. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and report to the Plan's Trustees.

The Plan's federal identification number is 39-1804611 and the Plan's number is 001.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute any combination of pretax and Roth deferrals up to 100% of annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The company makes an employer matching contribution equal to \$1.00 for every \$1.00 contributed up to a 4% participant contribution. The company also has the right to make a discretionary contribution to be allocated to participants pro-rata based on compensation. No additional discretionary contributions were made in 2024. Annual contributions from all sources are subject to certain limitations defined by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

Contributions receivable

Contributions receivable are written off when they are determined to be uncollectible. The allowance for credit losses is estimated based on expected credit losses considering the Plan's historical losses, existing economic conditions, and the financial stability of the company.

Participant accounts and “rollovers”

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of (a) the employer’s matching and discretionary contributions, (b) Plan earnings and (c) charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations of Plan earnings are based on participant account balances, as defined, and allocation of company contributions are based on participant compensation, as provided in the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account. The Plan permits the transfer of funds from other qualified plans to a separate participant’s rollover account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and employer matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the company’s allocated discretionary contributions portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested ratably over six years of credited service. Participants, who leave the Plan because of death or disability, as defined in the Plan, are considered 100% vested in all amounts.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with the local prevailing rate, as determined quarterly by the plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement (age 65) or termination of employment, a participant may elect either a lump-sum distribution of the entire vested account balance or in a single sum distribution of a portion of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account. In-service distributions are available upon reaching age 59 ½. In addition, hardship distributions are permitted if certain criteria are met. A participant with an account valued at less than \$5,000 shall receive a lump sum distribution. For accounts exceeding \$5,000 the participant may elect a lump sum distribution or may elect to defer such distribution to any valuation date subsequent to his/her termination but no later than the valuation date of his/her normal retirement date; or the participant may elect to roll over the distribution to another qualified plan.

Forfeited accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0. These accounts are used to reduce future company matching contributions or pay plan expenses. In 2024, employer contributions totaling \$0 were reduced by funds from forfeited non-vested accounts.

A summary of significant accounting policies follows:

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) under the accrual method of accounting.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value, which is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Trustees determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance company. See Note C for discussion of fair value measurements.

Income, gains, and losses from the assets in each account are credited or charged against that account without regard to other income, gains, or losses of John Hancock or any other separate account. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses

One of the Plan's sponsoring employers, Wilderness Hotel and Resort, Inc., pays most of the administrative expenses of the Plan, which are excluded from these financial statements. The major administrative expenses are payroll and related expenses.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded.

Subsequent event

These financial statements have not been updated for subsequent events occurring after September 19, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued. The Plan has no responsibility to update these financial statements for events and circumstances occurring after that date.

NOTE B -- Information certified by the asset custodian

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023 and net appreciation and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (John Hancock), the asset custodian of the Plan.

NOTE C -- Fair value measurements

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- Pooled separate accounts. The pooled separate accounts are invested in investments such as stocks, mutual funds, short-term investments, bonds, etc. John Hancock owns the underlying investments in the separate accounts. The underlying measurements for the separate key prices for similar assets in active or non-active markets. While the underlying asset values are quoted prices, the net asset value of the separate account is not public quoted.

Gains and losses (realized and unrealized) included in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, are reported in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Investments Measured Using the Net Asset Value per Share Practical Expedient

Certain Plan investments are managed by John Hancock. John Hancock is the asset custodian and recordkeeper for the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

John Hancock provides certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to a Master Plan Services Agreements (MSA) between the company and John Hancock. John Hancock receives revenue from mutual fund service providers for services John Hancock provides to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to John Hancock for its administrative services to the Plan.

If the revenue received by John Hancock from such mutual fund service providers exceeds the amount owed, John Hancock remits the excess to the Plan's trust on a quarterly basis. Such amounts may be applied to pay Plan administrative expenses or allocated to the accounts of the participants. During 2024, there were no excess amounts. The Plan or Plan Sponsor may make a payment to John Hancock for administrative expenses not covered by revenue sharing.

Fees were also paid by the Plan during the year for other professional services rendered by Premier Retirement Partners. These transactions also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE E -- Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their allocated discretionary company contributions.

NOTE F -- Tax status

The Premier Retirement Partners LLC's Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan that the Plan has adopted effective January 1, 2022, obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the volume submitter plan, as then designed, was acceptable under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) for use by the employers for the benefit of their employees. The Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter. However, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

NOTE G -- Concentration of market risk

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

NOTE H -- Plan amendments

The Plan has made certain elections with required effective dates in both 2024 and 2025 or later. The elections relate to the Secure Act provisions, which laws address, among others, to allow benefit payments up to \$5,000 for qualified births or adoptions, to increase the dollar limit for mandatory benefit payments from \$5,000 to \$7,000.

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to include a provision that long-term part-time employees who become eligible to make deferrals will also be eligible to receive safe harbor matching contributions.

Effective March 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to allow a maximum of eight loans (regular or hardship) for the lifetime of the employee's employment.
