Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of ABM 401(k) Employee Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical



requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter – Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 to the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than U.S. generally accepted accounting principles. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting, as described in Note 2, and for determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of the modified cash basis of accounting, as described in Note 2.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting, as described in Note 2.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

(1) Description of the Plan

The ABM 401(k) Employee Savings Plan (the Plan) is a defined contribution plan, which is intended to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the Code), as a profit sharing plan with a qualified cash or deferred arrangement that satisfies Code Section 401(k) and is funded by a trust intended to be exempt from tax under Code Section 501(a). The Sponsoring Employer under the Plan is ABM Industries Incorporated, a Delaware corporation (the Company). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

The Plan operated under an individually designed plan document since January 1, 2015, with subsequent amendments. The following is a brief description of the Plan's provisions. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

(a) Eligibility

In general, all eligible employees of the Company and its domestic subsidiaries which are under common control with the Company within the meaning of Code Section 414(b), (c), (m), or (o) are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of the month following completion of one (1) month of service. The following individuals are not eligible to participate in the Plan: (i) individuals eligible to participate in the ABM 401(k) Employee Savings Plan II (Plan II), (ii) individuals whose employment is governed by a collective bargaining agreement under which retirement benefits were the subject of bargaining, (iii) certain nonresident aliens who received no earned income (within the meaning of Code Section 911 (d)(-2)), or (iv) individuals classified on the payroll as seasonal or temporary employees and (B) provided that the Plan has been adopted by the board of directors of the subsidiary which employs such employee.

(b) Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute between 1% and 50% of eligible compensation by salary deferral. Contributions are subject to applicable Code restrictions and limitations.

Individuals age 50 and over are allowed to make additional elective pre-tax catch-up contributions each year.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from former employers' qualified retirement plans (rollovers).

The Plan operates under a safe harbor employer matching contribution applies to all eligible participants in the Plan upon completing six months of service. Under this matching formula, the employer made matching contributions for eligible participants equal to 100% of the first 3% of the participant's eligible compensation contributed to the Plan, plus 50% of the next 2% of eligible compensation contributed to the Plan.

(c) Vesting

The value of the participant's account, including the Company's matching portion, is fully vested at all times.

(d) Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, employer matching contribution, and plan earnings or losses, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on the participant's specific investments or account balance, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's entire account balance.

(e) Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan permits participant loans. Loans are limited to the lesser of \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in the prior twelve-month period, or 50% of the participant's vested account balances. The minimum loan amount is \$1,000. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Loans are repaid via payroll deductions, generally have a term of not greater than 60 months, and bear a fixed interest rate equal to the prime rate as published in The Wall Street Journal on the last business day of the calendar quarter preceding the date the loan is finalized, plus 1%. As of December 31, 2024, the interest rates on loans ranged from 4.25 % to 10 % with maturity dates through September 2044.

(f) Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, retirement, or permanent disability, a participant may receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested account balance. If the participant's account balance is \$1,000 or less, a lump-sum payment may be made without the participant's written consent. If the value of a participant's account is between \$1,000 and \$7,000, and if the participant does not specify the form of payment, the Company is authorized to rollover the vested amounts into an Individual Retirement Account established by the plan administrator for the participant.

In the event of the death of a participant, the account balance becomes payable to the beneficiary or beneficiaries as designated by the participant.

A participant may receive hardship withdrawals and in-service age 59.5 withdrawals from certain accounts under the Plan.

In addition, participants may be able to request a distribution of their accounts upon disability in accordance with the terms of the Plan, attainment of normal retirement age (age 62) or on termination of employment.

(g) Administrative Expenses

Generally, administrative expenses are paid by the Plan. However, certain administrative expenses may be paid by the Company. Loans and other transaction specific fees are charged to the accounts of participants electing such transactions. In addition, certain investment related expenses reduce investment income presented in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis).

Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Incorporated (Merrill Lynch), a wholly owned subsidiary of Bank of America Corporation, provides certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to a Master Plan

Services Agreement between the Company and Merrill Lynch, effective as of January 1, 2013 (the MSA). As described in the MSA, Merrill Lynch receives revenue from processing fees, service fees, distribution fees and other fees from mutual fund or collective trust providers, which revenues are attributable to the Plan's assets invested in such funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to Merrill Lynch in connection with the administration of the Plan. If the revenue received by Merrill Lynch from such mutual fund or collective trust providers exceeds the amount owed to Merrill Lynch under the MSA, Merrill Lynch remits the excess to the Plan's trust. The determination of whether such revenues exceed or fall below the amount due to Merrill Lynch under the MSA is made on a quarterly basis. The amount of any such excess is deposited in the Plan trust no later than forty-five (45) days following the end of any such quarter. Such amounts are held in an unallocated account and may be applied to pay administrative expenses, and/or allocated to the accounts of Plan participants.

(h) Plan Investments

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and account balances within various investments offered by the Plan. Plan assets are held in a trust administered by the trustee.

Effective July 15, 2024, American Europacific Growth Fund, ClearBridge International Growth Fund and Oakmark International Fund were replaced by Fidelity International Index Fund. Northern Trust S&P 500 Index Trust was replaced by Fidelity 500 Index Fund. Putnam Stable Value Fund was added. Effective December 31, 2024, Invesco Developing Markets Fund was replaced by DFA Emerging Markets Core Equity 1.

(i) Asset Transfers

From time to time, asset transfers occur between the Plan and Plan II due to changes in employee classifications. This resulted in interplan transfers out of the Plan and into Plan II.

The Company entered into a purchase agreement on August 25, 2021 with Crown Building Maintenance Co. and Crown Energy Services, Inc. along with its subsidiaries. Crown Energy Services, Inc. dba Able Engineering Services ("Able Engineering Services") sponsors the Able Services 401(k) Retirement Plan (the "Able Services Plan"), for the benefit of eligible employees of Able Engineering Services and its participating employers. In January 2023, the assets of the Able Services Plan merged with the Plan with respect to all employees not covered under a collective bargaining agreement.

The Company entered into a purchase agreement on June 21, 2024 with Quality Uptime Services, Inc. ("Quality Uptime") sponsors the Quality Uptime Services, Inc. ("Quality Uptime") Retirement Plan (the Quality Uptime Plan"), for the benefit of eligible employees of Quality Uptime and its participating employers. Effective December 30, 2024, the assets of the Quality Uptime Plan merged with the Plan with respect to all employees not covered under a collective bargaining agreement.

(j) Plan Administration

The Plan is administered by the Administrative Committee appointed by the Compensation Committee of the Board of Directors of the Company. Bank of America, N.A. serves as directed trustee of the Plan and Merrill Lynch serves as the recordkeeper of the Plan.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Accounting

The accounts of the Plan are prepared on a cash basis of accounting modified to carry investments at fair value, whereas contributions are recognized when received rather than when earned, and deductions are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the financial statements are not intended to present net assets available for benefits and changes in net assets available for benefits in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP).

(b) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(c) Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 9 for discussion on fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a settlement-date basis. Interest and dividend income are recorded when received. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments consists of the change in unrealized appreciation or depreciation during the years, and the realized gain or loss on the sales of investments during the year. Acquisition costs are included in the cost of investments purchased, and sales are recorded net of selling expenses.

(d) Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are valued at amortized cost. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as a distribution based upon the terms of the plan document.

(e) Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan may invest in various types of investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that change in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term.

(f) Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

(3) Information Certified by the Plan's Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected to have the audit performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The Plan Administrator determined that the certifications received from Bank of America, N.A. meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Bank of America, N.A.

The Plan's independent accountants did not extend their audit procedures to the information certified by Bank of America, N.A., except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

(4) Income Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated November 8, 2016, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable Sections of the Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Finner & Smith Inc. by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Inc. Defined Contribution Pre-Approved Plan is designed in accordance with applicable Sections of the Code. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code.

The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

During 2019, the Company discovered that certain covered groups were no longer eligible to participate in Plan II but continued to participate. These participants were eligible to participate in the Plan effective 1/1/2018 resulting in an amount owed to the Plan from Plan II.

(5) Transactions with Related Parties

Certain Plan investments are managed by the trustee or an affiliate of the trustee, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

(6) Nonexempt Transactions

As reported on Supplemental Schedule I, certain employee contributions and participant loan repayments totaling \$11,551,853 were not remitted to the trust within the time frame specified by the DOL's Regulation 29 CFR 2510.3 102, thus constituting nonexempt transactions between the Plan and the Company for the year ended December 31, 2024.

(7) Administrative Committee

The Plan provides that a committee shall serve without compensation until the resignation or the termination of this committee by the Company. The Administrative Committee, by majority agreement, oversees the operation and administration of the Plan.

(8) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA or the Code. In the event of termination of the Plan, all assets would be distributed based on the participants' account balances.

(9) Fair Value Measurements

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 defines fair value as the price that would be received by the Plan for an asset or paid by the Plan to transfer a liability (an exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date in the Plan's principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability. ASC 820 establishes a fair value hierarchy that requires the Plan to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. The hierarchy places the highest priority on unadjusted quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and gives the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of inputs within the fair value hierarchy are defined as follows:

Level 1: Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2: Significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Significant unobservable inputs that reflect the Plan's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability.

In many cases, a valuation technique used to measure fair value includes inputs from multiple levels of the fair value hierarchy. The lowest level of significant input determines the placement of the entire fair value measurement in the hierarchy.

Money market funds are valued at par, which represents fair value and thus is included within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and thus are included within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Common/collective trust funds are reported at NAV of units held by the Plan on the last business day of the Plan year by the manager of the fund. These funds publish a daily net asset value (NAV) and transact at that price. The common/collective trusts held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and have a readily determinable fair value and thus are included within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan's valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or
