We were engaged to perform audits of the financial statements of National Council of State Boards of Nursing, Inc. 403(b) TDA Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2025 and 2024, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended June 30, 2025, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of June 30, 2025 and 2024, and for the year ended June 30, 2025, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Disclaimer of Opinion

We do not express an opinion on the accompanying financial statements of the Plan. Because of the significance of the matters described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, we have not been able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on the financial statements.

Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion

The Plan has not maintained sufficient accounting records and supporting documents relating to certain annuity contracts and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees prior to January 1, 2009. Accordingly, we were unable to apply auditing procedures sufficient to determine the extent to which the accompanying financial statements may have been affected by these conditions.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our responsibility is to conduct an audit of the Plan's financial statements in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and to issue an auditor's report. However, because of the matters described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, we were not able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on these financial statements.

We are required to be independent of the Plan, and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits.

Other Matter—Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of June 30, 2025, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. Because of the significance of the matters described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, it is inappropriate to and we do not express an opinion on the supplemental schedule referred to above.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Plan Description

The following description of National Council of State Boards of Nursing, Inc. 403(b) TDA Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of National Council of State Boards of Nursing, Inc. (the Council). The employees are eligible to participate on commencement of their employment. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan is administered by the Finance Committee comprised of individuals appointed by the Council's Board of Directors. The Finance Committee has overall responsibility for the operation and administration of the Plan. The Finance Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Council's Board of Directors.

The Plan's investments are held by Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America (TIAA) and College Retirement Equities Fund (CREF). TIAA and CREF serve as issuer and recordkeeper of the Plan.

Contributions: Eligible employees may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined by the Plan, through payroll deductions, subject to regulatory limits established by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollovers). Contributions are subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participants' compensation, account balances, or specific transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Notes receivable from participants: Participants may borrow from their fund accounts subject to certain maximum and minimum amounts prescribed in the Plan and in the IRC. Notes receivable bear interest at a market rate and are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Loan terms may range from one to five years unless the loan qualifies as a home loan. Principal and interest payments are made through ACH agreement between the participants and TIAA.

Investment options: Participants direct their account balance into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

Payment of benefits: Distributions are payable upon retirement, death, disability, or termination of employment in an amount equal to the vested balance of a participant's account. Distributions may be made in a lump-sum payment, in installment payments or under an annuity contract. Participants may also request hardship or in-service withdrawals.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition: Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Finance Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment issuer. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions: Contributions from the participants are recorded in the year in which the participant contributions are withheld.

Notes receivable from participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of June 30, 2025 and 2024. Notes receivable from participants have been classified as investment assets for Form 5500 reporting purposes and, accordingly, have been included as an investment in the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year).

Payment of benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Council and are excluded from these financial statements. Administrative expenses include certain recordkeeping fees paid by the Plan. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent events: The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through January 29, 2026, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Accounting Standards Codification 820 are discussed below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of an input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Variable annuities: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of investments and cash held by the account at year-end. The NAV is valued daily and published on NASDAQ. The funds are not traded on this exchange. The value of the unit holder's investment rises and falls with the returns on the underlying assets in the account.

Units of pooled separate account: Valued at the NAV of the units of the pooled separate account. The TIAA Real Estate Account is a pooled separate account for which daily unit values are published on NASDAQ. The fund is not traded on this exchange. The value of the unit holder's investment rises and falls with the return on the underlying assets in the account.

Changes in fair value of Level 3 assets: To assess the appropriate classification of investments within the fair value hierarchy, the availability of market data is monitored. Changes in economic conditions or valuation techniques may require the transfer of investments from one fair value level to another.

Plan management evaluates the significance of transfers between levels based upon the nature of the investment and size of the transfer relative to the net assets available for benefits. For the years ended June 30, 2025 and 2024, there were no transfers in and out of Level 3.

Note 5. Investment Contracts with Insurance Company

The Plan has traditional, fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contracts with TIAA. TIAA maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with contributions and earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Each premium allocated to the annuity contracts buys a guaranteed minimum amount of lifetime income based on the rate schedule in effect at the time the premium is credited. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer. This rate will never be lower than 3%. Such interest rates are reviewed on an annual basis for resetting.

For investment contracts that are fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. As described in Note 2, these contracts are included in the financial statements at contract value, as reported to the Plan by TIAA. Contract value represents contributions made under the contracts, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. As of June 30, 2025 and 2024, the Plan held fully benefit-responsive contracts of \$3,003,003 and \$3,596,031, respectively.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (a) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion or equity wash provisions, (c) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestiture or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan or (d) failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with plan participants are probable of occurring. There are no reserves against the contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contracts do not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement before the scheduled maturity date.

Funds under the guaranteed annuity contracts that have been allocated and applied to purchase individual annuity contracts (i.e. TIAA is obligated to pay the related benefits) are excluded from Plan assets.

Note 6. Plan Loans

Effective June 11, 2020, TIAA ceased issuance of any new plan loans. Existing plan loans will continue to be in effect. Previously, participants could borrow from TIAA using a portion of their plan account as security for the loan. The minimum loan was \$1,000 and may be up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 45% of the combined TIAA and CREF accumulation attributable to participation under the Plan, 90% of their TIAA Real Estate Account accumulation attributable to participation under this Plan or 90% of their TIAA Traditional Annuity accumulation attributable to participation under this Plan. The loans bear interest at rates that range from 4.01% to 5.33% at June 30, 2025, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by TIAA and CREF. Principal and interest is paid ratably through quarterly ACH transfers by the participant to TIAA and CREF. The Plan Administrator has concluded that these loans are not plan assets and that such arrangements are exempt transactions.

Note 6. Plan Loans (Continued)

The balance of plan loans as of June 30, 2025 and 2024 is \$2,902 and \$14,152, respectively. Under the borrowing terms, plan assets of 110% of the loan amount serve as collateral to these loans.

In the event of default, such loans are reportable to plan participants as taxable income but remain outstanding and continue to accrue interest until repaid by the Plan participant or the participant becomes eligible to receive a distribution under the terms of the Plan. During the years ended June 30, 2025 and 2024, there were no loans that went into default. As of June 30, 2025 and 2024, loans in default amounted to \$1,919 and \$1,823, respectively. Such amounts include principal and accumulated interest.

Note 7. Related-Party and Parties in Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by TIAA and CREF, the investment issuer, as defined by the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Certain employees of the Council are performing services for the Plan and are not compensated by the Plan.

Note 8. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Council has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

Note 9. Income Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a simplified ERISA 403(b) volume submitter plan sponsored by TIAA. The simplified ERISA 403(b) volume submitter plan has received an advisory letter from the IRS as to the simplified ERISA 403(b) volume submitter plan's qualified status. The simplified ERISA 403(b) volume submitter plan advisory letter has been relied upon by this Plan. The Plan has been amended since the simplified ERISA 403(b) volume submitter plan received the advisory letter. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Code.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 10. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near-term and such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

100% of the Plan's investments are held in investments with TIAA and CREF at June 30, 2025 and 2024. As such, this is considered to be a concentration of credit risk.
