We have performed audits of the accompany financial statements of Cunningham Group Architecture, Inc. 1. Plan Description

The following brief description of the Cuningham Group Architecture, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees, as defined, of Cuningham Group Architecture, Inc., (the Company), who are age eighteen (18) or older.

Contributions – Participants are allowed to make voluntary pretax contributions of eligible compensation, as defined, to their plan accounts. Participants may also make rollover contributions from qualified benefit plans of previous employers. The Company may also contribute on a discretionary basis a match equal to a percentage of employee contributions. Additional discretionary amounts may be contributed at the election of the Company's Board of Directors. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. The Company's contributions are made in cash.

Participant Accounts – Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's discretionary matching contribution, if any, and allocations of (a) the Company's additional discretionary, if any, and (b) plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contribution and rollover contributions. Vesting in the Company's voluntary matching contributions and additional discretionary contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is one hundred percent (100%) vested after two (2) years of credited service.

Forfeitures – Forfeitures shall first be made to reinstate previously forfeited account balances to former participants, as defined. The remaining forfeitures, if any, shall be used to reduce future contributions made by the Company. There were forfeitures of \$46,268 transferred into the merged plan in the month ended January 31, 2025. The balance of forfeitures at January 31, 2025 and December 31, 2024, was \$0- and \$42,976, respectively.

Notes Receivable - Participants may borrow from their fund accounts at a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or fifty percent (50%) of their account balance. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the participant's loan fund. Loan terms range from one to five years, or a longer term for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account, and the interest rate charged is 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through biweekly payroll deductions.

1. Plan Description (continued)

Payment of Benefits - Benefits paid to participants represent the amount paid during the year to withdrawing participants. Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive the value of his or her benefits in the form of a lump-sum amount equal to the participant's account balance or installment payments over a specified period of time. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America, except for distributions paid to participants which are prepared on the cash basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit responsive investment contracts. However, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute to that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of certain assets, liabilities, and disclosures. Accordingly, the actual amounts could differ from those estimates. Any adjustments applied to estimated amounts are recognized in the year in which such adjustments are determined.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of January 31, 2025 and December 31, 2024.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of the notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's accounts and are included in the administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the appreciation of fair value of investments.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in mutual funds are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of net appreciation in fair value of investments.

The change in net unrealized appreciation/depreciation of investments held from the beginning of the plan year to the end of the plan year is included with realized gains/losses as net investment income/loss reported in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Contributions

Contributions from employees and the Company are recorded in the period in which the Company makes the payroll deductions from participant earnings.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Reclassifications

Certain amounts in prior year comparative totals have been reclassified to conform with the presentation in the current year financial statements.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through November 12, 2025, which is the date financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Plan Merger

In 2024 the Company approved merging the Plan into a different pooled employer plan (PEP) effective January 1, 2025. All of the Plan's assets were transferred into the PEP by January 15, 2025.

4. Certification of Investment Information

Certain information related to the investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at January 31, 2025 and December 31, 2024, and the net investment gain (loss), interest and dividends for the month ended January 31, 2025, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan and certified as complete and accurate by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC (the custodian of the Plan).

5. Fair Value

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the assets or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

5. Fair Value (continued)

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at January 31, 2025 and December 31, 2024.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective Trust Fund: Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

6. Income Tax Status

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on October 31, 2011, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and exempt from income tax. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provision of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan has adopted *Accounting for Uncertainty in Income Taxes*, ASC 740-10. The Plan's policy is to evaluate uncertain tax positions, at least annually, for the potential for income tax exposure. In compliance with its IRC status, the Plan annually files an Annual Return/Report of Employee Benefit Plan (Form 5500). The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are no current audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan's investments, in general, are subject to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risk. Additionally, the value, liquidity, and related income of the investments are sensitive to changes in economic conditions and may be affected by shifts in the market's perception of issuers and changes in interest rates. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in value of investments will occur near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

8. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan's investments are managed by an investment advisor to the Plan. The investment transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services were \$5,417 in the month ended January 31, 2025.
