NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Holden Farms, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan & Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established October 1, 1978. The Plan has been amended and restated throughout the years to comply with tax legislation. The Plan was last amended and restated effective October 1, 2021. The Plan covers all eligible employees of Holden Farms, Inc. (the Employer). Employees who have completed three months of service are eligible to begin making elective deferral contributions and receive the Employer safe harbor contribution. Employees who have completed one year of service are eligible to participate in the profit sharing portion of the Plan. The Plan excludes leased employees, residents of Puerto Rico, and employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement unless the bargaining agreement provides for participation in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Contributions

The Plan includes a cash or deferred arrangement allowed under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Eligible participants are permitted to elect to have a portion of their compensation contributed as pre-tax 401(k) or Roth contributions to the Plan. The Plan allows participants age 50 and older to make catch-up contributions.

Each year, at its discretion, the Employer may choose to make a nonelective safe harbor contribution equal to 3% of a participant's eligible compensation. During the years ended September 30, 2025 and 2024, the Employer contributed a nonelective safe harbor contribution of \$345,072 and \$336,922, respectively.

Each year, at its discretion, the Employer may choose to make a discretionary nonelective profit sharing contribution to eligible participants. In order to receive an allocation of the discretionary profit sharing contribution, a participant must complete 1,000 hours of service and be employed on the last day of the Plan year, unless termination is due to death, disability or retirement. For the years ended September 30, 2025 and 2024, the Employer approved discretionary nonelective profit sharing contributions in the amount of \$200,000 prior to any forfeitures used to reduce the deposit.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Employer discretionary nonelective profit sharing and safe harbor contributions, and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Employee contributions and Employer safe harbor contributions, plus actual earnings thereon, are immediately 100% vested. Employer discretionary profit sharing contributions, plus actual earnings thereon, are vested using a six-year graded vesting schedule, where a participant is 100% vested after completing six years of credited service. Notwithstanding the above, participants will become 100% vested in the Employer discretionary profit sharing contributions portion of their account if termination results from normal retirement, disability, or death.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures of nonvested account balances can be used to pay Plan expenses or to reduce Employer contributions. Forfeited nonvested accounts as of September 30, 2025 and 2024 totaled \$6,025 and \$1,106, respectively. Forfeitures used to reduce Employer Safe Harbor contributions for the years ended September 30, 2025, and 2024 were \$1,097 and \$12,072, respectively. Forfeitures used to reduce the Employer profit sharing contribution for the years ended September 30, 2025 and 2024 that was deposited subsequent to year-ends, were \$5,852 and \$-0-, respectively.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service, death, disability, or retirement (age 65), the participant may receive the value of the vested interest in their account in the form of a lump sum payment or installments. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance is not greater than \$1,000, the Plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. If the balance of the terminated participant's account is between \$1,000 and \$5,000, the Plan administrator may authorize that the benefit payment be rolled into an individual retirement account in the participant's name.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan trustees determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the custodian and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid either by the Plan or the Employer, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses paid directly by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investment presented in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through December 12, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Empower Trust Company, LLC, the trustee, and Empower Annuity Insurance Company (EAIC), the insurance company, have supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information, except for the self-directed brokerage accounts, presented in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of September 30, 2025 and 2024, the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of September 30, 2025.

The self-directed brokerage account ending balances of \$128,278 and \$111,533 as of September 30, 2025 and 2024, respectively, and net appreciation of \$16,745 and \$14,098 for the years then ended, respectively, are not covered by the certification.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS (CONTINUED)

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at September 30, 2025 and 2024.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units as determined by the insurance company. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions.

Collective Trust Funds: Valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

Self-Directed Brokerage Account: The self-directed brokerage account consists of investments in a money market fund, common stock, unit investment trusts, and real estate investment trusts that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

NOTE 5 GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with the insurance company. The insurance company maintains the contributions in a fixed interest account and pooled separate accounts. The fixed account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by the insurance company, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, and (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 6 PLAN TAX STATUS

The Plan is placing reliance on an opinion letter from the IRS indicating that the prototype plan is qualified under Section 401 of the IRC and is, therefore, not subject to tax under current income tax law. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 8 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan's investments are managed by Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity and Insurance Company, the trustee and insurance company, respectively, therefore, these investment transactions qualify as party-in-interest. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.
