- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

***Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA***

The supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and



other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The certified investment information in the supplemental schedule agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by a qualified institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### December 31, 2024 and 2023

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#### 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Davidson Kempner Capital Management LP 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

##### **General**

The Plan is a defined contribution pension plan qualified under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (“IRC”) covering all permanent employees of Davidson Kempner Capital Management LP (the “Company”) who have met certain requirements as to age and length of service, as defined in the Plan document. Charles Schwab Trust Bank is the trustee of the Plan, pursuant to a trust agreement entered into between the Company and Charles Schwab Trust Bank and Schwab Retirement Plan Services, Inc. as the third party administrator of the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (“ERISA”).

The Plan sponsors two adopting employers via signed amendments, Davidson Kempner Hawthorne Partners LLC and Ashland Place Finance LLC.

##### **Eligibility**

Employees are eligible to enter the Plan monthly, provided they have completed one month of service and attained the age of 21.

##### **Contributions and Funding Policy**

Participants may elect to make contributions of pre-tax annual compensation, up to the legal maximum allowable amount, as defined by the IRC. Participants may elect to make Roth contributions of after-tax annual compensation, up to the legal maximum allowable amount, as defined by the IRC. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Company, at its discretion, may make profit sharing contributions to the Plan, subject to limitations and as defined by the Plan. For the 2024 Plan Year, the Company made a profit sharing contribution in the amount of \$7,725,834 (2023: \$7,137,178). The Company, at its discretion, may also make matching contributions to the Plan. The Company has made a matching contribution for participants whose compensation is less than \$500,000 for the preceding calendar year equal to 100% of a participant’s salary deferrals up to a maximum of \$7,500 (2023: \$7,500) in a Plan year. For the 2024 Plan Year, the Company made matching contributions in the amount of \$1,676,350 (2023: \$1,579,269).

##### **Participant Accounts**

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and an allocation of (a) the Company’s contributions, if any, (b) Plan earnings or losses and (c) administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant’s compensation or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

##### **Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and the Company’s matching contribution, if any, plus actual earnings or losses thereon. A participant that has completed one year of service and is employed on the last day of the Plan year is eligible to share in the Company’s profit sharing contribution for the year and is immediately vested in this contribution.

##### **Benefits**

Participants may receive all or a portion of their account balance upon termination of employment, upon becoming disabled, upon reaching 59 ½ years of age, upon retiring on or after normal retirement age or due to hardship. Terminated participants with benefits of \$1,000 or less, will automatically receive the value of his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

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#### **Hardships**

A participant who is still an employee of the Company can take a distribution from the Plan because of financial hardship. The amount distributable cannot exceed the amount required to relieve the hardship, including amounts to pay any federal, state or local income taxes or penalties reasonably anticipated to result from the distribution. A hardship distribution will only be made in a single lump sum payment. Hardship distributions may be made of up to 100% of a participant's 401(k) contribution amounts and any earnings on such contributions.

#### **Notes Receivable From Participants**

Subject to limitations described in the Plan document, participants may borrow from vested accounts a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. All notes receivable shall bear a reasonable rate of interest as determined by the Plan administrator and must be repaid in no more than five years, unless used for the purchase of the participant's principal residence, for which the repayment period is up to ten years (formerly up to thirty years). The participant's vested account balance serves as collateral for the notes receivable from participants. The interest rates on outstanding loans at December 31, 2024 and 2023 ranged from 5.12% to 9.50% and 4.25% to 9.50%, respectively, and maturities through October 31, 2034.

#### **Private Investment Company Receivable**

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had receivables from a private investment company in the amount of \$201,692 and \$1,982,162, respectively, representing unpaid withdrawals at the end of the year in accordance with the terms of such private investment company.

## **2. Summary of Accounting Policies**

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared in compliance with the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles ("GAAP").

#### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of certain assets, liabilities and changes therein at the date of the financial statements and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

#### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan.

#### **Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments are reported based on the fair values of the underlying investments. Fair value of a financial instrument is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on the trade-date basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date and interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Net appreciation in fair value of investments represents the change in fair value of assets from one period to the next and realized gains and losses.

#### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

#### **Administrative Expenses**

Most administrative expenses of the Plan, including the Plan administrator and audit costs, are paid by the Company. The administrative expenses that are paid out of Plan assets are custodial fees and loan fees, both of which are paid out of the accounts of the applicable participants only.

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### 3. Fair Value Measurements

In accordance with the authoritative guidance on fair value measurements and disclosures under GAAP, the Plan discloses the fair value of its investments in a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to valuations based upon unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to valuations based upon unobservable inputs that are significant to the valuation (Level 3 measurements). The guidance establishes three levels of the fair value hierarchy, as follows:

Level 1	Inputs that reflect unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date;
Level 2	Inputs that are observable for the asset or liability either directly or indirectly, including quoted prices in markets that are not considered to be active; and
Level 3	Inputs that are unobservable.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Registered investment companies: Valued at unadjusted quoted market prices which represent the net asset value (“NAV”) of shares held by the Plan at year end.

Personal choice retirement account (“PCRA”) – The PCRA includes private investment companies which are valued, as a practical expedient, utilizing the NAV provided by each underlying investment company, without adjustment, when the NAVs of the investments owned by the investment company are calculated in a manner consistent with GAAP. The Plan applies the practical expedient to its investments in private investment companies on an investment-by-investment basis, and consistently with the Plan’s entire position in a particular investment, unless it is probable that the Plan will sell a portion of an investment at an amount different from the NAV. If it is probable that the Plan will sell an investment at an amount different from the NAV or in other situations where the practical expedient is not available, the Plan considers features of the investment in addition to the NAV, including subscription and redemption rights, expected discounted cash flows, transactions in the secondary market, bids received from potential buyers, and overall market conditions in its determination of fair value. The private investment companies did not have any unfunded commitments at December 31, 2024 and 2023. The private investment companies are a multi-strategy fund and a distressed fund. The multi-strategy fund allows monthly redemptions on at least 60 days’ notice and quarterly redemptions on at least 90 days’ notice, respectively. As of the year ended December 31, 2024, the distressed fund is in a orderly winddown and has suspended all redemptions. Future distributions will occur upon the realization of investments.

PCRA – other: Common stock is valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded. Cash and cash equivalents are valued at cost which approximates fair value. U.S government securities are valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities. Mutual funds, registered investment companies and unit investment trusts are valued at unadjusted quoted market prices which represent the NAV of shares held by the Plan at year end.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

#### 4. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will remain 100 percent vested in their accounts.

#### 5. Tax Status

The Plan adopted a pre-approved plan document sponsored by Schwab Retirement Plan Services, Inc. ("Schwab"). Schwab received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"), dated September 21, 2020, which states that the pre-approved document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. Although the Plan has been amended since the opinion letter has been received, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and as such is exempt from federal income taxes.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Department of Labor ("DOL") or the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions. There are currently no audits in progress for any tax periods.

#### 6. Investment Information Prepared and Certified by Charles Schwab Trust Bank

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Charles Schwab Trust Bank, a

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qualified institution, has certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, except for \$55,670,975 and \$58,698,851, respectively, of private investment companies held within the Personal Choice Retirement Account.
- Investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, except for \$7,328,288 of gain from private investment companies held within the Personal Choice Retirement Account.
- Investment information included in the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, as shown on the ERISA-required supplemental schedule, except for \$55,670,975 of private investment companies held within the Personal Choice Retirement Account.

At the request of the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

#### **7. Risks and Uncertainties**

In the normal course of business, certain Plan assets are transacted with and held by Charles Schwab Trust Bank. The Plan is subject to credit risk to the extent Charles Schwab Trust Bank is unable to fulfill its contractual obligations. The Plan has not experienced and does not expect any losses from this arrangement.

The Plan invests in various investments and these investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

#### **8. Exempt Parties-in-Interest Transactions**

The assets of the Plan are invested with Charles Schwab Trust Bank, which is considered a party-in-interest as a provider of investment management services to the Schwab Value Advantage Money Ultra Fund and the Schwab S&P 500 Index Fund. Schwab Retirement Plan Services, Inc., the third party administrator, is considered a party-in-interest as a provider of administrative and accounting services to the Plan. These transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules. Certain assets available for investment within the Personal Choice Retirement Account are hedge funds managed by the Plan Sponsor. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

#### **9. Subsequent Events**

The Company has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued, and has determined that the Plan had no material subsequent events that require disclosure.
