We have audited the financial statements of the Blue Apron Holdings, Inc. 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), for the year ended December 31, 2024, and we will issue our report thereon dated October 15, 2025. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by Principal Trust Company, the Custodian, which is a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, that prepared and certified the statements or information regarding assets so held in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5. Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP. Professional standards require that we provide you with information about our responsibilities under generally accepted auditing standards, as well as certain information related to the planned scope and timing of our audit. We have communicated such information in our letter to you dated July 9, 2025. Professional standards also require that we communicate to you the following information related to our audit.

#### Significant Audit Matters

##### *Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices*

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. The significant accounting policies used by the Plan are described in Note 2 to the financial statements. No new accounting policies were adopted and the application of existing policies was not changed during 2024. We noted no transactions entered into by the Plan during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. All significant transactions have been recognized in the financial statements in the proper period.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements prepared by management and are based on management's knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected. The most sensitive estimate affecting the financial statements was:

Management's estimate of the fair value investment is based on hierarchy of fair value inputs as set forth in ASC 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures. We evaluated the methods, assumptions, and data used to develop the fair value investments in determining that it is reasonable in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.



Certain financial statement disclosures are particularly sensitive because of their significance to financial statement users. The most sensitive disclosure affecting the financial statements was:

The disclosure of the corporate restructuring that resulted in the spin-off of certain business operations to FreshRealm, Inc. in Note 1 to the financial statements. As a result of the spin-off certain Plan participants' balances were transferred to a separate qualified retirement plan.

The disclosure of fair value measurement in Note 4 to the financial statements identifies the fair value of the Plan's investments which are based on a hierarchy of fair value inputs as set forth in ASC 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures.

The disclosure of subsequent events in Note 10 to the financial statements notes that the Plan was frozen to new participants on February 1, 2025.

The financial statement disclosures are neutral, consistent, and clear.

#### *Form 5500 Procedures*

We are required to obtain and read a substantially complete draft of Form 5500 prior to dating our auditor's report. The purpose of this procedure is to identify any material inconsistencies between the draft Form 5500 and the Plan's financial statements. We identified no material inconsistencies in performing and completing our audit.

#### *Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit*

We encountered no significant difficulties in dealing with management in performing and completing our audit.

#### *Corrected and Uncorrected Misstatements*

Professional standards require us to accumulate all misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that are clearly trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management. Management has corrected all such misstatements. In addition, none of the misstatements detected as a result of audit procedures and corrected by management were material, either individually or in the aggregate, to the financial statements taken as a whole.

#### *Disagreements with Management*

For purposes of this letter, a disagreement with management is a disagreement on a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, that could be significant to the financial statements or the auditor's report. We are pleased to report that no such disagreements arose during the course of our audit.

#### *Management Representations*

We have requested certain representations from management that are included in the management representation letter dated October 15, 2025.

#### *Management Consultations with Other Independent Accountants*

In some cases, management may decide to consult with other accountants about auditing and accounting matters, similar to obtaining a "second opinion" on certain situations. If a consultation involves application of an accounting principle to the Plan's financial statements or a determination of the type of auditor's opinion that may be expressed on those statements, our professional standards require the consulting accountant to check with us to determine that the consultant has all the relevant facts. To our knowledge, there were no such consultations with other accountants.

#### *Other Audit Findings or Issues*

We generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards, with management each year prior to retention as the Plan's auditors. However, these discussions occurred in the normal course of our professional relationship and our responses were not a condition to our retention.



*Other Matters*

Our responsibility for the ERISA-required supplemental schedule accompanying the financial statements is to perform adequate procedures to evaluate whether the form and content of the ERISA-required supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, is presented in compliance with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, and whether the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

This information is intended solely for the use of the Plan Administrator and management of the Plan and is not intended to be, and should not be, used by anyone other than these specified parties.

## Notes to Financial Statements

### 1. Description of the Plan

#### General

The following description of the Blue Apron Holdings, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan, adopted April 1, 2016, is a defined contribution plan available to all eligible employees of Blue Apron Holdings, Inc. (the Company). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Effective January 1, 2022 the eligibility requirement was amended to be one year of service in which a minimum of 1,000 hours are worked in addition to a 21 year age requirement. In addition, effective February 1, 2023, the Company amended the Plan Document to allow the entry date into the Plan for new participants to be on a monthly basis after which participants become eligible for the Plan, as opposed to a semi-annual basis.

Effective June 7, 2023, Blue Apron Holdings Inc. completed a corporate restructuring that resulted in the spin-off of certain business operations to FreshRealm, Inc. (FreshRealm). Certain former Blue Apron participants remained in the Plan through December 31, 2023. As part of this transaction, effective February 7, 2024, FreshRealm participants previously covered under the Blue Apron Holdings, Inc. 401(k) Plan were transferred to a newly established defined contribution plan sponsored by FreshRealm.

On February 7, 2024, the Plan transferred assets totaling \$4,769,929 to the new plan. These transfers represented the full account balances of participants who were no longer eligible to participate in the Plan following the spin-off.

The transfer was executed in-kind and included mutual fund holdings held in participant accounts. The Plan Administrator has determined that all affected participants were fully vested in their account balances at the time of transfer.

Effective November 13, 2023, the Company was acquired by Wonder Group, Inc., and is now a wholly owned subsidiary of Wonder Group, Inc.

# Blue Apron Holdings, Inc. 401(k) Plan

## Notes to Financial Statements

### 1. Description of the Plan (continued)

#### Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants may also contribute amounts representing after-tax compensation (Roth deferral contributions), as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified (and certain nonqualified) defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain dollar limitations as set forth by the Internal Revenue Code. Such limit on participant contributions was \$23,000 and \$22,500 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, with the exception of certain allowable catch-up contributions for participants over the age of 50. The maximum amount a participant may contribute as a catch-up contribution for 2024 and 2023 was \$7,500, respectively. Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan was amended to include the offer of employer matching contributions to Plan participants. The Plan sponsor offered 100% of elective deferral contributions that are not over 3% of compensation, plus 50% of elective deferral contributions which are over 3% but are not over 5% of compensation. Effective February 1, 2023, the Company amended the Plan Document allowing participants to contribute up to 90% of their pretax annual compensation as opposed to 100% as previously offered. Employer matching contributions amounted to \$419,229 and \$1,125,477 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

#### Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of Plan earnings and charged with withdrawals and an allocation of Plan losses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, plus earnings thereon, and in employer matching contributions. As such, there are no forfeited accounts for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

### Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

#### **1. Description of the Plan (continued)**

##### **Payment of Benefits**

On termination of service due to death, retirement, or other reasons as defined in the Plan Document, a participant may receive a lump-sum distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Normal retirement date is defined as the first day of the month on or after the date a participant reached the age of 65. Participants who have reached the age of 59 1/2 may, upon written request, make withdrawals from the vested portion of their account balance. Any such withdrawn amounts may not be repaid to the Plan. Distributions must be initiated when a participant reaches the age of 73 unless distributions have already begun. In the event a participant's vested account balance is less than \$5,000, the Plan may automatically distribute the balance to the participant without their consent.

Withdrawals from a participant's vested balance may also be made in the event of a financial hardship, in accordance with the provisions specified in the Plan.

#### **2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

##### **Basis of Accounting**

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

##### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

##### **Investments Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year, which is presented in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

#### **2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)**

##### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid. No participants have elected to withdraw from the Plan but have not yet been paid for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

##### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

On March 1, 2023, the Company amended the Plan Document and offered loans to the Plan participants under the following terms: participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance during the one year period ending on the day before the loan is made. Loan terms range from 1 to 5 years. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates. The notes currently bear an interest rate of 9% with a maturity date of November 2025. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

##### **Administrative Expenses**

Administrative expenses incurred in connection with investment transactions and payments of benefits to participants are paid by the Plan. In addition, professional fees for services related to the Plan are paid by the Company. Fees for participant driven transactions are charged to the individual participant accounts to which such fees were related and constitute a related party transaction.

#### **3. Information Prepared and Certified by Custodian**

The Plan's investments are held and administered by the Custodian, Principal Trust Company, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. All investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, interest income, dividends and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained and certified as complete and accurate by Principal Trust Company.

#### 4. Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of financial instruments maintained by the Plan is determined based on assumptions that market participants would use when pricing an asset or liability at the balance sheet date. Certain assets are categorized based on the following fair value hierarchy of market participant assumptions:

- Level 1 – Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2 – Inputs, other than quoted prices in active markets, that are observable either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3 – Prices or valuation techniques that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value of the asset or liability and supported by little or no market activity.

The Company uses observable market data when available and minimizes the use of unobservable inputs when determining fair value.

Although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Mutual funds are valued at the value of such shares as of the close of business at the end of the period based on quoted active market prices of the underlying investments, and as such, are classified as Level 1 investments.

#### 5. Exempt Party-in-Interest and Related Party Transactions

Section 3(14) of ERISA defines party-in-interest transactions to include, among others, fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan or an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan. Accordingly, loans to participants, interest income from participant loans, administrative expenses paid by the Company and transactions with investment funds managed and held by the Trustee are considered party-in-interest transactions.

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds which are held and managed by Principal Trust Company, the Custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

#### 6. Plan Termination

The Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth by ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants are 100% vested in their accounts.

Plan management has made a decision to terminate the Plan in 2025 and roll the remaining balances to another qualified retirement plan.

#### 7. Federal Income Tax Status

The prototype Plan document, which the Plan has adopted via a non-standardized adoption agreement, obtained its latest opinion letter in 2020 in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the prototype Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the IRC). The Plan's tax counsel believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

#### 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan holds various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

#### 9. Reconciliation of Plan Financial Statements to Form 5500

The Annual Return/Report of Employee Benefit Plan (Form 5500) is prepared on the modified cash basis. Accordingly, certain balances included on Schedule H (Part I and II) of Form 5500 differ from those included in the financial statements.
