1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Smart Wires Grid, Inc. 401(k) Plan ("the Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan documents for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code covering substantially all employees of Smart Wires Grid, Inc. and Smart Wires Technology, LTD ("the Company"), except for collective bargaining employees, non-resident aliens who have no earned income from sources within the U.S., and residents of Puerto Rico, as defined by the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 80 percent of eligible annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Company provides a matching contribution of 100 percent of participant's elective deferrals up to 5 percent of eligible compensation that a participant contributed to the Plan each payroll period. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's Plan earnings. Allocations are based upon participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers mutual funds and a collective investment trust fund as investment options for participants.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their voluntary contributions and the Company's matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the Prime rate plus 1 percent. Principal and interest is paid ratably through regular payroll deductions. Participants can have no more than one loan outstanding at a time.

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, or due to other reasons, a participant or, when applicable, a designated beneficiary, may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum, partial payments, or installments as provided by the Plan. Hardship distributions are permitted from elective deferrals if a participant satisfies certain conditions. The Plan also allows for in-service distributions upon attaining age 59 ½. The Plan provides for a mandatory cash-out following severance of employment for account balances less than \$5,000 in a lump-sum amount.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested account balances totaled \$0. Forfeited accounts may be used to reduce future employer contributions and plan expenses. No forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions or offset Plan expenses.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. The fair value of a financial instrument is the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (the exit price). The Plan's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the record keeper. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/(depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions based on the terms of the Plan agreement. Deemed defaulted loans amounted to \$3,738 during 2024.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and other distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation/(depreciation) in fair value of investments.

The Plan has a Plan Expense Agreement account ("PEA") that is funded by Empower. The funds in the PEA may be used to pay Plan administrative expenses during the year. During the year ended December 31, 2024, Empower contributed \$23,967 to the PEA, which is shown as "other income", all of which was used to pay Plan administrative expenses.

3. Unaudited Information

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-5(c) of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Trust Company, LLC, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements is complete and accurate.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes to the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Collective Investment Trust Funds: The Plan invests in a stable value fund. This fund invests in benefit responsive investment contracts, fixed income securities, and money market funds. It is valued at 4pm EST on the last calendar day of the period. The portfolio policy is to use its best efforts to maintain a stable net asset value, although there is no guarantee. The portfolio obtains prices from one or more third party pricing vendors to value its investments. The fund is valued using NAV as a practical expedient.

Mutual Funds: Mutual funds are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions. Any unallocated assets of the Plan should be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner under the terms of the Plan agreement.

7. Tax Status

The Plan has received an opinion letter dated November 14, 2022, that the Plan document is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The Plan may be periodically amended, however, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's management believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit volatility. Market risks include U.S. and global events that could impact the value of Plan investments. Such events may include public health emergencies, as well as international conflicts, cybersecurity attacks, supply chain disruptions, global monetary policy decisions, inflation, significant economic influences, and other adverse credit and market events and conditions. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

9. Non-Exempt Transactions

During the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, employee withholdings amounting to \$119,291 and \$40,844, respectively, were not remitted to the Plan within the appropriate time frame by the Company. These transactions constitute prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA. The Company remitted these contributions to the Plan during 2023, 2024, and 2025. The Company intends to calculate and remit lost earnings to the Plan.
