We have performed audits of the financial statements of Callan LLC Retirement Savings Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Callan LLC Retirement Savings Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Note 1 – Description of Plan

The following description of Callan LLC Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement, as amended, for a more complete description of plan provisions.

General – The Plan is a 401(k) salary deferral and profit sharing plan covering substantially all employees of Callan LLC, and is subject to provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Callan LLC (the Company) is the Plan’s sponsor and serves as plan administrator.

Eligibility – Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan upon reaching age 21. Participants must complete at least one year of service to be eligible to receive any employer paid profit sharing contributions.

Contributions

Participant contributions – Each year, participants may contribute between 1% and 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also elect to make Roth contributions and voluntary, nondeductible, after-tax employee contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Plan also permits automatic enrollment of eligible employees in the Plan with a contribution of 5% of eligible compensation. Unless elected otherwise by the participant, deferrals are automatically increased annually by 1%, up to a maximum auto-deferral of 15%.

Employer match and profit sharing contributions – The Company may elect to make discretionary matching contributions to the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company matched 25% of participant contributions. The Company may also make discretionary profit sharing contributions, as defined in the Plan and as approved by the Board of Directors. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made a \$1,200,000 profit sharing contribution to the Plan.

Contributions are subject to regulatory limitations.

Participant accounts – Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company’s profit sharing contributions and plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account. Participants direct the investment of their account into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Callan LLC Retirement Savings Plan Notes to Financial Statements

Vesting – Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and any of the Company’s match and profit sharing contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Participants who terminated employment with the Company prior to June 1, 2019, vest in the Company’s contributions based on the following schedule:

Notes receivable from participants – Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are issued by the Plan and secured by the balance in the participant’s vested account. All loans must be repaid within a period of five years, unless the loan is used to purchase a principal residence, in which case the loan must be repaid within a reasonable period of time not to exceed 10 years. Under the terms of the Plan Agreement, plan loans will bear a reasonable rate of interest determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. As of December 31, 2024, the rates of interest on outstanding loans ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%, with various maturities through March 2031.

Payment of benefits – Upon termination, the participants or beneficiaries may elect to leave their account balance in the Plan, or receive their total benefits in a lump sum amount, installment payments, or partial withdrawals equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in their account. The Plan allows for the automatic distribution of participant account balances that do not exceed \$5,000.

Forfeitures – Forfeitures are the nonvested portion of a participant’s account that is lost upon termination of employment. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan, and must be used to pay administrative expenses or reduce future Company contributions.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting – The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP), using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the use of estimates and assumptions that may affect certain amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation – The investments are reported at fair value. The Plan’s trustee, Charles Schwab Trust Bank (Charles Schwab), certifies the fair value of all investments. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments.

Callan LLC Retirement Savings Plan Notes to Financial Statements

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (the exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Income recognition – Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. The net appreciation in fair value of investments consists of both the realized gains and losses and unrealized appreciation and depreciation of those investments.

Contributions – Contributions from participants and corresponding matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes receivable from participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at amortized cost, which represents unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions upon the occurrence of a distributable event, based on the terms of the Plan Agreement. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Payment of benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses – The Plan's administrative expenses may be paid out of the forfeiture account or paid by the Company. Investment management, distribution, and loan transaction fees are paid by the Plan participants.

Subsequent events – The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through August 26, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Callan LLC Retirement Savings Plan Notes to Financial Statements

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation techniques used for assets measured at fair value. There had been no changes in the techniques used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered investment companies (mutual funds) – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission.

Participant directed brokerage accounts – Accounts primarily consist of mutual funds (valued as above) and common stocks that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

Stable value fund collective trust – A stable value fund that is composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts that is valued using the NAV practical expedient, an estimate of fair value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the trust, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Other collective trusts – Units held in other collective trusts (CT) are valued using the NAV practical expedient of the CT as reported by the CT managers. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the CT, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. There are no restrictions on redemption, both at the plan and participant level, for these CT investments.

The valuation techniques used by the Plan may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 4 – Tax Status

The Plan document is a prototype standardized defined contribution plan that has been amended since receiving a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated September 21, 2020, which stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

In accordance with guidance on accounting for uncertainty in income taxes, the plan administrator has evaluated the Plan's tax positions and does not believe the Plan has any uncertain tax positions that require disclosure or adjustment to the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 5 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market volatility, and credit risks. It is reasonably possible, given the level of risk associated with investment securities, that changes in the values of the investments in the near term could materially affect a participant's account balance and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 6 – Certified Investment Information

The following information related to investments was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Charles Schwab, a qualified institution:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income from notes receivables from participants reflected on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

- Investments reflected on the schedule of assets (held at end of year).

Note 7 – Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments in the participant-directed brokerage accounts may be managed by Charles Schwab, trustee of the Plan, and, therefore, transactions with these entities qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. The Callan Glidepath funds are managed by the Plan sponsor; however, fees are not charged to the Plan for these investments.

Note 8 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to terminate the Plan and discontinue its contributions at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, amounts allocated to a participant's account become fully vested.
