Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule of Assets Held for Investment at Year End is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the THC 403(b) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan was established on July 1, 2017 as a defined contribution plan established to provide eligible employees of Tenderloin Housing Clinic, Inc. (the Company) (the Plan Sponsor) with retirement, death and disability benefits. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

Participant Eligibility, Contributions and Vesting - All employees are eligible to participate in the Plan except for non-resident aliens who do not receive earned income from the Company which constitutes income from sources within the United States. Participants may begin deferring a portion of their compensation into the plan immediately. The Plan allows participants to designate contributions as Roth 403(b). Contributions are limited to the maximum amount allowable under the provisions of the IRC.

The Company is allowed to make discretionary non-elective contributions. Employees who are at least eighteen years old are eligible except for the following classes: (a) employees who are non-residents aliens who do not receive earned income from the Company which constitutes income from sources within the United States and (b) leased employees. Participants must also work at least 975 hours during the Plan year and be employed by the Plan Sponsor on the last day of the Plan year to be eligible. The Plan year last day requirement is waived if a participant who terminates employment due to death, disability or attainment of normal retirement age. There was no employer non-elective contribution for the year ended June 30, 2025.

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings made thereon. The employer's contributions and earnings shall vest in accordance with the following schedule:

Less than 1	0%
1 or more	100%

In addition, the Company's contribution is fully vested when a participant becomes totally disabled or dies.

Forfeitures - Forfeited non-vested accounts are available by the Plan to offset future employer contributions or pay plan expenses. For the year ended June 30, 2025, the Plan used \$2,422 of forfeitures to offset employer contributions. As of June 30, 2025 and 2024, the forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$1,843 and \$4,172, respectively.

Investment Options - Participants exercise control over the types of investments made on their behalf, provided that such accounts are invested in investment funds designated by the Plan. Participants may invest in any one or more investment funds and change their investment options at any time.

Payment of Benefits - Upon retirement (age 59 ½), termination, disability or death, a participant or their beneficiary in the event of death, may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account. Additionally, participants may take in-service and hardship distributions. Upon termination, automatic distributions are required for balances of less than \$5,000. Generally, certain minimum distributions are required for participants who have separated from service and have reached age 73.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Loans are not permitted.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the employee's payroll contributions, the employer's contributions, and Plan earnings and losses. Allocations to participants' accounts are based on participant compensation or account balances in accordance with the provisions of the Plan.

Administration - The Company is the plan administrator and has engaged the services of Peery & Associates, Inc. (Peery) as a Third Party Administrator to handle daily administration of the Plan. The Plan's assets are managed by Nationwide Trust Company, FSB (Nationwide), the custodian of the Plan. The custodian, appointed by the Plan Sponsor, executes investment transactions and holds Plan investment assets. The plan administrator reviews the performance of the various available investments and makes decisions on the addition or deletion of an investment fund.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Contributions from participants are recorded when withheld. Benefit payments and expenses are recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Risks and Uncertainties - The Plan provides for various investment securities. These securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market fluctuations and credit risks. Further, due to the level of risk associated with these securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the values of investment securities, it is possible that changes in the various risk factors in the near term would materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the accompanying financial statements.

Valuation of Investments - Investments are stated at fair value determined by quoted market prices. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net change in fair value of investments consists of the change in unrealized appreciation or depreciation during the year and the realized gain or loss of sold investments during the year. Acquisition costs are included in the cost of investments and sales are recorded net of selling expenses.

Administrative Expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net change in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events - Subsequent events were evaluated through November 25, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - CERTIFIED INFORMATION

In accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, information certified by Nationwide regarding the current value of assets held as of June 30, 2025 and 2024, and transactions entered into during the year ended June 30, 2025 were used in the preparation of the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule. NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Generally accepted accounting principles establish a hierarchy to prioritize the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest ranking to fair values determined using unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (Level 1) and the lowest ranking to fair values determined using methodologies and models with unobservable inputs (Level 3). Observable inputs are those that market participants would use in pricing the assets based on market data obtained from sources independent of the Plan. Unobservable inputs reflect the Plan's assumption about the inputs market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on the best information available in the circumstances.

The fair value hierarchy is categorized into three levels based on the inputs as follows:

Level 1 – Values are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets accessible at the measurement date.

Level 2 – Inputs included in quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices from those willing to trade in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by market data for the term of the instrument. Such inputs include market interest rates and volatilities, spreads and yield curves.

Level 3 – Certain inputs are unobservable (supported by little or no market activity) and significant to the fair value measurement. Unobservable inputs reflect the Plan's best estimate of what hypothetical market participants would use to determine a transaction price for the asset or liability at the reporting date.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value at June 30, 2025 and 2024.

Interest-bearing cash: Valued at the closing price at year end.

Mutual funds: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the plan at year end.

Guaranteed investment contract: Valued at fair value by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the credit-worthiness of the issuer.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 - TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted a volume submitter profit sharing plan with a cash or deferral arrangement which has received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS, which states that the Plan is designed in compliance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. Plan management believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan's tax filings are subject to audit by various taxing authorities.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION AND MODIFICATION

The Plan Sponsor intends to continue the Plan indefinitely for the benefit of its employees; however, it reserves the right to terminate and/or modify the Plan at any time by resolution of its Board of Directors and subject to the provision of ERISA. In the event the Plan is terminated in the future, participants would become fully vested in their accounts.

NOTE 7 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST

Certain Plan investments are managed by Nationwide, the custodian of the Plan. Any purchases and sales of these funds are performed in the open market at fair value. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. The Plan has Peery as a Third Party Administrator and Cetera Investment Advisers, LLC (Cetera) as an investment advisor. During the year ended 2025, the Plan incurred \$29,203, \$27,727 and \$8,875 of administrative fees to Nationwide, Cetera and Peery, respectively. Some of these fees were paid outside of the Plan.
