Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

### Note 1 – Description of the Plan

The following description of the Oasis Pediatric Therapy 401(k) (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants and all others should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General.** The Plan is a defined contribution plan, which went into effect January 1, 2024 ("Plan Inception"), that is generally available to all employees of Oasis Corporation (the "Company," "Employer," "Plan Sponsor," or "Plan Administrator") who are age 18 or older and who have completed one year of service. Eligible employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the Plan year or the seventh month of the Plan year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA"). Benefits under the Plan are not guaranteed by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation.

**Plan Amendment.** Effective October 15, 2024 the Plan document was amended and restated to modify the Plan's eligibility from immediate to one year of service and the Plan's entry date from immediate to the first day of the Plan Year or the seventh month of the Plan Year after age and service requirements have been met.

**Contributions.** The following types of contributions are allowable under the Plan:

- Salary Deferral Contributions – Participants may contribute a percentage of their pre-tax compensation, as defined in the Plan document, subject to limitations. Additionally, participants may contribute a percentage of their after-tax compensation and designate it as a Roth deferral contribution. The Plan has an automatic contribution arrangement ("EACA") such that eligible participants, unless they elect otherwise, will be automatically enrolled at a 3% pretax salary deferral contribution percentage rate. Such automatic deferral increases by 1% per year on the first day of each Plan Year. A participant's total salary deferral contribution cannot exceed \$23,000 (\$30,500 if age 50 or older) in 2024.
- Employer Safe Harbor Matching Contributions – The Employer makes a basic safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of a participant's deferral contributions that do not exceed 3% of compensation contributed to the Plan plus 50% of deferral contributions between 3% and 5% of compensation contributed to the Plan. For purposes of calculating the basic safe harbor matching contribution, compensation and deferrals are determined on an annual basis.
- Discretionary Employer Profit Sharing Contributions – The Employer may make a discretionary profit sharing contribution to participants' accounts that are employed on the last day of the Plan Year and have completed a year of service during the Plan Year. The aforementioned service requirements does not apply to Participants in the year of their death, disability or retirement. For the year period December 31, 2024, the Employer did not make a discretionary Employer profit sharing contribution.
- Rollover Contributions – Amounts distributed to participants from other qualified employee benefit plans may be rolled into the Plan.

All contributions are allocated to the Plan's investment funds at the direction of the participants.

The total annual additions to a participant's account may not exceed the lesser of \$69,000 in calendar year 2024, or 100% of the participant's compensation, as defined.

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### Note 1 – Description of the Plan (continued)

**Participant Accounts.** Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions (salary deferral and rollovers, if any) and an allocation of (a) the Employer's contributions (safe harbor and/or discretionary profit sharing), (b) fund earnings or losses, and (c) administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

**Investments.** Participants have the option to direct their investments into various registered investment companies.

**Vesting.** Participants are immediately 100% vested in their elective deferral, rollover contributions, and Employer safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in discretionary Employer profit sharing contributions is based on a six year vesting schedule, whereas a participant becomes 20% vested after two years of service, and becomes 20% vested for each additional year of service thereafter, until becoming 100% vested after six years of service. Participants, while employed, also become 100% vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death, becoming disabled, or upon Plan termination or partial Plan termination.

**Unallocated Suspense Accounts.** The Plan maintains unallocated suspense accounts. As of December 31, 2024, the balance in the unallocated suspense accounts was \$586.

**Notes Receivable from Participants.** Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000. The maximum loan is the lesser of (i) \$50,000 minus the highest loan balance in the previous 12-month period, or (ii) 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range up to a maximum of five years (a longer term is available if used for the purchase of a principal residence). The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear a rate of interest equal to the Prime Rate plus 1% at the date the loan is granted. Principal and interest payments are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

**Payment of Benefits.** Benefits to participants or beneficiaries generally are payable as a lump sum equal to the value of their vested account balance upon retirement, disability, death or termination of the participant. Participants may also elect to rollover their account balance into another qualified retirement plan or Individual Retirement Account. Additionally, the Plan provides for in-service distributions of a participant's rollover contributions account, upon attainment of age 59½ and in the event of a financial hardship, as defined in the Plan document, if certain criteria are met.

### Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

**Basis of Accounting.** The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

**Use of Estimates.** The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan's management to use estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition.** The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Company determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and trustee. See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest is recorded when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Contributions.** Participant contributions and the related Employer matching contributions are recognized in the period in which participant contributions are withheld from compensation.

**Administrative Expenses.** Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan also include fees paid for recordkeeping, investment management, and other fees. Certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

**Benefit Payments.** Benefits are recorded when paid.

### Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

**Level 1** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2** Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

### Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements (continued)

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair

- Registered investment companies ("RICs") are valued at the quoted net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan at year end.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

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### Note 5 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination or partial termination, affected participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

### Note 6 – Tax Status

The Plan sponsor has adopted an Ascensus LLC Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan (“pre-approved plan”). The pre-approved plan received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) on June 30, 2020 which stated that the pre-approved plan is qualified under the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Although the pre-approved plan and the Plan have been amended since receiving the IRS opinion letter, the Plan sponsor believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan sponsor believes that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC and the related Trust is tax exempt as of December 31, 2024. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

### Note 7 – Party-In-Interest Transactions

The Company provides to the Plan certain accounting and administrative services for which no fees are charged.

The Plan's trustee, Ascensus Trust Company, the Plan's recordkeeper Vanguard; the Plan's investment advisor; the Plan's auditors; the Employer; and Plan participants are all parties-in-interest to the Plan. Fees paid for services rendered by parties-in-interest were based on customary and reasonable rates for such services.

### Note 8 – Concentrations, Risks, and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as significant world events, interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits. As of December 31, 2024, there were four investments which individually represented more than 10% of net assets available for Plan benefits. See supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) for a complete listing of investments held at December 31, 2024.

Additionally, some investments held by the Plan are invested in the securities of foreign companies, which involve special risks and considerations not typically associated with investing in U.S. companies. These risks include devaluation of currencies, less reliable information about issuers, different securities transaction clearance and settlement practices, and possible adverse political and economic developments. Moreover, securities of many foreign companies and their markets may be less liquid and their prices more volatile than those of securities of comparable U.S. companies.

### Note 9 – Nonexempt Prohibited Transactions

During 2024 the Company had nonexempt prohibited transactions related to participant contributions not remitted to the trust in a timely manner as listed in the aggregate on Schedule H, Line 4a: Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions. The Company intends to correct these transactions by remitting any remaining principal amounts and lost earnings into the Plan's trust as soon as administratively feasible

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### Note 1 – Description of the Plan

The following description of the Oasis Pediatric Therapy 401(k) (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants and all others should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General.** The Plan is a defined contribution plan, which went into effect January 1, 2024 ("Plan Inception"), that is generally available to all employees of Oasis Corporation (the "Company," "Employer," "Plan Sponsor," or "Plan Administrator") who are age 18 or older and who have completed one year of service. Eligible employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the Plan year or the seventh month of the Plan year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA"). Benefits under the Plan are not guaranteed by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation.

**Plan Amendment.** Effective October 15, 2024 the Plan document was amended and restated to modify the Plan's eligibility from immediate to one year of service and the Plan's entry date from immediate to the first day of the Plan Year or the seventh month of the Plan Year after age and service requirements have been met.

**Contributions.** The following types of contributions are allowable under the Plan:

- Salary Deferral Contributions – Participants may contribute a percentage of their pre-tax compensation, as defined in the Plan document, subject to limitations. Additionally, participants may contribute a percentage of their after-tax compensation and designate it as a Roth deferral contribution. The Plan has an automatic contribution arrangement ("EACA") such that eligible participants, unless they elect otherwise, will be automatically enrolled at a 3% pretax salary deferral contribution percentage rate. Such automatic deferral increases by 1% per year on the first day of each Plan Year. A participant's total salary deferral contribution cannot exceed \$23,000 (\$30,500 if age 50 or older) in 2024.
- Employer Safe Harbor Matching Contributions – The Employer makes a basic safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of a participant's deferral contributions that do not exceed 3% of compensation contributed to the Plan plus 50% of deferral contributions between 3% and 5% of compensation contributed to the Plan. For purposes of calculating the basic safe harbor matching contribution, compensation and deferrals are determined on an annual basis.
- Discretionary Employer Profit Sharing Contributions – The Employer may make a discretionary profit sharing contribution to participants' accounts that are employed on the last day of the Plan Year and have completed a year of service during the Plan Year. The aforementioned service requirements does not apply to Participants in the year of their death, disability or retirement. For the year period December 31, 2024, the Employer did not make a discretionary Employer profit sharing contribution.
- Rollover Contributions – Amounts distributed to participants from other qualified employee benefit plans may be rolled into the Plan.

All contributions are allocated to the Plan's investment funds at the direction of the participants.

The total annual additions to a participant's account may not exceed the lesser of \$69,000 in calendar year 2024, or 100% of the participant's compensation, as defined.

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### Note 1 – Description of the Plan (continued)

**Participant Accounts.** Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions (salary deferral and rollovers, if any) and an allocation of (a) the Employer's contributions (safe harbor and/or discretionary profit sharing), (b) fund earnings or losses, and (c) administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

**Investments.** Participants have the option to direct their investments into various registered investment companies.

**Vesting.** Participants are immediately 100% vested in their elective deferral, rollover contributions, and Employer safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in discretionary Employer profit sharing contributions is based on a six year vesting schedule, whereas a participant becomes 20% vested after two years of service, and becomes 20% vested for each additional year of service thereafter, until becoming 100% vested after six years of service. Participants, while employed, also become 100% vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death, becoming disabled, or upon Plan termination or partial Plan termination.

**Unallocated Suspense Accounts.** The Plan maintains unallocated suspense accounts. As of December 31, 2024, the balance in the unallocated suspense accounts was \$586.

**Notes Receivable from Participants.** Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000. The maximum loan is the lesser of (i) \$50,000 minus the highest loan balance in the previous 12-month period, or (ii) 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range up to a maximum of five years (a longer term is available if used for the purchase of a principal residence). The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear a rate of interest equal to the Prime Rate plus 1% at the date the loan is granted. Principal and interest payments are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

**Payment of Benefits.** Benefits to participants or beneficiaries generally are payable as a lump sum equal to the value of their vested account balance upon retirement, disability, death or termination of the participant. Participants may also elect to rollover their account balance into another qualified retirement plan or Individual Retirement Account. Additionally, the Plan provides for in-service distributions of a participant's rollover contributions account, upon attainment of age 59½ and in the event of a financial hardship, as defined in the Plan document, if certain criteria are met.

### Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

**Basis of Accounting.** The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

**Use of Estimates.** The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan's management to use estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

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### Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition.** The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Company determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and trustee. See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest is recorded when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Contributions.** Participant contributions and the related Employer matching contributions are recognized in the period in which participant contributions are withheld from compensation.

**Administrative Expenses.** Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan also include fees paid for recordkeeping, investment management, and other fees. Certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

**Benefit Payments.** Benefits are recorded when paid.

### Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

**Level 1** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2** Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

### Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements (continued)

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair

- Registered investment companies ("RICs") are valued at the quoted net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan at year end.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

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### Note 5 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination or partial termination, affected participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

### Note 6 – Tax Status

The Plan sponsor has adopted an Ascensus LLC Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan (“pre-approved plan”). The pre-approved plan received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) on June 30, 2020 which stated that the pre-approved plan is qualified under the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Although the pre-approved plan and the Plan have been amended since receiving the IRS opinion letter, the Plan sponsor believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan sponsor believes that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC and the related Trust is tax exempt as of December 31, 2024. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

### Note 7 – Party-In-Interest Transactions

The Company provides to the Plan certain accounting and administrative services for which no fees are charged.

The Plan's trustee, Ascensus Trust Company, the Plan's recordkeeper Vanguard; the Plan's investment advisor; the Plan's auditors; the Employer; and Plan participants are all parties-in-interest to the Plan. Fees paid for services rendered by parties-in-interest were based on customary and reasonable rates for such services.

### Note 8 – Concentrations, Risks, and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as significant world events, interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits. As of December 31, 2024, there were four investments which individually represented more than 10% of net assets available for Plan benefits. See supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) for a complete listing of investments held at December 31, 2024.

Additionally, some investments held by the Plan are invested in the securities of foreign companies, which involve special risks and considerations not typically associated with investing in U.S. companies. These risks include devaluation of currencies, less reliable information about issuers, different securities transaction clearance and settlement practices, and possible adverse political and economic developments. Moreover, securities of many foreign companies and their markets may be less liquid and their prices more volatile than those of securities of comparable U.S. companies.

### Note 9 – Nonexempt Prohibited Transactions

During 2024 the Company had nonexempt prohibited transactions related to participant contributions not remitted to the trust in a timely manner as listed in the aggregate on Schedule H, Line 4a: Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions. The Company intends to correct these transactions by remitting any remaining principal amounts and lost earnings into the Plan's trust as soon as administratively feasible
