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REPORT OF INDEPENDENT AUDITORS

To the Plan Administrator
B&E 401(k) Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of B&E 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the 2023 financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of B&E 401(k) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.



Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about B&E 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of B&E 401(k) Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about B&E 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.



Other Matter - Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules, Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions and Schedule of Assets Held at Year End, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- the form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Note 1. Description of the Plan

Effective January 1, 2016, B&E Resources, LLC, (the “Company” or “Sponsor”) adopted the B&E 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) to provide retirement benefits for all eligible employees who have completed 90 days of service. The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more comprehensive description of the Plan’s provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Company who have met a 90 day service requirement. An employee may enter the Plan upon meeting the eligibility requirements, beginning on the first day of the month following the date they met the service requirements, at which time they may contribute to the Plan and receive employer contributions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as amended.

Custodian and administration: The Plan’s assets are invested through participant-directed accounts in various pooled separate accounts and a fixed account. Empower Retirement, LLC (“Empower”) acts as the asset manager and custodian for the Plan’s fixed account and as recordkeeper and service provider for the Plan. Empower is referred to herein as the “Custodian”. Duties of the Custodian include, among others, recordkeeping, receiving and investing cash contributions and investment income and making payments from the Plan funds as directed by the participants and the Plan administrator.

Administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. Certain administrative services and costs are incurred by the Company without cost to the Plan. No officer or employee of the Company receives compensation from the Plan.

Contributions: Participants may make contributions to the Plan under a 401(k) salary deferral arrangement up to the maximum percentage (100%) of annual compensation, as defined by the Plan, and the dollar amount permitted under section 402(g) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) not to exceed \$23,000 in 2024. The Plan also allows participants to designate a portion or all of their deferral contributions as Roth deferral contributions. Additionally, participants who are at least 50 years of age as of December 31, 2024, are permitted to make catch-up contributions of up to an additional \$7,500 for 2024. Participants are also allowed to contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans as rollover contributions.

During 2024, the Company made a safe harbor matching contribution equal to the employee’s elective salary deferral up to 100% of the first 3% and 50% of the next 2% of eligible compensation. The Company, at management’s discretion, may make a matching contribution equal to a uniform percentage of the participants’ salary deferrals, not to exceed 6% of the participants’ compensation. In addition, the Company, at their option, may contribute additional amounts considered profit-sharing contributions. There were no additional discretionary matching or profit-sharing contributions made in 2024.

Participant Accounts: Each participant’s account is valued on a daily basis and is credited with the participant’s contribution, his or her portion of the Company’s matching and profit sharing contributions and account earnings and is charged with applicable withdrawals, account losses, and an allocation of certain administrative expenses as determined by the different investment options he or she directs the Plan Custodian to make on his or her behalf. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting: Participants are immediately fully vested in their contributions and Company safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company’s discretionary employer matching and profit-sharing contributions, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of continuous service, based on the following:

The Plan provides for a participant to be fully vested upon death, permanent disability, or the participant's normal retirement date if the participant is an active employee at the time of the event.

Investments: Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct the allocation of their contributions and Company contributions among various investment funds offered by the Plan's Custodian. Each participant can choose to deposit all contributions in one fund or allocate the investment among several funds in any whole percentages. The funds are invested in a broad range of stocks and bonds with varying risks. The allocation of investment income for each of the investment options is based on the ratio that each participant's account balance bears to the total account balance of all eligible participants.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Under provisions of the Plan, participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to a maximum of the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% from the vested account balance. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the participant loan fund. Generally, loan terms may not exceed five years unless the loan is for the purchase of a primary residence, in which case the Plan administrator may permit a longer repayment term. The loans are collateralized by the vested balance in the participants' accounts and bear interest at the prime interest rate plus 2%. Interest rates on participant loans outstanding as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 ranged from 5.25% to 10.50%. Principal and interest are repaid ratably through periodic payroll deductions. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits: On termination of service, a participant who has a vested interest in their account which is less than or equal to \$5,000 shall receive a lump sum equal to the vested interest of their account. Participants who have a vested interest in their account which exceeds \$5,000 may elect to leave their account balance in the Plan or receive a single or partial lump sum payment equal to the vested interest of their account.

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant or beneficiary may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account.

Withdrawals: Participants may make early withdrawals up to the full balance of their elective deferral contributions in their account under the hardship provision of the Plan. A participant may make unrestricted withdrawals of the vested interest of their accounts on or after age 59 1/2. Vested contributions and earnings are automatically distributable under the required minimum distribution rules at the later of the date the participant attains age 72 or terminates employment. Effective January 1, 2023, under the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement ("SECURE") Act, the required minimum distribution age increased from 72 to 73, for participants born after a certain date established under the SECURE Act.

Forfeited Accounts: Forfeitures consist of the non-vested portion of terminated participant account balances and may be used by the Plan to pay for Plan expenses or in certain cases, reduce any employer matching contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the forfeiture account balance totaled \$2,484 and \$2,417, respectively. During 2024, no Plan expenses or employer matching contributions were funded from the forfeiture account.

Plan Expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP"). Benefits are recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to use estimates that affect certain amounts reported in the financial statements, accompanying notes, and supplemental schedules. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value) as further described in Note 4 and 5. Contract value is the relevant measure for the Plan's fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because contract value is the amount Plan participants generally receive when executing transactions under the terms of the contract and Plan provisions. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Company determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Custodian. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants

Loans to participants are reported as notes receivable from participants at the unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

Recent accounting pronouncements

In June 2016, the Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") issued Accounting Standards Update ("ASU") 2016-13, *Financial Instruments — Credit Losses (Topic 326)* (with subsequent targeted amendments) which modifies the measurements of expected credit losses for certain financial instruments and financial assets, including contribution receivables. This guidance was effective for fiscal years beginning on or after December 15, 2022 and was adopted by the Plan on January 1, 2023. The adoption of the guidance did not have a material impact on the Plan's financial statements.

Management of the Company does not believe that any other recently issued, but not yet effective, accounting standards could have a material effect on the accompanying financial statements. As new accounting pronouncements are issued, the Plan will adopt those that are applicable under the circumstances.

Note 3. Investments

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the U.S. Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. All investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held and notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest income on notes receivable from participants, and investment income for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by the Custodian.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board's (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to the unadjusted quoted priced in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements), and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible to the reporting entity at the measurement date for identical assets and liabilities.
- Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities that are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full term of the asset or liability. Level 2 inputs include the following:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Observable inputs other than quoted prices that are used in the valuation of the asset or liabilities (e.g., interest rate and yield curve quotes at commonly quoted intervals);
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.
- Level 3 – Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability (i.e., supported by little or no market activity). Level 3 inputs include management's own assumption about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability (including assumptions about risk).

The level in the hierarchy is determined based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement as a whole.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled separate accounts (NAV Practical Expedient): Each pooled separate account invests its assets solely in the shares or units of an underlying mutual fund, and the investment objective of each subaccount corresponds to the investment objective of the underlying fund. The value of each account is determined at net asset value (NAV) per share of the underlying fund at year-end, adjusted for administrative expenses and other charges. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no unfunded commitments related to these investments, and the investor may redeem these assets daily. The Plan has elected the NAV practical expedient in accordance with ASC 820-10-35-59. Because of this election, these investments are not classified within the Level 1–3 hierarchy.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held no investments valued in the level 1, 2, or 3 fair value hierarchy.

Note 5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts (Fixed Account)

The Plan's fixed account investments are fully benefit-responsive contracts with Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company ("MassMutual"). MassMutual maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The fixed account investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than the declared interest rate for the calendar quarter in which contributions are received. The declared interest rate as of December 31, 2024, was 2.80%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Because the fixed account investments are fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the fixed account investments. The fixed account investments are presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by MassMutual, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events included the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

In addition, certain events may allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without consent of the issuer.

Note 6. Related Party Transactions

Certain Plan investments of the Plan are managed by the Custodian, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan also has notes receivable from participants. As a result, these investments, the notes receivable from participants and all related transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These transactions are exempt from being prohibited transactions by ERISA.

Fees paid by the Plan to the Custodian and the third-party administrator for administrative services amounted to \$11,715 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 7. Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing/Money Purchase/CODA sponsored by Loren D Stark Company. On November 30, 2020, the Internal Revenue Service stated in an opinion letter that the prototype adopted by the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") and therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan has been amended since receiving the letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a government authority. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine examinations by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no examinations for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities, which are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for plan benefits.

Volatility in the financial markets may significantly impact the subsequent valuation of the Plan's investments. Accordingly, the valuation of investments at December 31, 2024 and 2023 may not necessarily be indicative of amounts that could be realized in a current market exchange.

Note 9. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in employer contributions.
