Note 1 PLAN DESCRIPTION AND BASIS OF PRESENTATION

The following brief description of the AbleNet, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for complete information.

GENERAL

AbleNet, Inc. (the Company) established the Plan effective as of January 1, 1992. As of April 2014, the Plan was amended and operates, in relevant part, as a leveraged employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) and is designed to comply with Section 4976(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (IRC), and is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan is administered by the Company.

On September 18, 2015, the Plan purchased 24,057 shares of the Company's common stock using proceeds of a loan from the Company (see Note 5) and holds the common stock in a trust established under the Plan. The stock was purchased at a price of \$71.10 per share, for an aggregate purchase price of \$1,710,439.

On August 25, 2022, the Plan purchased 4,977 shares of the Company's common stock using proceeds of a loan from the Company (see Note 5) and holds the common stock in a trust established under the Plan. The stock was purchased at a price of \$899.46 per share, for an aggregate purchase price of \$4,476,571.

On November 15, 2023, the Company redeemed 6,830 shares of the Company's common stock using the payment for distributions from plan participants. The stock was purchased at a price of \$1,989.15 per share, for an aggregate purchase price of \$13,585,877.

On November 15, 2023, the Plan purchased 6,830 shares of the Company's common stock using cash. The stock was purchased at a price of \$1,989.15 per share, for an aggregate purchase price of \$13,585,877.

On September 11, 2024, the Company redeemed 2,690 shares of the Company's common stock using the payment for distributions from plan participants. The stock was purchased at a price of \$4,948.51 per share, for an aggregate purchase price of \$13,311,198.

On September 11, 2024, the Plan purchased 303 shares of the Company's common stock using cash. The stock was purchased at a price of \$4,948.51 per share, for an aggregate purchase price of \$1,499,904.

The borrowing is collateralized by the unallocated shares of common stock and is guaranteed by the Company. The lender has no rights against shares of common stock once they are allocated to participants in accordance with the terms of the ESOP. Accordingly, the financial statements of the Plan as of March 31, 2025 and 2024, and for the years then ended, present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to:

- a. The accounts of employees with rights in allocated common stock (allocated), and
- b. Common stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated).

ELIGIBILITY

Employees of the Company are generally eligible to participate in the Plan after 90 days of service. Participants must be a participant during part of or all of the plan year to be eligible for an allocation of Company contributions for such year. Eligible employees become participants in the Plan on the first day of the calendar month immediately following the attainment of these eligibility requirements.

CONTRIBUTIONS

The Company is obligated to make contributions in cash to the Plan which, when aggregated with the Plan's dividends and interest earnings, equal the amount necessary to enable the Plan to make its regularly scheduled payments of principal and interest due on its term loan. Employee contributions are not permitted.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Distributions are not allowed until a participant dies (in which case, payment shall be made to their beneficiary or, if none, their legal representatives), attainment of age 62, date participant has completed at least 12 years of ESOP participant and have attained age 55, or otherwise terminates employment with the Company. Distributions are made in cash or, if a participant elects, in the form of Company common stock, or both. On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement the vested portion is distributed in a lump sum if a participant's vested account balance does not exceed \$280,000. If the participant's vested account balance exceeds \$280,000, the participant will receive annual installments equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account, defined. For separation from service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the vested interest value in their account as a lump-sum or annual installment distribution. Payment of the account to the participant normally will be made after employment ends following the applicable waiting period. Payment will be made in the form of a lump sum distribution or annual installments, depending upon the size of your account and the reason for the payment. Under the provisions of the Plan, the Company is obligated to repurchase participant shares, which have been distributed under the terms of the Plan if the shares are not publicly traded or if the shares are subject to trading limitations.

VOTING RIGHTS

Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to their account and is notified by the Board of Trustees prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. The Board of Trustees is not permitted to vote any allocated share for which instructions have not been given by a participant. The Board of Trustees is required, however, to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interest of Plan participants and beneficiaries.

PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each plan year with an allocation of shares of the Company's common stock released by the Board of Trustees from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company of the plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation. Plan earnings are allocated to each participant's account based on the ratio of the participant's account balance.

VESTING

If a participant's employment with the Company ends for any reason other than retirement, permanent disability, or death, they will vest in the balances in their account based on total years of service with the Company. Participants vest 25 percent per year of service and are 100 percent vested after 4 years of service.

PUT OPTION

Under federal income tax regulations, the employer stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the current appraised value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

DIVERSIFICATION

Minimum diversification program under federal law is offered to participants close to retirement so they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a 6-year period. In each of the first 5 years, a participant may diversify up to 25 percent of the number of post-1986 shares allocated to their account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50 percent. Participants who elect to diversify receive a cash distribution, in which case, shares are distributed. The election to diversify is made subsequent to year-end based upon the shares of employer stock in the participant's account at year-end.

The Company offers an alternative diversification program to participants close to retirement so they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 50 with at least 12 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over an 11-year period. In each of the first 5 years, a participant may diversify up to 20 percent of the number of post-1986 shares allocated to their account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth and subsequent years, the percentage increases by 5 percent each year up to 50 percent. Participants who elect to diversify receive a cash distribution, in which case, shares are distributed. The election to diversify is made subsequent to year-end based upon the shares of employer stock in the participant's account at year-end.

FORFEITURES

Plan forfeitures are allocated to each participant's account based upon the relation of the participant's eligible compensation to total eligible compensation for the Plan year. Forfeitures allocated to participants during March 31, 2025 and 2024 totaled \$486,432 and \$148,640, respectively. Forfeited non-vested account balances to be allocated to participant accounts in future years as of March 31, 2025 and 2024, were \$0.

Note 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF PRESENTATION

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

ALLOCATIONS

The financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to (a) the accounts of employees with rights in allocated stock (“allocated”) and (b) stock not yet allocated to employees (“unallocated”), including shares that are committed to be released. Shares are released from collateral and become allocated generally in the period in which debt service is actually paid.

INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION

The shares of Company common stock are reported at fair value. See Note 4 for a discussion of the fair value measurements. Dividend income is accrued on the ex-dividend date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Realized gains and losses from security transactions are reported on the average cost method. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net depreciation/appreciation includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES

As provided in the Plan agreement, administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Company. The Company has historically paid the operating expenses for the Plan.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Benefits are recorded when paid.

SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events through <DATE>, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 4 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specific (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at March 31, 2025 and 2024.

Money market: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The fund is required to publish its daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The money market held by the Plan is deemed to be actively traded.

Investment in AbleNet, Inc. common stock: The AbleNet, Inc. common stock held by the Plan is reported at fair value based upon an appraisal. This appraisal was based upon a combination of the market and income valuation techniques consistent with prior years as illustrated in the following table:

The valuation process involves the Plan Board of Trustees’ selection of an independent appraiser. Plan management accumulates the data for the appraiser from historical and projected financial information of the Company. The appraiser prepares a preliminary report of estimated per share value that a participant will receive upon distribution which the Plan Board of Trustees, along with Plan management, reviews in detail, discusses and approves.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 NOTE PAYABLE

In 2015, the Plan entered into a \$1,710,439 term loan agreement with AbleNet, Inc. The proceeds of the loan were used to repurchase 24,057 shares of Company common stock. Unallocated shares are collateral for the loan. The number of shares released in any year is the number of shares held as collateral, times the ratio of the current year payments divided by the total of this year's payments, plus all future years' principal and interest payments. This resulted in 1,249 shares being released and allocated for the years ended March 31, 2025 and 2024.

The term loan agreement bears interest at 3.00 percent and is payable in 19 annual installments of \$114,968. The balance of the note payable as of March 31, 2025 and 2024, was approximately \$860,409 and \$946,969, respectively, determined by using interest rates currently available for issuance of debt with similar terms, maturity dates, and non-performance risks.

In 2022, the Plan entered into a \$4,476,571 term loan agreement with AbleNet, Inc. The proceeds of the loan were used to repurchase 4,977 shares of Company common stock. Unallocated shares are collateral for the loan. The number of shares released in any year is the number of shares held as collateral, times the ratio of the current year payments divided by the total of this year's payments, plus all future years' principal and interest payments. This resulted in 167 shares being released and allocated for the years ended March 31, 2025 and 2024.

The term loan agreement bears interest at 3.00 percent and is payable in 30 annual installments of \$227,552. The balance of the note payable as of March 31, 2025 and 2024, was approximately \$4,243,660 and \$4,340,636, respectively, determined by using interest rates currently available for issuance of debt with similar terms, maturity dates, and non-performance risks.

Note 6 COMPANY DIVIDENDS

The Company paid a dividend to the Plan of approximately \$944.33 per share or \$44,838,868 for the year ended March 31, 2025. The Company paid a dividend to the Plan of approximately \$269.58 per share or \$12,800,000 for the year ended March 31, 2024. As required by the plan document, the current appraised value of the shares returned to participant accounts in exchange for the use of such dividends was at least equal to the current value of such dividends.

Note 7 RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan invests in Company common stock and has a note payable to the Company. These are related party and party-in-interest transactions. As described in Note 2, the Company pays all plan expenses. The Plan has a number of service providers. Such parties are parties-in-interest under ERISA.

Note 8 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan investments consist primarily of the Company's common stock, which is exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows, and other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in the common stock and to uncertainties inherent in estimates and assumptions, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of the common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9 PLAN TERMINATION

The Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to plan provisions. Upon termination of the Plan, the Employee Benefits Administration Committee direct the Board of Trustees to pay all liabilities and expenses of the ESOP and to sell shares of financed common stock held as collateral to the extent it determines such sale to be necessary in order to repay the loan. Subsequently, the interest of each participant in the trust fund will be distributed to such participant or their beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the IRC. In the event of termination of the Plan, all participants become fully vested.

Note 10 TAX STATUS

The Plan has received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated October 22, 2015, stating that the Plan is qualified, under the IRC and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain qualification. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
