Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.



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Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

March 31, 2025

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Wachtell, Lipton, Rosen & Katz Savings Plan (the Plan) provides general information about the Plan's provisions. Participants should refer to the Plan document and summary plan description of the Plan's provisions, copies of which may be obtained from Wachtell, Lipton, Rosen & Katz (the Partnership, Plan Sponsor or Plan Administrator).

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan whose purpose is to provide an additional source of retirement income for eligible employees and partners of the Partnership. In general, any employee (with the exception of non-partner attorneys, unless specifically designated) or partner who has satisfied the applicable age and service conditions is eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan allows for a participant to enter the Plan as a participant, for the purpose of making his/her own contributions, immediately upon his/her date of hire. After one year of service (having worked 1,000 hours) and upon attainment of age 21, eligible employees and partners are eligible for discretionary employer contributions effective on the next Plan entry date (effective March 31, 2015, quarterly entry date).

The WLR&K Retirement Plan Administrative Committee (the Committee) is responsible for the general administration of the Plan. Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity) and Fidelity Workplace the trustee and recordkeeper, respectively, for the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Contributions

A participant may enter into a salary reduction agreement, electing to reduce his or her salary by an amount equal to the salary deferral contribution (Elective Deferrals). In addition, the Partnership may make a discretionary contribution (Discretionary Employer Contribution) for each Plan year on behalf of all participants.

Participants may also make voluntary contributions to the Plan (Voluntary Employee Contributions), which are not deductible by the participants for tax purposes. The Plan also allows for rollovers from other qualified retirement plans.

Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

1. Description of the Plan (continued)

Total annual additions, as defined in Section 415 of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code), to each participant's account are limited to 100% of each participant's compensation up to a maximum of \$70,000 and \$69,000 for the 2025 and 2024 limitation years, respectively. Under the Code, the Elective Deferrals limitation is \$23,500 for the 2025 calendar year and \$23,000 for the 2024 calendar year. Also, if a participant has reached the Elective Deferral limit and is at least 50 years of age prior to the years ended December 31, 2025 and 2024, the participant may contribute an additional \$7,500. Beginning for 2025, participants who are ages 60-63 may contribute up to an additional \$11,250.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the Partnership's contributions, the participant's Elective Deferrals, Voluntary Employee Contributions and Plan earnings. The allocation of Plan earnings is based on participant account balances. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their Voluntary Employee Contributions, rollovers, and Elective Deferrals, plus actual earnings thereon. Under the Plan, participants become vested in the Discretionary Employer Contributions at a rate of 20% per year beginning with the completion of two years of service and, therefore, become 100% vested in Discretionary Employer Contributions after six years of service. Forfeitures may be applied to pay administrative expenses of the Plan, reduce any qualified non-elective contributions, or reduce any non-elective contributions. For the years ended March 31, 2025 and 2024, \$132,564 and \$80,628 of forfeitures were used to reduce non-elective contributions. There were unapplied forfeitures of \$ 19,594 and \$327 at March 31, 2025 and 2024, respectively.

Participant Loans

The Plan allows a participant to borrow funds from the participant's account, subject to certain limitations. The minimum amount of the loan is \$1,000, and the total loan amount may not exceed the lesser of: (i) \$50,000 reduced by the largest unpaid balance for any loan made to the participant that was outstanding during the 12-month period immediately preceding the valuation date of the loan request, or (ii) 50% of the vested present value of the non-forfeitable accrued benefit of the

participant under the Plan. All loans require approval by the Plan Administrator. The loans must bear a reasonable interest rate, determined at the time of the application. The period for repayment of a loan may not exceed five years (except in the case of a loan used to acquire, construct, or reconstruct a principal residence, which can be repaid within ten years) under terms determined by the Plan Administrator on a non-discriminating basis.

Payment of Benefits

Payments may be made as a single, lump sum payments as well as flexible payment options, unless otherwise required. Upon a participant's death, the participant's beneficiary receives the full amount in the participant's account.

Amounts attributable to Voluntary Employee Contributions generally may be withdrawn before termination of employment. Amounts attributable to Elective Deferrals and Discretionary Employer Contributions may not be withdrawn before the participant terminates employment with the Partnership.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Partnership has the right, under the Plan agreement, to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event the Plan is terminated, each participant will become fully vested and the net assets of the Plan will be distributed to its participants within a reasonable period of time after such termination.

Administration Costs

Substantially all Plan administration costs are presently being paid by the Plan.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balances, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements, accompanying notes and supplemental schedule. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). See Note 5 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

In accordance with Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, assets and liabilities measured at fair value are categorized into the following fair value hierarchy:

- Level 1 – Fair value is based on unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in an active market that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.
- Level 2 – Fair value is based on quoted prices in markets that are not active, quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets, and inputs that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

- Level 3 – Fair value is based on prices or valuation techniques that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable. These inputs reflect management’s judgment about the assumptions that a market participant would use in pricing the investment and are based on the best available information, some of which may be internally developed.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded as earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Subsequent Events

Management evaluated subsequent events for the Plan through November 11, 2025, the date the accompanying financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Income Tax Status

The underlying pre-approved plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), dated June 30, 2020, stating that the form of the Plan is qualified under Section 401 of the Code and, therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. The Plan Administrator has determined that it is eligible to, and has chosen to, rely on the current IRS pre-approved plan opinion. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualified status. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of March 31, 2025, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

4. Information Certified by the Trustee

Certain investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held and notes receivable from participants at March 31, 2025 and 2024, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, interest on participant loans and other income for the years then ended, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by the Trustee.

5. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (i.e., an exit price). To measure fair value, a hierarchy has been established that requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. As such, the hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy in ASC 820 are described in Note 2.

The level in the fair value hierarchy within which the fair value measurement is classified is determined based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets and liabilities measured at fair value:

The Plan's investments are stated at market value, as determined by Fidelity. Mutual funds are valued based on quoted prices at the end of the fiscal year. The Plan holds shares in the Fidelity Managed Income Portfolio, a common collective trust whose underlying investments include fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. The Fidelity Managed Income Portfolio is measured using a published net asset value (NAV_), as quoted by Fidelity. The common/collective trust fund has a readily determinable fair value and purchases and sales occur daily without restriction.

6. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market volatility, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

7. Transactions With Parties-in-Interest

The Plan's investments managed by Fidelity are considered to be party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan Sponsor for the years ended March 31, 2025 and 2024, were not significant. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions; however, they are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules under ERISA.
