NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Bob Thomas Dealership Employee Benefits Trust (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document or Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, which are available from the plan administrator.

General

The Plan is a welfare benefit plan sponsored for the employees of Capital City Ford, Inc., Bob Thomas Dealerships and Dimension Holdings, Inc. (the "Plan Sponsors"). Covered employees become eligible to participate in the Plan after 90 days of continuous full-time employment. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

The plan provides medical, prescription drug coverage, dental, long-term disability, group life, and accidental death and dismemberment coverage for eligible employees and their dependents. The trustees of the Plan have the right to modify the benefits of the Plan or terminate the Plan at any time.

Contributions

The Plan is self-funded through a trust (the "Trust"). The Trust receives predetermined contributions from covered participants based on the benefit coverage selected. The Plan Sponsors contribute proportionally to the Trust to fund benefits and is responsible for funding any shortfall that may occur.

Benefits

The Plan offers three options for health care coverage: a bronze plan, silver plan, and gold plan.

Health and dental claims were processed by Physicians Health Plan, Inc. ("PHP") through December 31, 2023 and by United Health Care ("UHC") from January 1, 2024 to August 31, 2024, but the responsibility for payments to participants and providers is retained by the plan.

The Plan does not provide for post-retirement or uninsured death benefits.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared using the cash basis method of accounting. Under this method, revenues are recognized and recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when an obligation is incurred.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Benefit Obligations

Plan obligations for health claims incurred but not reported ("IBNR,") are estimated by UHC, the Plan's claims processor. The IBNR was determined by using a five-month claims run-out approach based on gross medical and prescription claims paid. Such estimated amounts are reported in the accompanying statements of benefit obligations at current value.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsors or Plan participants, as defined in the Plan document.

NOTE 3 - BENEFIT OBLIGATIONS

The estimated obligation for IBNR at August 31, 2024 and 2023 was calculated to be approximately \$1,016,000 and \$373,000, respectively. Estimated claims outstanding at August 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled approximately \$440,000 and \$164,000, respectively. Because of the inherent uncertainties in estimating benefit obligations, it is at least reasonably possible that the estimates used will change within the near term.

NOTE 4 - INSURANCE CONTRACT

The Plan maintains a reinsurance contract for specific and aggregate stop-loss coverage. The Plan is reimbursed if accident and health claims for an individual exceeds \$85,000 in a plan year. The Plan is also reimbursed if aggregate claims exceed \$1,038,672 for the calendar year ended December 31, 2024, up to \$1,000,000. Reinsurance received for the years ended August 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$360,513 and \$19,224, respectively, and is included in claims paid, net of reimbursements in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits, cash basis.

The Plan also provides group term life insurance and accidental death and dismemberment insurance through a separate insurance company.

NOTE 5 - TAX STATUS

The Trust has not obtained a determination letter from the Internal Revenues Service ("IRS") to be exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(9) of the Internal Revenue Code and is therefore treated as a taxable trust.

As of August 31, 2024, the Trust has a loss carry forward of approximately \$17,000 that will offset future taxable income. The tax effect of this amount has not been recorded in the accompanying financial statements due to immateriality and uncertainty of realization.

Accounting principles require the Plan Sponsors to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Sponsors have analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and have concluded that as of August 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
