Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency (qualified institution), provided that the investment information is prepared and certified to by the qualified institution in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### *Opinion*

In our opinion, based on our audits and the procedures performed as described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP); and
- The certified investment information in the accompanying financial statements agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by a qualified institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).



### ***Basis for Opinion***

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

### ***Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements***

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments. Management is also responsible for administering the Plan and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### ***Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements***

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.



In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

***Other Matter – Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA***

The supplemental Schedule H (Form 5500), Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For



information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The certified investment information in the supplemental schedule agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by a qualified institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

## Notes to Financial Statements

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### 1. Description of the Plan

The following brief description of the ZBI Multiple Employer 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan), amended and restated as of January 1, 2020, is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for definitions and a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### *General Information*

The Plan is a participant-directed, defined contribution plan established to provide retirement benefits to eligible employees, as defined, of Ziff Brothers Investments, L.L.C. (the Plan Sponsor, Plan Manager, Employer, or Plan Administrator) and other adopting companies (each, an Adopting Company and collectively the Adopting Companies, or Employers). The Plan offers a selection of registered investment companies and one stable value fund as investment options for participants. The Plan allows for any business entity, with the approval of the Plan Manager, to adopt the Plan and thereby become an Adopting Company. Notwithstanding the adoption of the Plan by other entities, the Plan is administered as a single plan and all Plan assets are available to pay benefits to all participants under the Plan, unless otherwise required by applicable law governing multiple employer plans. Each Adopting Company has the right as of the last day of any month to withdraw from the Plan by delivering to the Plan Manager, Administrative Committee, and the trustee, each as defined in the Plan document, written notification of such action. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

The Vanguard Group, Inc. is the recordkeeper of the Plan and Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company (Vanguard) is the trustee (the Trustee). Vanguard holds the Plan's investment assets, executes investment transactions pursuant to discretionary authority granted by the Plan Administrator concerning purchases and sales of investments in the funds, and collects the related investment income.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the following companies were Adopting Companies and, as such, all information and financial data included in these financial statements, supplemental schedule and notes thereto relate to the Plan assets of all these companies: Amelia Family Trust Company (AFTC); AMP Residential Services, L.L.C. (AMP); Banyan Road, LLC (Banyan); Crimson NYC Realty, LLC (Crimson); Long Light Capital, L.L.C. (Long Light); Mahogany Energy Resources, L.L.C.; Maroon Peak Management, LLC; MITA Residential Property Services, L.L.C. (MITA); Morton Holdings, Inc. (Morton); PPA Property Services 1, L.L.C. (PPAPS1); SB Union Square, LLC (SBUS); Tamsen Z, L.L.C. (TAMZ); ZBI Europe, L.L.C. (ZBIEUR); Ziff Brothers Investments, L.L.C. (ZBI); Ziff Capital Partners, L.L.C. (ZCP); and Ziff Legal Group LLP (ZLG). Prior to January 1, 2019, the Adopting Companies were separated into two groups referred to as Plan A and Plan B. The Plan had different characteristics for Plan A and Plan B employees. Effective January 1, 2019, there is no distinction between the employees of the Adopting Companies.

#### *Eligibility*

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first business day coincident with or following their hire date. Effective October 1, 2011, an expatriate of the United States who is on assignment with a foreign based participating employer is excluded from participation in the Plan if the employee participates in the foreign based employer's retirement plan.

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### *Contributions*

Employees may become participants by electing to have their employer contribute to the Plan on the participant's behalf between 1% and 50% of the participant's eligible pre-tax or post-tax compensation by authorizing compensation deductions (Elective Deferral Contributions or Elective Roth Contributions, respectively), subject to Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. The deferral limitation for an individual participant's pre-tax contribution, as set by the IRC, was \$23,000 during 2024. In addition, participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions of up to \$7,500 in 2024. The Plan and ERISA regulations place additional limitations on contributions.

The Plan provides for employer matching contributions (Matching Contributions). During 2024, each of the Adopting Companies matched 100% of each participant's Elective Deferral Contributions on the first 6% of eligible annual compensation. The Adopting Companies contributed \$1,971,758 in Matching Contributions for 2024.

The Plan provides for employer non-discretionary contributions (Safe Harbor Contributions). During 2024, the Adopting Companies made contributions equal to 4% of eligible annual compensation to a maximum annual contribution of \$13,800. The Adopting Companies contributed \$1,498,258 in Safe Harbor Contributions for 2024.

The Plan also provides for employer discretionary contributions (Regular Contributions). No Regular Contributions were made in 2024.

Notwithstanding any provision of this Plan to the contrary, contributions, benefits, and service credit with respect to Qualified Military Service will be provided in accordance with the provisions of the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA) and Code Section 414(u). A participant who is absent from employment solely by reason of Qualified Military Service shall be subject to the following rules and privileges: (i) if the eligible employee was not yet a participant by reason of failure to satisfy the minimum service requirements of the Plan, such eligible employee shall be deemed to have become a participant as of the entry date on which he or she would otherwise have become a participant had such employment not been interrupted by Qualified Military Service, (ii) all make-up contributions by the participant or the employer shall be deemed to be made in the Plan year in which originally missed, (iii) any participant who resumes employment following Qualified Military Service within the time during which his or her reemployment rights are protected by the provisions of USERRA shall be entitled to make up missed elective deferral contributions, and (iv) to the extent that the Adopting Companies are required to make contributions to the Plan for any participant in order to comply with the provisions of USERRA and Code Section 414(u), such contributions shall be made when the participant presents himself or herself to resume services as an employee of the Adopting Companies. A period of qualified military service shall be included with hours of service to the extent it has not already been credited. For purposes of crediting hours of service during a period of qualified military service, an hour of service shall be credited for each hour such employee would normally have been scheduled to work for the employer.

### *Rollovers and Transfers*

Employees may make a rollover contribution, including Roth contributions, into the Plan provided that such contribution is from an eligible retirement plan as determined in accordance with the IRC. Additionally, a terminated participant may make transfers from the Plan to plans qualified under

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the applicable sections of the IRC or Individual Retirement Accounts (IRA) upon the occurrence of any of the events described in the payment of benefits discussion below.

### ***Vesting***

Participants shall at all times be fully vested in the value of their Elective Deferral Contributions, Elective Roth Contributions, rollover contributions, Matching Contributions, Safe Harbor Contributions, and Regular Contributions (if any).

### ***Payment of Benefits***

Participant account balances are distributed in a lump sum upon termination of employment due to (a) retirement, (b) death, (c) disability, or (d) for reasons other than (a), (b), or (c), in accordance with the Plan provisions. Terminated participants who do not make a timely benefit election and have vested balances of \$1,000 or less will be automatically distributed a lump sum. Vested balances greater than \$1,000 but less than \$5,000 will be automatically rolled into an eligible retirement plan. If the vested account balance is greater than \$5,000, and the participant has not attained the age of 65, the participant may elect to have the amount distributed or deferred to a future date, subject to certain restrictions.

### ***Participants' Accounts***

An account is established on behalf of each participant. The participants' accounts are credited with Elective Deferral, Elective Roth, Matching, Regular, and Safe Harbor Contributions and credited or debited with the proportionate share of investment earnings or losses, respectively, relating to such contributions, and debited with withdrawals and administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

### ***Investments***

Participants direct the investment of their contributions, participating employers' contributions, and/or account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan and may change investments and transfer amounts between funds daily.

### ***Amendment and Termination of the Plan***

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Plan Manager reserves the right to amend or terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event of termination, all employer contributions and earnings or losses thereon will remain fully vested and the net assets of the Plan are distributed in accordance with the Plan's provisions.

### ***Notes Receivable from Participants (Participant Loans)***

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to 50% of their vested account balances, not to exceed \$50,000, subject to certain borrowing restrictions. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer (from)/to the investment fund to/(from) the participant's loan account. Loan terms range from one to five years, or up to ten years for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by an assignment of a participant's vested interest in the Plan and bear interest at a rate equal to one percentage point above the then current prime rate. The interest rates for loans outstanding at December 31, 2024 and 2023 ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%. Effective

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December 9, 2011, a participant may not have more than two loans outstanding at any time and the minimum amount available for a loan is \$1,000.

### ***Forfeitures***

The portion, if any, of a participant's contribution account which is not vested will be forfeited on the earlier of the date on which the participant receives a distribution of vested benefits and the date on which such participant incurs five consecutive breaks-in-service. Forfeitures are used to reduce the respective Adopting Company's Matching and/or Regular Contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures amounted to \$97,732 and \$104,242, respectively. These forfeitures are available to offset the applicable Adopting Company's current and/or future contributions or administrative fees. During the year ended December 31, 2024, employer contributions were reduced by forfeitures amounting to \$11,458.

## **2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

### ***Basis of Accounting***

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

### ***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets available for benefits and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### ***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value of a financial instrument is the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Company determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and Trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Security transactions are recorded on a trade-date basis. Gains or losses from the sale of investments are determined on the average cost basis. Realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments bought, sold, and held are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments in the accompanying statement of changes in assets available for benefits. Interest income is accrued when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in the registered investment companies are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

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### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent loans are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

### ***Administrative Fees***

Certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor and the Adopting Companies and are excluded from these financial statements. Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor and the Adopting Companies, except for certain expenses that are charged to the participant accounts, including loan, withdrawal fees, plan administrative fees, and investment management fees. Certain investment expenses which are charged within investments are presented net of the appreciation in fair value of investments. All other expenses of the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024 were paid by the Company and the Adopting Companies and are excluded from these financial statements.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

## **3. Risk and Uncertainties**

The Plan utilizes various investment instruments, including registered investment companies and a stable value fund. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with investment securities, Plan management believes it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the value of the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

## **4. Fair Value Measurements**

The Plan follows the provisions of Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurement*. ASC 820 establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

*Level 1* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.

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- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

### ***Asset Valuation Techniques***

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Observable inputs are inputs that reflect the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on market data obtained from sources independent of the Plan. Unobservable inputs are inputs that reflect the Plan's own assumptions about the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on the best information available in the circumstances.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for these items, as well as the general classification of such items pursuant to the fair value hierarchy of ASC 820:

*Registered Investment Companies* - Registered investment companies are valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year-end. The registered investment companies held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Stable Value Fund* - The Reliance Trust Company Stable Value Fund - MetLife Series (RSVF or the Fund) is a collective investment trust stable value fund with an underlying investment in a fully benefit-responsive investment contract that is carried at the NAV (as a practical expedient), an amount that approximates fair value. The beneficial interest of each participant is represented by units. Units are issued and redeemed daily at the Fund's NAV of \$1 per unit. Distributions to the Fund's unit holders are declared daily from the net investment income and automatically reinvested in the Fund on a monthly basis, when paid. It is the policy of the Fund to use its best efforts to maintain a stable NAV of \$1 per unit, although there is no guarantee that the Fund will be able to maintain this value. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no redemption fees, notice periods, or unfunded commitments related to the Fund.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies of these items held at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

## 6. Federal Income Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Plan Administrator, by a letter dated April 23, 2014, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable regulations of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since the last determination letter; however, the Plan Sponsor and Plan management believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and the Plan and related trust continue to be tax exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by federal, state, and/or local taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no IRS examinations for any tax periods in progress.

## Notes to Financial Statements

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### 7. Exempt Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of registered investment companies managed by an affiliate of Vanguard. Vanguard is the Trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund.

Certain expenses of the Plan are paid by the Adopting Companies, and personnel and facilities of the Plan Administrator have been utilized by the Plan at no charge.

Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations. There were no assets maintained in a separate account received pursuant to revenue sharing agreements as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Notes receivable from participants also qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

### 8. Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated all subsequent events or transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued and has determined there are no subsequent events requiring adjustments to or disclosures in the financial statements.
