NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Hammond Lumber Company (Company) Group Benefits Plan (the Plan) provides only general information about the Plan's provisions. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions, copies of which may be obtained from the Plan sponsor.

General - The Plan provides health and other benefits to eligible employees of the Company and covered dependents. Coverage begins on the first day of the month following 30 days of full-time continuous employment, as defined by the Patient Protection & Affordable Care Act (ACA). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Benefits - The Plan provides health benefits (medical, vision, dental, and prescription drugs), flexible benefits, life insurance and dependent life, short-term disability (STD) benefits, and accidental death and dismemberment (AD&D) benefits. The Plan also provides continuation of certain benefits upon termination of employment through the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA).

Insured benefits - The Plan fully insures the life insurance benefits (basic and dependent) and AD&D benefits. The Company purchases annual insurance contracts for these insured benefits. Premiums for these insured benefit programs are paid to the insurance company from the general assets of the Company.

Stop-loss coverage - The Plan has entered into a stop-loss insurance arrangement in an effort to limit its exposure for self-insured benefits. The excess of individual participant claims over the specific attachment point of \$160,000 are eligible for reimbursement under the policy. Certain participants with a history of large claims do not qualify for stop-loss coverage or are subject to specific attachment points. There were no participants with specific attachment points as of December 31, 2024.

Self-insured benefits - All other Plan benefits are self-insured. The claims for self-insured benefits are processed by the Plan's third-party claims processors under administrative services only (ASO) arrangements. The claims processors pay claims directly to or on behalf of participants and are then reimbursed by the general assets of the Company. Despite the Plan's utilization of third-party claims processors, ultimate responsibility for payments to providers and participants is retained by the Plan.

The Plan utilizes a pharmacy benefit manager (PBM) which periodically makes refunds to the Plan based on the Plan's actual utilization pattern of specific drugs.

The Plan has a health reimbursement arrangement (HRA) that is funded solely through Company contributions. The HRA allows eligible participants who elect health benefits with an HRA component to be reimbursed tax free for qualified medical expenses subject to a specified ceiling. The employer is not permitted to refund any part of the balance to the employee; the account cannot be used for anything other than reimbursements for qualified medical expenses; and remaining amounts are not portable if the participant later elects a health benefit that does not have an HRA component or upon termination. Approximately \$178,000 of unused HRA funds are available to participants for medical expenses as of December 31, 2024.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN, CONTINUED

Contributions - In addition to deductibles and copayments, participants contribute specified amounts based on applicable monthly premiums for their respective benefit elections. Participants pay the full cost of flexible benefits. The Company pays the full cost of life insurance, dependent life, AD&D, and stop-loss insurance. The Company makes contributions to the Plan as needed to fund claims in excess of participants' contributions. Any deficiency of the Plan's net assets over benefit obligations is funded by the Company on a pay-as-you-go basis.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting and use of estimates - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, benefit obligations, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Payment of benefits - Premiums paid by the Company are recorded as premium payments in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Claim payments are recorded when paid by the third-party claims processor. STD payments are processed through the Company's payroll system and paid from the general assets of the Company.

Stop-loss premiums and reimbursements - Premiums for stop-loss insurance are included in premium payments in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Health care claims paid in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits are reported net of stop-loss refunds, totaling approximately \$1,427,000 in 2024.

Refunds - Refunds due from the Plan's PBM are recorded when received. Pharmacy rebates totaling approximately \$573,000 have been netted with claims paid in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Income taxes - The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) to maintain the tax-exempt status of the Plan. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP prescribes a comprehensive model for how an organization should measure, recognize, present, and disclose in its financial statements uncertain tax positions that the organization has taken or expects to take on a tax return. The Plan recognizes the tax benefits from uncertain tax positions if it is more likely than not that the tax position will be sustained on examination by the taxing authorities, based on the technical merits of the position.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES, CONTINUED

Subsequent events - The Plan has evaluated events, if any, that have occurred subsequent to December 31, 2024, through September 30, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and included information in the notes to the financial statements related to any identifiable events, if necessary.

3. CLAIMS INCURRED BUT NOT REPORTED

Plan obligations at December 31, 2024, for claims incurred but not reported are estimated by the Plan's third-party administrator based on claims submitted and approved for payment subsequent to year end. These amounts are paid by the Plan only if claims are approved for payment.

4. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

During the Plan year, the Plan paid certain administrative fees to Patient Advocates, LLC. Patient Advocates, LLC was the third-party claims administrator and, therefore, these transactions qualified as party-in-interest transactions. These expenses were reported on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits as administrative expenses. All other administrative expenses, such as professional fees, were paid by the Company on behalf of the Plan.

5. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to modify the benefits provided to and contributions required of participants, to discontinue its contributions at any time, and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, remaining assets will be applied in a uniform and nondiscriminatory manner toward the provision of benefits for or on account of the participants. No assets of the Plan may revert to the Company or be used for purposes other than for the exclusive benefit of the Plan's participants.

6. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Effective January, 1, 2025, Ellsworth Builders Supply, Inc. adopted the Plan as a participating employer.

Effective July 31, 2025, the Company acquired Ware-Butler Building Supply (Ware-Butler), a company with approximately 253 employees. Ware-Butler employees were eligible to participate in the Plan as of August 1, 2025.

Effective January, 1, 2025, the Plan made changes to several service providers, including the following: third-party medical claims administrator changed from Patient Advocates, LLC to Health Plans, Inc., third-party dental administrator changed from Patient Advocates, LLC to Northeast Delta Dental, life insurance company changed from MetLife to Transamerica, and third-party flexible spending account administrator changed from Patient Advocates, LLC to WEX.
