We have performed an audit of the financial statements of RSA Security 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). ## **Note 1. Description of Plan**

### ***General***

The following description of RSA Security 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan adoption agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

The Plan was established effective January 1, 2022 as a result of a spin-off of two participating employers from Dell, Inc. 401(k) Plan. The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan initially covering all eligible employees of RSA Security LLC (“Plan Sponsor”) and RSA Federal LLC, as well as, starting June 15, 2023, four more related employers: Archer Technologies LLC, NetWitness LLC, Outseer LLC, and SecurID LLC (collectively, the “Participating Employers”). Effective January 1, 2024, Archer Technologies LLC has been separated from the Plan because of its acquisition by another company. Eligible employees are defined as all full-time employees except residents of Puerto Rico, individuals covered by a collective bargaining agreement (unless the agreement provides for Plan participation), leased employees, or nonresident aliens with no income from a U.S. source. There are no age or service eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Plan is intended to qualify as a participant-directed plan under Section 404(c) of ERISA.

### ***Contributions***

Each participant may elect to contribute, on a taxable Roth, or a tax-deferred basis, a percentage of their eligible compensation, as defined, each payroll period. The Plan has employer contributions that are discretionary matching contributions. Employee rollover contributions are also permitted. The Participating Employers match up to a maximum of the lesser of 6% of the participant’s eligible compensation or \$7,500. The limit for employee contributions was \$23,000 for 2024, plus additional \$7,500 “catch-up” contributions for participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

### ***Participant Accounts***

Under the Plan, a separate account is maintained for each participant. Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s and employer contributions and an allocation of Plan investment earnings (losses) and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s account.

### ***Vesting***

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary employee contributions, employer contributions, and earnings thereon.

### ***Participant Investment Account Options***

All investments are participant directed. Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct their account balances among any of the Plan’s investment options offered by the Plan, including registered investment companies, money market funds, and common collective trust funds.

### ***Plan Trustee***

Plan assets were held in the custody of Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity”) (the “Plan Trustee”) at December 31, 2024 and 2023 (see Note 4).

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***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance during the prior 12-month period or 50% of their account balance. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer between the investment fund(s) and the participant loan funds. Loan terms range from 1-5 years, except the loan term can be up to 10 years if it is for the purchase of a principal residence. A participant may have no more than two loans outstanding during the Plan year. Principal and interest are repaid through payroll deduction.

***Payment of Benefits***

Upon termination of employment, disability, retirement at age 65, or attainment of age 59 ½, a participant may elect a lump sum distribution of his/her vested account. Upon death, the participant's beneficiary may also make a withdrawal in lump-sum or installment method. There were no unpaid amounts allocated to participants who elected to withdraw from the Plan but were not paid as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The following is a summary of significant accounting policies followed in the preparation of these financial statements, which have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

***Basis of Accounting***

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP and with the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosures under ERISA requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan's funds were invested in money market funds, registered investment companies, and common collective trust funds. The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Registered investment companies and money market funds are valued at the reported net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan at year end. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned less any fund liabilities. For common collective trust funds, the fair value is measured using the NAV per share as a practical expedient. In accordance with the Plan's policy of stating marketable securities at fair value, the appreciation or depreciation for each year is reflected in the Plan's statement of changes in net assets available for benefits as net change in fair value of investments.

Purchases and sales of marketable securities are reflected on a trade-date basis, and interest income is recorded as earned on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net change in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

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The Plan uses NAV per unit to value the common collective trust funds (see Note 3). The NAV, as provided by the Plan Trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the funds, less its liabilities, divided by the number of units outstanding. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the funds will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

***Contributions***

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which participant compensation is earned.

***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan Document.

***Payment of Benefits***

Benefits payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

***Administrative Expenses***

Administrative expenses of the Plan, including compensation for the Plan Trustee, consultants, and legal counsel, may be paid by the Plan Sponsor or the Plan, at the Plan Sponsor's discretion. Commissions and other investment-related expenses are netted against the net change in fair value of investments.

**Note 3. Disclosures About Fair Value of Plan Assets and Liabilities**

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy comprises three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1** Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2** Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

**Note 5. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity. Fidelity is the trustee and the recordkeeper, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, those transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to Fidelity for recordkeeping services approximated \$119,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

## **Note 6. Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right, under the Plan, to discontinue all contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

## **Note 7. Income Tax Status**

The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is a qualified trust under Section 401(a) of the IRC and is, therefore, exempt from federal income taxes, provided that all terms of the Plan continue to be followed and the eligibility requirements or benefit provisions are not more favorable for officers or highly compensated employees. The Plan adopted a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA sponsored by FMR, LLC (the "Prototype Plan"). The Prototype Plan received a favorable opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated the Prototype Plan as then designed, qualified under Section 401 of the IRC. The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel also believe that the Plan is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the *Internal Revenue Service*. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

## **Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The Plan's investments are not insured and are subject to credit and market risks. Financial information relating to those investments is included in these financial statements based on information provided by the Plan Trustee.

## **Note 9. Subsequent Events**

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 21, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

## **Note 1. Description of Plan**

### ***General***

The following description of RSA Security 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan adoption agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

The Plan was established effective January 1, 2022 as a result of a spin-off of two participating employers from Dell, Inc. 401(k) Plan. The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan initially covering all eligible employees of RSA Security LLC (“Plan Sponsor”) and RSA Federal LLC, as well as, starting June 15, 2023, four more related employers: Archer Technologies LLC, NetWitness LLC, Outseer LLC, and SecurID LLC (collectively, the “Participating Employers”). Effective January 1, 2024, Archer Technologies LLC has been separated from the Plan because of its acquisition by another company. Eligible employees are defined as all full-time employees except residents of Puerto Rico, individuals covered by a collective bargaining agreement (unless the agreement provides for Plan participation), leased employees, or nonresident aliens with no income from a U.S. source. There are no age or service eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Plan is intended to qualify as a participant-directed plan under Section 404(c) of ERISA.

### ***Contributions***

Each participant may elect to contribute, on a taxable Roth, or a tax-deferred basis, a percentage of their eligible compensation, as defined, each payroll period. The Plan has employer contributions that are discretionary matching contributions. Employee rollover contributions are also permitted. The Participating Employers match up to a maximum of the lesser of 6% of the participant’s eligible compensation or \$7,500. The limit for employee contributions was \$23,000 for 2024, plus additional \$7,500 “catch-up” contributions for participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

### ***Participant Accounts***

Under the Plan, a separate account is maintained for each participant. Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s and employer contributions and an allocation of Plan investment earnings (losses) and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s account.

### ***Vesting***

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary employee contributions, employer contributions, and earnings thereon.

### ***Participant Investment Account Options***

All investments are participant directed. Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct their account balances among any of the Plan’s investment options offered by the Plan, including registered investment companies, money market funds, and common collective trust funds.

### ***Plan Trustee***

Plan assets were held in the custody of Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity”) (the “Plan Trustee”) at December 31, 2024 and 2023 (see Note 4).

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***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance during the prior 12-month period or 50% of their account balance. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer between the investment fund(s) and the participant loan funds. Loan terms range from 1-5 years, except the loan term can be up to 10 years if it is for the purchase of a principal residence. A participant may have no more than two loans outstanding during the Plan year. Principal and interest are repaid through payroll deduction.

***Payment of Benefits***

Upon termination of employment, disability, retirement at age 65, or attainment of age 59 ½, a participant may elect a lump sum distribution of his/her vested account. Upon death, the participant's beneficiary may also make a withdrawal in lump-sum or installment method. There were no unpaid amounts allocated to participants who elected to withdraw from the Plan but were not paid as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The following is a summary of significant accounting policies followed in the preparation of these financial statements, which have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

***Basis of Accounting***

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP and with the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosures under ERISA requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan's funds were invested in money market funds, registered investment companies, and common collective trust funds. The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Registered investment companies and money market funds are valued at the reported net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan at year end. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned less any fund liabilities. For common collective trust funds, the fair value is measured using the NAV per share as a practical expedient. In accordance with the Plan's policy of stating marketable securities at fair value, the appreciation or depreciation for each year is reflected in the Plan's statement of changes in net assets available for benefits as net change in fair value of investments.

Purchases and sales of marketable securities are reflected on a trade-date basis, and interest income is recorded as earned on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net change in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

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The Plan uses NAV per unit to value the common collective trust funds (see Note 3). The NAV, as provided by the Plan Trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the funds, less its liabilities, divided by the number of units outstanding. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the funds will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

***Contributions***

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which participant compensation is earned.

***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan Document.

***Payment of Benefits***

Benefits payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

***Administrative Expenses***

Administrative expenses of the Plan, including compensation for the Plan Trustee, consultants, and legal counsel, may be paid by the Plan Sponsor or the Plan, at the Plan Sponsor's discretion. Commissions and other investment-related expenses are netted against the net change in fair value of investments.

**Note 3. Disclosures About Fair Value of Plan Assets and Liabilities**

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy comprises three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1** Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2** Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

**Note 4. Certification of Plan Trustee**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the Plan Trustee, a qualified institution, has certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment income and interest income from notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investment information and notes receivable from participants included in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

**Note 5. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity. Fidelity is the trustee and the recordkeeper, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, those transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to Fidelity for recordkeeping services approximated \$119,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

## **Note 6. Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right, under the Plan, to discontinue all contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

## **Note 7. Income Tax Status**

The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is a qualified trust under Section 401(a) of the IRC and is, therefore, exempt from federal income taxes, provided that all terms of the Plan continue to be followed and the eligibility requirements or benefit provisions are not more favorable for officers or highly compensated employees. The Plan adopted a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA sponsored by FMR, LLC (the "Prototype Plan"). The Prototype Plan received a favorable opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated the Prototype Plan as then designed, qualified under Section 401 of the IRC. The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel also believe that the Plan is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the *Internal Revenue Service*. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

## **Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The Plan's investments are not insured and are subject to credit and market risks. Financial information relating to those investments is included in these financial statements based on information provided by the Plan Trustee.

## **Note 9. Subsequent Events**

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 21, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
