Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Imerys USA 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Imerys USA 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Imerys USA, Inc. (Imerys) and companies affiliated with Imerys that adopt the Plan (collectively, the Company). The Plan covers substantially all employees of the Company, except for leased employees, individuals covered under a collective bargaining agreement, employees classified as expatriates, or persons initially classified by the Company as independent contractors or nonemployees for the purposes of withholding and payment of employment taxes, even if such a person is later determined to be a common law employee. All eligible employees of the Company are immediately eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Plan Administration

Charles Schwab Trust Bank is the trustee of the Plan and Schwab Retirement Plan Services Company is the recordkeeper for the Plan. The Plan is administered by a retirement committee appointed by the Board of Directors (the Board) of the Company.

Contributions

Eligible employees may elect to contribute up to 75% of their eligible compensation, subject to Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants may designate all or a portion of their salary deferral as Roth elective deferrals. Catch-up contributions are permitted. Employees will automatically be enrolled in the Plan and will be treated as having elected to make a 4% contribution to the Plan if an affirmative election is not made within the time prescribed by the Plan. The participant may elect to override the automatic contribution and elect to change their deferral percentage at any time. A participant's overriding elections expires at the end of each Plan year. The automatic deferral percentage will increase every year at 1% to a maximum of 10%.

The Company has elected to make a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of a participant's pretax and Roth contributions up to the first 4% of the participant's compensation and 50% of a participant's pretax and Roth contributions up to the next 2% of his or her compensation, subject to IRC limitations. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company elected to make an additional true-up contribution to the Plan. For the 2024 Plan year, the Plan also made a non-safe harbor nonelective contribution equal to 2% of compensation of all benefiting participants. This contribution was allocated pro rata based upon the compensation for the allocation period of all benefiting participants. Participants are required to be employed at the end of the year to receive the non-safe harbor nonelective contribution.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's contribution and allocations of Plan earnings, and charged with withdrawals and an allocation of Plan losses and administrative

expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and Company contributions.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their vested account amounts not-to-exceed the lesser of 50% of the participant's balance or \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in the participant's account during the prior 12-month period. The minimum loan amount is \$1,000. Loans are repayable through payroll deductions over the term of the loan, generally periods of up to five years.

An exception was made for Imerys Talc Vermont, Inc. employees, allowing them to roll their loan balances into the Plan as they were honored at their original maturity dates. The interest rate is determined by the Plan administrator based on the prevailing market conditions and is fixed over the life of the loan. A participant may have only one loan outstanding at any given time.

Investment Options

Contributions to the Plan are invested pursuant to the investment options elected by the Plan participants. Investment option elections can be changed by the participants at any time. Investment options available generally include mutual funds, a common collective trust (CCT) fund and a self-directed brokerage account, some of which are managed by affiliates of the trustee.

Payment of Benefits

A participant becomes eligible for benefits upon termination of employment, death or disability. In-service withdrawals are permitted after age 59½ or due to financial hardship. Benefits are payable in a lump-sum distribution.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company. If the Company elects not to pay such expenses, then these shall be paid by the Plan, in accordance with Plan provisions. A majority of Plan expenses were paid by the Company during the 2024 Plan year.

Net Transfers from Affiliated Plans

Net transfers from affiliated plans represent the transfer of participant balances from this Plan to an affiliated plan of the Company, or vice versa, due to the participant no longer meeting the Plan's eligibility requirements as the participant's employment status has changed (e.g., from union to nonunion). In addition, in 2023 the Company divested Imerys Americarb, Inc. As such, the balances of the plan participants were transferred to plans sponsored by these respective entities in mid 2024, which totaled approximately \$11,600,000.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options, including mutual funds, a CCT and a self-directed brokerage account. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. The fair value of a financial instrument is the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

The valuation methodologies are as follows:

Mutual funds, money market funds and exchange-traded funds (held in the self-directed brokerage account): Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year-end based on quoted market prices.

CCT fund: Valued at the NAV of units held by the Plan at year-end. The NAV of units in the CCT fund is determined by the custodian of the fund based on the fair market value of the underlying assets. There are no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments relative to the CCT fund. The CCT fund transacts on a daily basis.

Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis.

Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Management fees and operating expenses of the Plan for investments in the mutual funds are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities inputs (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

- Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

5. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan operates under a Schwab-sponsored nonstandardized prototype plan. The underlying prototype plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated September 21, 2020, stating that the form of the prototype plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC and, therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualified status. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6. EXEMPT PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTION

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, there were certain Plan investments held by the Plan that were managed by affiliates of the trustee. Therefore, transactions in these investments qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services and recordkeeping were paid by the Plan and reflected as administrative expenses for the year ended December 31, 2024.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, any participants will remain 100% vested in their accounts.
