Opinion

Note A - Plan Description and Basis of Presentation

The following brief description of the Spectrum Comm Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for complete information.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of Spectrum Comm Inc. (the “Company”) who have one year of service and are age twenty-one or older. The Plan operates, in relevant part, as an employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) and is designed to comply with section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (IRC) and is subject to the provisions of Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan is administered by the Plan Administrator. A board of trustees has been appointed as the Plan’s Trustee.

Eligibility

Employees of the Company are generally eligible to participate in the Plan after one year of service providing they worked at least 1,000 hours during such Plan year. Participants who do not have at least 1,000 hours of service during such Plan year or are not employed on the last working day of a Plan year are generally not eligible for an allocation of Company contributions for such year.

Contributions

The Company is obligated to make contributions in cash to the Plan which, when aggregated with the Plan’s dividends and interest earnings, equal the amount necessary to enable the Plan to make its regularly scheduled payments of principal and interest due on its term loan. Additional contributions are made at the discretion of the Company’s Board of Directors. Employee contributions are not permitted.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account, payable in five annual installments. The Plan will automatically cash-out any employee who has terminated service with a vested account balance equal to or less than \$1,000.

Administrative Expenses

As provided in the Plan agreement, administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Company. The Company has historically paid the operating expenses for the Plan.

Voting Rights

Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to his or her account and is notified by the Trustee prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. The Trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated share for which instructions have not been given by a participant. The Trustee is required, however, to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interest of Plan participants and beneficiaries.

Participant Accounts

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each Plan year with an allocation of shares of the Company's common stock released by the Trustee from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the Plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation.

Vesting

If a participant's employment with the Company ends for any reason other than retirement, permanent disability, or death, the participant's account shall be vested in an amount equal to the following percentages. A participant with 2 years but less than 3 years of service is 20% vested, 3 years but less than 4 years is 40% vested, 4 years but less than 5 years is 60% vested, 5 years but less than 6 years is 80% vested, and 6 years and thereafter is fully vested. Effective January 1, 2019, participants are automatically 100% vested in their account balances if they terminate on or after their normal retirement date, or on the account of death or disability.

Put Option

Under federal income tax regulations, the employer stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the current appraised value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

Diversification

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of the investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a 6-year period. A participant may diversify up to 25% of the number of post-1986 shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. During the last 90-day period occurring during the election period, the number of shares allocated to a participant's corporation stock account subject to diversification will be 50%. Participants who elect to diversify receive a cash distribution, unless eligible for floor price protection, in which case, shares are distributed. The election to diversify is made subsequent to year-end based upon the shares of employer stock in the participant's account at year-end.

Forfeited Accounts

Employees who leave the Company before becoming fully vested in their account, forfeit the value of their non-vested account. Forfeitures are allocated annually first to prior participants who separated from the Plan and are subsequently re-employed, then any remaining forfeitures are allocated to the remaining participants. In 2024, forfeitures of \$7,397 were allocated to participants' accounts.

Note B - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Allocations

The financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to (a) the accounts of employees with rights in allocated stock (Allocated) and (b) stock not yet allocated to employees (Unallocated), including shares that are committed to be released. Shares are released from collateral and become allocated generally in the period in which debt service is actually paid. As of December 31, 2024 all shares have been allocated to participants.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. See Note F for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Note C - Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated September 24, 2013 that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of IRC; therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan's Trustee and Administrative Committee believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken a significant uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note D - Plan Termination

The Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to Plan provisions. Upon termination of the Plan, the Plan Administrator directs the Trustee to pay all liabilities and expenses of the trust fund. Subsequently, the interest of each participant in the trust fund will be distributed to such participant or his or her beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan and the IRC.

Note F - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds

Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common Stock

The fair value of the Company common stock held by the Plan is valued at fair value based upon an independent appraisal. This appraisal was based upon an income-based approach. The independent appraiser determined that the market approach could not be relied upon as an approach to value the Company. The appraiser took into account unobservable inputs including: historical and projected cash flow, net income, return on assets, return on equity, market comparables and estimated fair value of Company assets and liabilities. Plan management has concluded that a market participant would also recognize a discount for lack of marketability.

The valuation process involves Plan management's selection of an independent appraiser. Plan management accumulates the data for the appraiser from audited financial statements of the Company. The appraiser prepares a preliminary report which Plan management, along with the ESOP Trustee, reviews in detail, discusses, and approves.

Those policies and procedures are reassessed at least annually to determine if the current valuation techniques are still appropriate. At that time, the unobservable inputs used in fair market value measurements are evaluated and adjusted, as necessary, based on current market conditions and other third-party information.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
