NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the FAM International Logistics 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established to provide retirement benefits for employees of FAM International Logistics (the Company). Substantially all employees, except union and nonresident aliens are eligible to participate in the Plan after reaching 21 years of age and have completed one year of eligible service. A year of eligible service is defined as completing at least 1,000 hours of service during the first 12 months of employment. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of compensation, as defined in the Plan, as pre-tax or Roth 401(k) contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollovers). The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of the first 3%, then 50% of the next 2% up to 5% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The Company may make a discretionary non-elective profit sharing contribution to the Plan as determined by plan management. There were no discretionary non-elective profit sharing contributions for the year ended December 31, 2021. All contributions are subject to certain limitations imposed by the Plan and the Internal Revenue Code (the Code).

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company contributions, and allocations of plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations of Company contributions, investment income and administrative expenses are based on participants' compensation or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested accounts.

Investment Options

Participants may direct their contributions into any of the funds offered by the Plan, which are held by ePlan Services, Inc. These funds include a variety of investment options with various objectives and degrees of financial risk.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their deferral, safe-harbor matching and rollover contributions, including the earnings on those amounts. Vesting in the Company non-elective profit sharing contributions portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. Participants are fully vested in employer non-elective profit sharing contributions upon the completion of six years of service. Participants are also fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death, or total disability.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or one-half of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years, except for loans to purchase a primary residence, which may be offered over a term of up to ten years. The loans are secured by the balance in the participants' accounts and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates, as determined by the plan administrator. The notes currently bear interest at rates ranging from 5.25% to 7.50%. Participants may only have one loan outstanding at any given time. Generally, principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon retirement, disability, death or termination of employment, the participant shall become entitled to the total value of his or her vested account. Distributions will be paid in a lump sum, installments or in partial withdrawals, based upon election of the participant or as defined in the Plan or the Code. If a participant terminates employment for any reason and his or her vested account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the plan administrator may distribute such amount in a lump-sum payment to the participant without consent of the participant.

The Plan also provides for in-service withdrawals by participants who have attained the age of 59½. Upon financial hardship, a participant is entitled to the value of his or her deferral accounts, but not the earnings thereon, which is payable immediately in a lump-sum distribution.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures of overpaid discretionary matching contributions are used to reduce the Company's future matching contributions, pay plan expenses or can be added to any employer discretionary non-elective profit sharing contribution. There were no forfeited non-elective profit-sharing accounts at December 31, 2021 and 2020. There were no forfeitures used for the year ended December 31, 2021.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2021 and 2020. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits to participants are recorded when paid.

Plan Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options. These investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and those changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through September 2, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - CERTIFICATION BY THE INVESTMENT TRUSTEE

Information presented in the accompanying statements and schedule as of December 31, 2021 and 2020, and for the year ended December 31, 2021 for investments, notes receivable from participants, investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants was derived, without audit, from information certified to be complete and accurate by Matrix Trust Company, the trustee, as permitted by the election made by the plan administrator under 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America establish a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2

Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Assets valued using the net asset value practical expedient are not required to be reported within the hierarchy.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value:

Money Market and Mutual Funds

Money market and mutual funds are valued at level 1 inputs at the quoted price of shares held by the Plan at year end.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2021 and 2020.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

There were no transfers between levels of investments during the years ended December 31, 2021 and 2020.

NOTE 5 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain plan investments are managed by ePlan Services, Inc. or its affiliates. ePlan Services, Inc. serves as the trustee and recordkeeper of the Plan, and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Investment and administrative expenses paid by the Plan to ePlan Services, Inc. or their affiliates totaled \$9,601 for the year ended December 31, 2021. Certain employees of the Company who participate in the Plan perform administrative services to the Plan at no cost to the Plan. Notes receivable from participants are also party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 6 - INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a nonstandardized pre-approved profit sharing, money purchase, CODA plan that received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) that it was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, the plan administrator believes the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their accounts.

NOTE 8 - DELINQUENT CONTRIBUTIONS

As disclosed in the accompanying supplemental schedule, certain employee deferrals were not remitted to the Plan within the timeframe required by the Department of Labor. The plan sponsor is in the process of correcting these delinquent employee deferrals, including lost earnings to the affected participants to the Plan to correct the late contributions.

NOTE 9 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Effective January 1, 2022, the plan changed investment trustees from Matrix Trust Company to Fidelity Management Trust Company.

Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan was amended and restated to change the plan name to Crisis 24 Global Protective Solutions 401(k) Plan. Additionally, the Plan removed the one year of eligible service requirement, resulting in eligible classes of employees becoming immediately eligible to participate in the Plan after reaching the age of 21.

Effective January 1, 2023, the Plan was amended and restated to change the safe harbor matching contribution to 100% of the first 5% of eligible participant's contributions. Additionally, the Patriot Group Global Retirement Plan merged into the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended and restated to provide service to be credited for purposes of eligibility for employees of Patronus Medical, LLC.

Effective May 19, 2025, the Plan was amended to change the cash out limitation and implementation of the required rollover rule from \$5,000 to \$1,000. Additionally, the Patronus Medical 401(k) Plan merged into the Plan.
