Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of The Money Accumulation Plan (the Plan) of The Boler Company (the Plan Sponsor, or the Company) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan, established on January 1, 1980, is a defined-contribution plan covering all permanent, full-time, and part-time salaried and office hourly employees of the Company who are at least 18 years of age. Employees are eligible on their date of hire. All eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan at a contribution rate of 3 percent of compensation within 60 days of eligibility unless the employee contacts The Vanguard Group, Inc. (Vanguard) (the Plan record-keeper) directly to enroll sooner or opt out of the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Investment options: Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct Company and employee contributions in 1 percent increments in any of the various investment options offered by the Plan. A participant may also choose to invest up to 50 percent of the participant's balance in a self-directed brokerage account.

Contributions: Each participant may elect to make before-tax and Roth contributions in an amount ranging from 1 percent to 50 percent of the participant's compensation for the period, as permitted under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). A participant may change, discontinue, or resume the amount of the participant's contributions on any day of the calendar year by requesting the desired change through Vanguard via phone or internet. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Catch-up contributions for those employees age 50 or older are also allowed, as defined in the plan agreement. For participants who were automatically enrolled in the Plan, their deferral percentage rate will be increased by 1 percent on April 1 each year following the year of their initial participation up to a maximum rate of 12 percent.

Annually, the Company contributes on behalf of each participant who is employed on the last day of the plan year (subject to certain exceptions) an amount equal to 1 percent of each participant's compensation, as defined in the Plan (but not to exceed, in the aggregate, its income for the year, as defined), plus a matching contribution based on the Company's overall performance as compared to its operating plan for the year, as defined, ranging from a minimum of 25 percent to a maximum of 100 percent of the before-tax contributions of each participant, up to 6 percent of each participant's compensation. Matching contributions equaled 100 percent of each participant's contributions for 2024 and 2023 each, up to 6 percent of each participant's eligible compensation, up to limitations under the Code for 2024 and 2023.

Participants are 100 percent vested in their contributions and related earnings of the Plan thereon, if any. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on years of service. A participant is not vested until completing three years of service, upon the participant's third year of service, the participant is then 100 percent vested.

The Plan requires that, upon a participant's withdrawal or termination for any reason other than retirement, death, or total and permanent disability, the portion of the participant's account consisting of Company contributions and earnings thereon that has not vested in accordance with the provisions of the Plan shall be held in suspense until the withdrawn or terminated employee has incurred a five-year break in service. Such forfeitures are applied to reduce future Company contributions required under the Plan. The Plan's forfeiture balance at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the amount used to reduce the 2024 and 2023 employer contributions was \$352,836 and \$237,749, respectively.

Note 1. Description of the Plan (Continued)

Participant accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's contributions and allocations of plan earnings (losses) and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Plan earnings (losses) are allocated based on the participant's share of net earnings or losses of their respective elected investment options. Allocations of administrative expenses are based on the participant's account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Payment of benefits: Upon termination of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution or a direct rollover into an individual retirement account or other qualified retirement plan equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account.

Notes receivable from participants: The Plan permits a participant to apply for a loan against the participant's vested interest in the Plan, subject to certain restrictions. A participant is allowed to borrow 50 percent of the participant's vested account balance. The minimum loan amount is \$1,000 and the maximum loan amount is \$50,000. A participant may not have more than one loan outstanding at any time.

Plan termination: The Company has the right to amend, modify, or terminate the Plan at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event that the Plan is terminated, all participants will be fully vested, and each participant will be entitled to the value of their account balance. The assets of the Plan will be distributed to participants or their beneficiaries in accordance with the provisions of the Plan.

Transfer in due to merger: Effective December 31, 2024, the salaried participants of the Reyco Granning 401(k) Retirement Plan (Reyco Plan) were merged into the Plan. The account balances and notes receivable from participants in the Reyco Plan attributable to the salaried participants were merged into the Plan in the amounts of \$5,936,126 and \$103,081, respectively. Effective January 1, 2025, the salaried participants formerly eligible to participate in the Reyco Plan became eligible to participate in the Plan.

Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting: The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are presented on the accrual basis of accounting.

Payment of benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Investment valuation and income recognition: Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date in the Plan's principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded as earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Administrative expenses: Certain expenses incurred in connection with the administration of the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Plan recordkeeping and trustee fees are paid by the Plan and are reflected in the financial statements as administrative expenses. Investment management fees are charged to the Plan as a reduction of investment return and included in the investment income (loss) reported by the Plan.

Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes receivable from participants: Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Subsequent events: Management evaluated subsequent events for the Plan for potential recognition and/or disclosure through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below.

Level 1. Inputs to the valuation methodology are the unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets and liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2. Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active.
- Observable inputs other than quoted prices that are used in the valuation of the assets or liabilities (e.g., interest rate and yield curve quotes at commonly quoted intervals).
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3. Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Note 3. Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

Mutual funds: The fair values of mutual funds are based upon the closing net asset value (NAV) per share of the mutual fund on the day of the valuation as reflected on a national securities exchange (Level 1 inputs).

Self-directed brokerage accounts: Account primarily consists of mutual funds, common stock, and exchange traded funds the fair values of which are determined by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchange (Level 1 inputs).

Collective trust funds: Valued at the NAV per unit held by the Plan at year end as reported by the fund manager (Level 2 inputs). The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the funds less its liabilities. Redemptions are permitted by participants on any business day and by the Company within 12 months' written notice. There are no unfunded commitments or liquidity restrictions related to the collective trust funds as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Pooled separate accounts: The Plan holds an investment in John Hancock Life Insurance Company (USA) Separate Account B (Separate Account B), which is comprised of various sub-accounts to which the Plan directs its contributions, each of which is a pooled separate account of John Hancock Life Insurance Company (USA). The fair values of the participation units held in the sub-accounts of Separate Account B are based on the net asset values reported by the managers of the pooled separate accounts and are supported by the unit prices of actual purchase and sale transactions occurring as of or close to the financial statement date (Level 2 inputs). Each of the sub-accounts of Separate Account B invests in a single open-ended mutual fund as identified in the name of the sub-account. The investment strategies of these sub-accounts are consistent with each of the mutual funds identified in the name of the fund. The pooled separate accounts which are held by the Plan, as sub-accounts of Separate Account B, provide for daily redemptions by Plan participants, with no advance notice requirements and have redemption prices that are determined by their net asset values per unit.

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income of notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024 and by John Hancock Life Insurance Company as of December 31, 2024, the custodian.

Note 5. Income Tax Status

The underlying non-standardized prototype plan adopted by the Plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stating that the form of the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Code, and therefore the related trust is tax-exempt. Although the Plan has been amended from the original prototype document, plan management believes that the Plan is currently being operated in accordance with the Code.

United States generally accepted accounting principles require plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

Note 6. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, liquidity and credit risks and global events. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 8. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Parties-in-interest are defined under the Department of Labor regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. The Plan holds units of collective trust funds and mutual funds issued by Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, and The Vanguard Group, respectively. The Plan also pays The Vanguard Group and the trustee administrative fees. In addition, certain investments held within the brokerage account are issued by The Vanguard Group. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions; however, they are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules under ERISA. The Plan holds units of pooled separate accounts managed by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (USA) (John Hancock) through an unallocated group annuity contract. John Hancock is a service provider to the Plan and, therefore, these transactions and the Plan's payment of fees to John Hancock qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Certain employees of the Company provide administrative services to the Plan. These employees are not paid by the Plan for their services.

Notes receivable from participants also qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

Note 9. Transfers from Tax-deferred Retirement Investment Plan of The Boler Company

During 2024, certain assets related to participant transfers between the Plan and the Tax-deferred Retirement Investment Plan of The Boler Company were transferred into or out of the Plan due to participant job transfers. The Boler Company is the Plan Sponsor of The Money Accumulation Plan of The Boler Company and The Tax-deferred Retirement Investment Plan of The Boler Company.
