We have performed audit of the financial statements of Trilon Group Retirement Savings Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). Trilon Group Retirement Savings Plan Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 – Description of Plan

Trilon Group Retirement Savings Plan (formerly Waggoner Engineering, Inc. 401(k) Plan & Trust) was restated effective January 1, 2024. As part of the restatement, the plan was renamed the Trilon Group Retirement Savings Plan. The following description of the Trilon Group Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement, as amended, for a more complete description of the Plan provisions.

General – The Plan is a 401(k) salary deferral and profit sharing plan covering substantially all employees of Trilon Group Holdings, LLC (the Company), and is subject to provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Company is the Plan’s sponsor and serves as plan administrator.

The Plan changed trustees from Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity) to Principal Trust Company (Principal) effective January 1, 2024. In addition, various companies were acquired by the Company during 2024, and related plan assets and participant accounts transferred into the Plan during 2024. See Plan mergers in Note 1.

Fidelity certified the information as of and for the year ended December 31, 2023. Principal certified the information as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024. See Note 7.

Eligibility – Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan immediately. Participants must be employed as of the last day of the Plan year to be eligible to receive any profit sharing contributions.

Contributions

Participant contributions – Each year, participants may contribute between 1% and 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also elect to make Roth contributions utilizing after-tax contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated fund until elected otherwise by the participant. Unless elected otherwise by the participant, deferrals are automatically increased annually by 1%, up to a maximum auto-deferral of 10%.

Employer match and profit sharing contributions – The Company may elect to make discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions to the Plan. The Company matches 50% of employee contributions, up to 6% of eligible compensation deferred to the Plan. In addition, the Company made a discretionary matching contribution equal to 1% of eligible compensation to employees who deferred at least 6% of compensation and were active or on leave of absence on the last day of the plan year. Profit sharing contributions are allocated to participants in the same proportion as a participant’s compensation bears to the total of all participants’ compensation. There were no profit sharing contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Contributions are subject to regulatory limitations.

Trilon Group Retirement Savings Plan Notes to Financial Statements

Participant accounts – Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company’s profit sharing contributions, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account. Participants direct the investment of their account into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Vesting – Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company’s contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. Participants vest in the Company’s contributions based on the following schedule:

Notes receivable from participants – Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are issued by the Plan and secured by the balance in the participant’s account. All loans must be repaid within a period of five years, unless the loan is used to purchase a principal residence, in which case, the loan must be repaid within a reasonable period of time. Under the terms of the plan agreement, plan loans will bear a reasonable rate of interest determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. As of December 31, 2024, the rates of interest on outstanding loans ranged from 3.25% to 10.25%, with various maturities through December 2052.

Payment of benefits – On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant (or their beneficiary) may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. The Plan allows for automatic distribution of participant vested account balances that do not exceed \$7,000.

Forfeitures – Forfeitures are the nonvested portion of a participant’s account that are lost upon termination of employment. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and will first be used to pay the Plan’s administrative expenses, with any remaining amount used to reduce future Company contributions.

Plan mergers – As noted in Note 1 and related to various acquisitions by the Company, during the year ended December 31, 2024, the following plans were merged into the Plan: Alta Planning + Design, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, The Mannik & Smith Group, Inc. 401(k) Plan, Ramey Kemp & Associates, Inc. 401(k) Plan, DRMP, Inc. 401(k) & Profit Sharing Plan, Fehr-Graham & Associates 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, CPH Consulting, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, Wilson Engineers 401(k) Plan, ESI Consultants, Ltd. Retirement Savings Plan, Sigma Consulting Group, Inc. 401K, Plan, Gonzalez Companies, LLC 401(k) Plan, ELEVEN18 Architecture 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, and Manchac Consulting Group, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan. Assets of \$201,853,311 were transferred into the Plan and are included on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Trilon Group Retirement Savings Plan Notes to Financial Statements

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting – The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP), using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the use of estimates and assumptions that may affect certain amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation – The investments are reported at fair value and contract value. The Plan's trustees, Principal and Fidelity, certify the contract value of the guaranteed investment contract and the fair value of all other investments. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (the "exit price") in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Contract value is the relevant measurement for assets invested in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Income recognition – Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. The net appreciation in fair value of investments consists of both the realized gains and losses and unrealized appreciation and depreciation of those investments.

Contributions – Contributions from participants and corresponding matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes receivable from participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions upon the occurrence of a distributable event, based on the terms of the plan agreement.

Payment of benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses – Administrative expenses paid by the Plan may include notes receivable and distribution fees charged to participants' accounts and administrative Plan fees. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Trilon Group Retirement Savings Plan Notes to Financial Statements

Subsequent events – Subsequent events are events or transactions that occur after the statement of net assets available for benefits date but before the financial statements are available to be issued. The Plan recognizes in the financial statements the effects of all subsequent events that provide additional evidence about conditions that existed at the date of the statement of net assets available for benefits, including the estimates inherent in the process of preparing the financial statements. The Plan's financial statements do not recognize subsequent events that provide evidence about conditions that did not exist at the date of the statement of net assets available for benefits but arose after the statement of net assets available for benefits date and before the financial statements are available to be issued. Note 11 provides disclosure of certain subsequent events that did not result in recognition in the financial statements.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation techniques used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the techniques used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered investment companies (mutual funds and money market fund) – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission.

Self-directed brokerage accounts – Accounts primarily consist of mutual funds and common stocks that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

Pooled separate accounts – Units held in pooled separate accounts (PSAs) are valued using the NAV practical expedient of the PSA as reported by the account managers. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the PSA, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding.

Common/collective trusts – Units held in collective trusts (CTs) are valued using the net asset value practical expedient (NAV practical expedient) of the CTs as reported by the CT managers. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the CTs, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The NAV practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the NAV practical expedient.

The valuation methods used by the Plan may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 4 – Capital Preservation Fund

The objective of the Principal Preservation Fund (the Fund) is to provide principal preservation, maintain a stable interest rate, and provide daily liquidity at contract value for participant withdrawals and transfers in accordance with provisions of the Plan. The Fund is a fully benefit-responsive investment contract issued by Principal Life Insurance Company. The Plan values the investment at contract value. The Fund is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

The Fund is backed by a group annuity contract issued by Principal Life Insurance Company. Contributions are maintained in the issuer's general account, and the issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal amount and credited interest. The crediting rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the contract issuer, but it may not be less than zero. Interest rates are typically reviewed on a quarterly, semi-annual or annual basis for resetting.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include the following: (1) An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

Note 5 – Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

In accordance with guidance on accounting for uncertainty in income taxes, the Plan administrator has evaluated the Plan's tax positions and does not believe the Plan has any uncertain tax positions that require disclosure or adjustment to the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 6 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market volatility, and credit risks. It is reasonably possible, given the level of risk associated with investment securities, that changes in the values of the investments in the near term could materially affect a participant's account balance and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 7 – Certified Investment Information

The following information related to investments was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Principal and Fidelity, qualified institutions:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, other income, dividends and interest, and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investments reflected on the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

Note 8 – Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by an affiliate of Principal and therefore, transactions with this entity qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

Note 9 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to terminate the Plan and discontinue its contributions at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, amounts allocated to a participant's account become fully vested.

Note 10 – Reconciliation to Form 5500

The Form 5500 has certain items that differ from amounts shown on the accompanying financial statements. These differences relate to classification only and have no effect upon net assets available for benefits.

Note 11 – Subsequent Events

Effective January 1, 2025, the following plans were merged into the Plan: Rinker Design 401(k) Plan, Horrocks Engineers 401(k) Plan, Churchill Consulting Engineers, P.C. 401(k) Plan, and HMB Professional Engineers Profit Sharing Plan. As a result, assets totaling approximately \$131,924,000 were transferred into the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2025, employees of Fuss & O'Neill Profit Sharing and Employee Savings Plan became eligible to participate in the Plan.
