

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

MARCH 31, 2025 AND 2024

Note 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN-

The following description of the UNITED CHEMI-CON, INC. 401(k) PLAN AND TRUST (the Plan) provides only general information. Reference should be made to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

A. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of UNITED CHEMI-CON, INC. ("the Company") who have met certain service and age requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

B. The Plan is designed as a qualified cash deferred arrangement pursuant to Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code and provides for the following contributions which are to be maintained in separate accounts.

C. Participants may elect to defer up to 100% of their annual compensation as defined in the Plan document, to the Plan, not to exceed Internal Revenue Code limitations.

D. The Company can make a discretionary matching contribution of each employee's annual deferred compensation. In addition, the Company, at its discretion, can contribute an additional profit sharing amount.

E. The Plan allows for the receipt of amounts from any other qualified plan, subject to the provisions of applicable tax law.

F. Employees have the ability to direct their employee and employer contributions into a variety of investment options allowed by the Plan.

G. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and an allocation of the Plan's earnings or losses.

H. Participants have a fully vested interest in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in their employer contributions is based upon years of continuous service with the Company. A participant is 100% vested after three years of continuous service. Each participant vests 100% upon reaching normal retirement age, death, or permanent disability.

I. Partial terminations may occur if 20% of more of the plan participants are terminated because of an action taken by the plan sponsor. If a partial termination occurs, terminated participants are immediately vested in their contribution.

Note 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN- (continued)

J. Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates that range from 4.25 percent to 9.50 percent, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through regular payroll deductions.

K. Forfeited balances of terminated participants' nonvested accounts, to the extent not used to restore forfeited accounts of retired participants, will be used to reduce any employer matching or employer non-elective contributions the employer would otherwise make for the Plan year in which the forfeitures are allocated.

L. Payments of benefits are made to participants or their beneficiaries upon death, retirement, disability, attainment of normal retirement age, or termination of employment. Benefits are payable in a lump sum or by other methods as described in the Plan.

Note 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES-

A. The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

B. During the year ended March 31, 2016, management has elected to adopt FASB ASU 2015- 12, Plan Accounting: Defined Benefit Pension Plans (Topic 960), Defined Contribution Pension Plans (Topic 962), Health and Welfare Benefit Plans (Topic 965) - (I) Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts, (II) Plan Investment Disclosures and (III) Measurement Date Practical Expedients (a consensus of the FASB Emerging Issues Task Force).

The ASU removes the requirement that the Plan report individual investments that exceed 5% of net assets available for benefits. In addition, disaggregation of net appreciation and depreciation by general type is no longer required, but only required to be presented in the aggregate. Also, investments are no longer required to be disclosed by nature, characteristic and risk, but only required to be disclosed by general type. Finally, disclosure of the investment strategy is no longer required for investments that are recorded at fair value using the Net Asset Value practical expedient as permitted by ASC 820-10 and that are in a fund that directly files Form 5500 with the U.S. Department of Labor. This ASU was required to be adopted retrospectively. There was no effect on net assets available for plan benefits and changes in net assets available for plan benefits.

During the year ended March 31, 2016, management has elected to adopt FASB ASU 2015- 07, Fair Value Measurement (Topic 820); Disclosure for Investments in Certain Entities that Calculate Net Asset Value per Share (or its Equivalent). Investments measured at fair value using the net asset value per share practical expedient are no longer required to be categorized within the fair value hierarchy. This ASU was required to be adopted retrospectively. There was no effect on net assets available for plan benefits and changes in net assets available for plan benefits.

C. The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements. Shares of mutual funds are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

D. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date and interest income is recognized on the accrual basis.

E. Payments of benefits are recorded when paid.

F. The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

G. Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of March 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the plan document.

H. Subsequent events were evaluated through December 1, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

B. Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820 (FASB ASC 820) Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 measurements: Inputs to valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 measurements: Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 measurements: Inputs that are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

C. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at March 31, 2025 and 2024.

Mutual funds: Valued at the NAV of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Group annuity contract fund: Valued at the NAV of the units held by the Plan. The Fund invests in fully-benefit responsive investment contracts that are held at contract value. NAV is determined to be contract value, the value at which participants ordinarily transact. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the Fund will sell the investment for an amount different from reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan's valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 6: TAX STATUS-

The Plan is a nonstandardized prototype plan sponsored by Orchard Trust Company LLC that has been adopted by the Company. The prototype plan obtained an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") stated the prototype plan, as then designed was in compliance with the application requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has not requested its own determination letter from the IRS. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

Note 7: RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS-

The Plan is responsible for all administrative expenses to the extent not borne by the Company.

The Plan paid approximately \$47,000 of recordkeeping fees to Empower Advisory Group, LLC. Empower Retirement, LLC is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore the transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.
