Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Step Up On Second, Inc. 403(b) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

For information included in the supplementary information that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

NOTE 1 – Description of the Plan

The following description of the Step Up On Second, Inc. 403(b) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan which covers substantially all employees of Step Up On Second, Inc. (the Organization). Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan immediately upon hire. Leased employees and employees who normally work less than 20 hours per week are excluded from the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Administrative Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Discretionary matching contribution amounts may be contributed at the option of the Organization's board of directors for employees that are 18 years or older and have worked at least 1,000 hours during the year. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Organization made a discretionary matching contribution of 50% of the first 6% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The Organization's contributions are invested as directed by the participant. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Other Employer Contributions Receivable

During the years 2016 through 2024, there was an error in the calculation of eligible compensation, whereby certain elements of compensation were improperly excluded from plan-eligible wages. As a result, both participant and employer contributions were underfunded.

NOTE 1 – Description of the Plan (Continued)

Other Employer Contributions Receivable (Continued)

The Administrative Committee has initiated corrective measures to address these missed contributions in accordance with applicable regulatory guidance. Accordingly, the Plan has recorded corrective contributions as other employer contributions receivable of \$178,744 and \$169,055 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, representing the estimated amount due to the Plan for the impacted years.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Organization's discretionary matching contributions, as well as allocations of plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Organization's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after four years of credited service.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the vested interest in the participant's account.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024, and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$18,380 and \$16,204, respectively. These accounts may first be used to pay plan expenses, and any remaining amount may be used to reduce employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were used to pay plan expenses or to reduce employer contributions.

NOTE 2 – Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Administrative Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from plan participants and from the Organization's matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

NOTE 2 – Summary of Accounting Policies (Continued)

Plan Loans

Plan loans are available to participants through The Variable Annuity Life Insurance Company (VALIC), subject to certain limitations. Plan loans are issued directly from the funds owned by VALIC and loan proceeds are not removed from a participant's account balance; however, a portion of a participant's account balance is reserved, or held in collateral, to cover the outstanding loan amount for the period of time the loan is outstanding. Plan loans will be repaid through periodic payments made by the participants directly to the Plan's loan administrator. Loan terms shall not exceed five years, with the exception of loans used to purchase a primary residence which may have a term of ten years. VALIC plan loans are not a part of the Plan's assets and are therefore excluded from the Plan's financial statements. (See Note 6.)

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan will distribute the 2024 and 2023 excess contributions to the applicable participants during 2025 and, as such, the Organization will pay the related excise tax of 10% on behalf of the participants.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Organization. Expenses that are paid by the Organization are excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan was restated effective June 1, 2025. Pursuant to the restatement:

- The discretionary matching contribution service requirement for employees is 1 year.
- All employees of any Employer acquired as part of a Code §410(b)(6)(C) transaction are excluded from the Plan.
- Participants may contribute up to 100% of after-tax (Roth) annual compensation, as defined in the Plan.
- Forfeited nonvested accounts may be used at the Organization's discretion.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – Certified Investments

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, VALIC, the custodian of the Plan, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplementary information is complete and accurate with respect to investments:

- Investments at fair value and contract value
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments
- Interest
- Schedule of assets held at end of year

The Plan's independent public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplementary information.

NOTE 4 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Interest in sub-accounts of variable annuity accounts (VAC): Fair values of accumulation units held by the Plan in the interest in sub-accounts of VAC are based on each account's daily NAV, which is considered by plan management to be the best approximation of fair value. The accounts are not exchange traded.

NOTE 5 – Annuity Contract with VALIC

The Plan invests in a benefit-responsive fixed-interest annuity contract with VALIC totaling \$1,092,189 and \$858,689 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. VALIC maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The annuity contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1%. The crediting rate is reviewed on an annual basis for resetting. The annuity contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by VALIC, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 6 – Policy Loans

Participants may borrow directly from funds owned by VALIC (policy loans). Policy loans are collateralized by the principal amount of the loan plus the first quarter interest due and potential surrender charges. Policy loans are held in the Loan Collateral Fund and Loan Escrow Fund and are invested in a fixed option. VALIC pays interest to the collateral accounts regardless of when (or whether) loan payments are made, at a stated rate, which is never less than the minimum guaranteed rate under the contract. With each loan payment, the participant pays interest to VALIC at the loan interest rate. The difference between the two rates (generally 3%) is the charge for administering the loans. Interest rates are determined at the end of each quarter, and the interest rate for the following quarter is based on Moody's Average Corporate Yield for the first month of the current quarter. The percentage is rounded down to the next lower 0.5%. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, outstanding policy loans totaled \$210,342 and \$127,745, respectively. The loans bear a stated guaranteed interest at rates that range from 1% to 3%. Defaulted policy loans totaled \$2,299 and \$234 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 7 – Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are managed by VALIC. VALIC is the custodian and recordkeeper for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. As described in Note 2, the Plan made a direct payment to the custodian and recordkeeper of \$17,353 during the year ended December 31, 2024, which was not covered by revenue sharing. The plan sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

NOTE 8 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 9 – Tax Status

The Organization has adopted a pre-approved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated March 31, 2017, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 10 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
