Report on the Financial Statements

Opinion

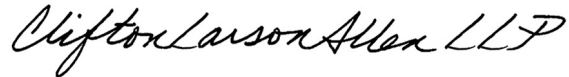

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Steinhafels Holding Company, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

Steinhafels Holding Company, Inc. (Company) established the Plan effective July 4, 2020. The Plan is a defined contribution plan intended to constitute an employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan covers all employees of the Company who have completed the eligibility requirements including the completion of one year of service and attainment of age 18. An eligible employee will begin participation on the first day of each Plan year or the first day of the seventh month of the Plan year following the completion of the eligibility requirements. The Plan excludes any employee who is included in a unit of employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement, leased employees, nonresident aliens, any individual determined by a court of law or administrative agency to be a common-law employee and certain individuals outlined in the Plan document. The Plan is designed to invest primarily in securities issued by the Company and is authorized to borrow money for such investments. It is subject to the provisions of ERISA, as amended. The Plan is administered by the trustee and management.

The Plan purchased Company common stock by issuing a note to the Company and holds the stock in a trust established under the Plan (see Note 5). As the Plan makes debt payments, an appropriate percentage of stock will be allocated to eligible employees' accounts in accordance with applicable regulations under the IRC.

The borrowing is collateralized by the unallocated shares of common stock and is guaranteed by the Company. The lender has no rights against shares once they are allocated to participants in accordance with the terms of the ESOP. Accordingly, the financial statements of the Plan present the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to:

- (a) the accounts of employees with vested rights in allocated stock (Allocated) and
- (b) common stock not yet allocated to employees (Unallocated).

Contributions

Each year, the Company will make a contribution to the Plan equal to the amount required to be paid pursuant to the acquisition loan (see Note 5) in addition to any amount as determined annually by the Company's Board of Directors. Contributions may be in the form of shares of common stock or cash. Contributions for each year are never less than the amount required to enable the Plan to discharge its current obligations, without regard to whether some or all of such contribution may fail to qualify for an income tax deduction by the Company. In order to receive an allocation of Company contributions, a participant must complete 1,000 hours of service and be employed on the last day of the Plan year unless termination is due to death, disability or retirement. Contribution allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation, as defined. Contributions by Plan participants are not permitted by the Plan. Contributions are subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each plan year with an allocation of contributions and/or shares of the Company's common stock released by the Trustee from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Plan earnings or losses are allocated based on each participant's share of the investment at the beginning of the year, less distributions and withdrawals during the year.

Vesting

Vesting of participant's accounts is based on years of credited service with the Company. A participant's account becomes fully vested after six years of credited service with the Company, under a graded vesting schedule. A participant is fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death, or permanent disability.

Diversification

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation service in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25% of the number of post-1986 shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50%. Participants who elect to diversify receive a cash distribution.

Payment of Benefits

Participants are entitled to receive a distribution from their account upon termination of employment. The amount to be distributed is based upon the account valuation date immediately preceding the distribution. Distribution of the participant's ESOP account balance becomes distributable and will commence no later than the close of the Plan year following the Plan year in the event of termination due to reaching normal retirement age, death or disability. Distribution of the participant's ESOP account balance becomes distributable and will commence no later than the close of the sixth Plan year following the Plan year in the event of normal termination of employment. Any distribution from the participant's ESOP account will normally be paid in cash and will be paid in equal installments over a period of up to five years (with special rules if the ESOP account exceeds \$1,380,000). Distribution of the participant's Other account balance may be in a lump sum payment or installment payments (subject to certain Plan provisions). Upon termination of service, a participant will receive a lump sum distribution of cash related to their account balance without the participants consent if their balance does not exceed \$7,000 and no election is made.

Voting Rights

Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to his or her account and is notified by the trustee prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. These rights are limited to the approval or disapproval of any corporate merger or consolidation, recapitalization, reclassification, liquidation, dissolution, or sale of substantially all of the assets. The trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated share for which instructions have not been given by a participant. The trustee is required, however, to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interest of Plan participants and beneficiaries.

Put Option

Under federal income tax regulations, the Company stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market or is subject to trading limitations includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The Company may pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

Forfeited Accounts

Plan forfeitures are allocated to each participant's account based upon the relation of the participant's compensation to total compensation for the Plan year. There were 13,306 shares of forfeitures of terminated nonvested account balances allocated to remaining participants at June 27, 2025. There were no balances in forfeited nonvested accounts at June 27, 2025 and June 28, 2024.

Account Segregation Upon Termination of Employment

A terminated participant has no right to keep their account invested in Company Stock. Effective as of the end of the Plan Year in which termination occurred, to the extent that cash is available in the Plan, the Company stock in their account shall be transferred from their Company stock account to the Company stock accounts of nonterminated participants (in proportion to the balances of those accounts) in exchange for cash of equal value in non-Company stock accounts, so that the account of the terminated participant consists entirely of a non-Company stock account. If the non-Company stock accounts of the nonterminated participants have insufficient assets of equal value to be exchanged for all the Company stock in the Company stock account of the terminated participant, then the Company may contribute funds to cover the shortfall. If a shortfall remains, the available cash shall first be transferred (in exchange for Company stock) to the group of terminated participants who, by year, have the "earliest expected distribution year" among all terminated participants and who have any Company stock remaining in their respective Company stock accounts. The "earliest expected distribution year" is determined by examining all terminated participants with Company stock account balances and projecting which such participants, classified by year, are scheduled to receive the soonest distributions. The cash shall be exchanged on a pro rata basis based on Company stock account balance. If any cash remains, it shall be used to exchange the Company stock of the terminated participants in the next "earliest expected distribution year," and so on.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Allocations

The financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to (a) the accounts of employees with rights in allocated stock (allocated) and (b) stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated), including shares that are committed to be released. Shares are released from collateral and become allocated generally in the period in which debt service is actually paid.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The shares of Company common stock are valued at estimated fair value. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Realized gains and losses from security transactions are reported on the average cost method. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

As provided in the Plan document, administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Company.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through January 14, 2026, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 INVESTMENTS

The Plan's initial investment in Company securities consisted of 2,800,000 shares of the outstanding common stock of Steinhafels Holding Company, Inc. The shares were acquired on April 9, 2021 for \$1.43 per share, which was the estimated fair market value, as determined by independent appraisal, at that time. The estimated fair market value, as determined by independent appraisal as of June 27, 2025 and June 28, 2024 was \$5.18 and \$7.96 per share, respectively.

A total of 93,333.3346 shares were released from unallocated to allocated during the period ended June 27, 2025 in accordance with the debt payments as structured in the ESOP loan amortization schedule.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS (CONTINUED)

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There were no changes in the valuation methodologies at June 27, 2025 and June 28, 2024.

The fair value of the Steinhafels Holding Company, Inc. common stock held by the Plan is valued at fair value based on an independent third-party appraisal. This appraisal is based upon a combination of the market and income valuation techniques consistent with prior years. The appraiser took into account historical and projected cash flow and net income, return on assets, return on equity, market comparables, and estimated fair value of Company assets and liabilities. Plan management has concluded that a market participant would also recognize a discount for lack of marketability.

NOTE 5 NOTE PAYABLE

On April 9, 2021, the Plan entered into a \$4,000,000 term loan agreement with the Company. The Plan purchased the Company's common stock by issuing a note. Unallocated shares are collateral for the loan. Shares are released from collateral and allocated to participants as payments of principal and interest are made.

The Plan has a note payable related to the purchase of Company stock on June 27, 2025 and June 28, 2024 as follows:

NOTE 6 PLAN TERMINATION

The Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to Plan provisions. Upon such termination of the Plan, the interest of each participant in the trust fund will be distributed to such participant or his or her beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the IRC. Upon termination of the Plan, the Employee Stock Ownership Committee shall direct the Trustee to pay all liabilities and expenses of the trust fund and to sell shares of financed stock held in the loan suspense account to the extent it determines such a sale to be necessary in order to repay the loan. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 7 PLAN TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Employer by a letter dated May 8, 2025, that the Plan is qualified and the trust established under the Plan is tax exempt under the appropriate sections of the IRC. The Plan administrators believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan investments consist primarily of the Company's common stock, which is exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows and/or other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in the common stock and to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumption process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan's assets, which consist primarily of Company common shares, are held by the trustee of the Plan. The Company holds a note receivable from the trustee of the Plan, which note is secured by a pledge of shares in the Company. These shares are related party and party-in-interest transactions. As the Company is the Plan Sponsor, transaction involving Company common stock qualify as party-in-interest transactions. All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

The Plan is administered by Steinhafels Holding Company, Inc and certain administrative functions are outsourced to a third-party administrator. A certain officer of the Company is Plan administrator. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.
