1. **Description of the Plan**

The following is a brief description of the Manhattan Youth Recreation and Resources, Inc. 403(b) Plan (the “Plan”) and is provided for general information purposes only. The Plan was established effective January 1, 2023. Participants should refer to the Plan document, related adoption agreement and individual statements provided for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution pension plan under section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code and covers all eligible employees of Manhattan Youth Recreation and Resources, Inc., (the “Organization”). The Plan provides deferred compensation benefits and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Plan investments are administered and held in a trust by the Plan’s investment custodians, the Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company and the Principal Life Insurance Company (“Principle”) (collectively, the “Investment Custodians”), who also serve as the recordkeeper of the Plan. The Investment Custodians are qualified institutions in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s (“DOL”) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The Plan administrator is responsible for overseeing and ensuring compliance with the Plan document. The Investment Custodians and the Plan administrator are appointed by the Organization.

Eligibility

The Plan is available to all employees of the Organization upon hire who are at least 21 years of age, except: (1) Employees who work less than 20 hours per week, and (2) Nonresident aliens. Participants enter the Plan the first day of each month.

Participant Contributions

The Plan participants may make voluntary contributions on a before-tax or Roth basis up to 100% of their eligible compensation, not to exceed the maximum contributions allowed under the Internal Revenue Service Code (“IRC”), as discussed below. Compensation per the Plan document means wages, tips, and other compensation entered on Box 1 of Form W-2.

The maximum amount of compensation that may be considered for deferral purposes by participants and employer contributions is \$345,000 for 2024. Total participant contributions are limited to a maximum of \$23,000 for 2024. Additionally, individuals who are at least 50 years of age can make a “catch-up” contribution not to exceed \$7,500 for 2024. The maximum annual addition for 2024 that may be contributed or allocated to a participant’s account under the Plan shall not exceed the lesser of 100% of a participant’s compensation or \$69,000 for employees under age of 50 and \$76,500 for employees over the age of 50.

1. Description of the Plan

Employer Contributions

The Organization, in its sole discretion, may contribute and allocate to each eligible participant's account, a matching percentage or flat dollar amount of the participant's elective deferrals. Matching contributions, if any, shall be determined as of the end of the Plan year. No matching contribution were made for the 2024 Plan year.

The Organization also has the discretion of making an additional employer non-elective contribution. Only participants who worked more than 1,000 hours during the Plan year and who worked on the last day of the Plan year are entitled to receive employer non-elective contributions, unless they are not employed on the last day of the Plan year due to normal retirement, disability, or death. The employer non-elective contribution is allocated to eligible participants based on the participants' classification. There shall be a separate classification for each participant. The Company elected to make an employer non-elective contribution of \$88,494 in 2024. Of this amount, \$9,332 was paid by Manhattan Youth, and \$79,162 was paid from the forfeiture account.

Rollover Contributions

A Plan participant may make a transfer to the Plan of a benefit from a qualified retirement plan of another employer, referred to as a rollover, with certain restrictions.

Investments

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, rollover contributions, and earnings thereon. Participants vest in the discretionary employer non-elective and matching contributions as follows:

1. Description of the Plan

Participant Accounts

The Plan administrator establishes and maintains a separate account for each participant, which is credited for rollover and voluntary contributions the participants make, employer contributions, and Plan earnings and expenses. Income earned and net appreciation or depreciation on Plan investments, for a given investment, are allocated in proportion to the participant's account balances in that fund. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan does not allow participants to take loans from the Plan.

Forfeitures

Upon termination of employment, participants forfeit their non-vested balances. These accounts may be used to reduce future employer contributions, reinstatement of forfeited balance for rehired employees or to pay the administrative expenses of the Plan. At December 31, 2024, forfeited non-vested account balances were \$94,496. During 2024, \$16,141 of forfeited amounts were used to pay administrative expenses.

Retirement

The Plan does not allow early retirement. The normal retirement age is defined as the later of when the participant reaches the age of 65 or 5 years of service. At the normal retirement date, the participant is entitled to 100% of their account balance. The participant can elect late retirement after the age of 65; however, benefits must begin by age 73. A participant, who becomes disabled, as defined in the Plan document, is eligible for a disability retirement.

Distribution of Benefits

An active participant, or a designated beneficiary, is entitled to withdraw the entire vested amount (or in some cases, a portion thereof) in the event of normal retirement, death, disability, termination of employment, termination of the Plan, attainment of age 59 ½ or under hardship circumstances, as defined in the Plan document. Distributions are made in the form of a lump sum distribution. Terminated employees whose vested balance exceeds \$5,000 at termination may elect to leave their account balances in the Plan. Participants must begin receiving Required Minimum Distributions, under IRS guidelines, upon reaching the age of 73.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses may be paid out of the Plan or by the Company. Administrative expenses that are to be paid from the Plan are first paid from forfeitures, if any, and any remaining amounts are paid from the Plan's trust funds and allocated to all participants on a pro rata basis. The Organization incurred certain administrative expenses relating to the Plan without charge to the Plan during 2024.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“US GAAP”).

Use of Estimates and Assumptions

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with US GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value except investment contracts with insurance companies which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 5 for a discussion of fair value measurements. Investment contracts with insurance companies are valued at contract value which represents the amount of contributions deposited, plus interest credited daily as determined by the contract, less any participant withdrawals and administrative expenses (see Note 6). Purchases and sales of securities are reflected on a trade date basis. Interest and dividend income are reflected when received. The Plan presents, in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits, the net appreciation (depreciation) of the fair value of its investments, which includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants or beneficiaries are recorded when paid.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities are exposed to various risks including but not limited to, interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant’s account balances, and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Income Tax Status

The Company has adopted a non-standardized pre-approved plan document that received an Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) opinion letter dated March 31, 2017, in which the IRS stated that this non-standardized pre-approved plan was qualified under the appropriate sections of the IRC. An employer adopting this non-standardized pre-approved plan is considered to have a Plan qualified under Section 403(b) of the IRC. Once qualified, the plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualified status. The Plan administrator believes that currently the Plan is qualified. No provision for income taxes has been included in the financial statements since the Plan has no unrelated business income tax.

US GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS or the DOL. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, and 2024 there are no uncertain positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by the IRS or the DOL, however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Subsequent Events

Management evaluates events occurring subsequent to the date of the financial statements in determining the accounting for and disclosure of transactions and events that affect the financial statements. Subsequent events have been evaluated through January 30, 2026, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

The Plan was amended effective August 31, 2025, to remove the exclusion of employees who normally work less than 80 hours per month as determined by Code section 41(a)(3)(C) in a 12 month computation period from all contribution Sources and make it eligible for all employees.

Effective November 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to exclude bonuses and discretionary bonuses from the definition of eligible compensation for Safe Harbor 403(b), employer non-elective, and employer matching contributions.

3. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of a Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

4. Investments

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan's investments appreciated (including gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year) in value by \$94,443.

5. Fair Value Measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board's ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.
- If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

5. Fair Value Measurements

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024:

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Changes in Fair Value Levels

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another. 6. Investment Contract with an Insurance Company

The Plan has a guaranteed investment contract ("GIC") that is a group annuity contract backed by the assets of the general account of Principal whose balance was \$1,843,741 as of December 31, 2024. This GIC, the Insurance Company General Principal Guaranteed Option, is considered a fully benefit responsive investment contract and is measured, presented, and disclosed at contract value within the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits. Participant transactions are executed using contract value without adjustment. The GIC issuer guarantees to pay a specified interest rate which is reset semi-annually on June 1 and December 1 of each year. The GIC's guaranteed crediting rate as of December 31, 2024, and 2023 was 4.85% and 6.05%, respectively. This contract does have surrender charges if it is terminated by the contract holder, or a plan terminates its interest in such contract within certain time periods. If the contract holder is considering terminating the contract or a plan is considering terminating its interest in such contract in the near future, contract value less surrender charges is used to determine the fair value.

This GIC is reported at contract value as it meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria. Contract value is calculated as contributions, plus earnings, less withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participant transactions are executed at contract value less surrender charges, if applicable, which is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. The Plan's ability to meet its contractual obligations to settle amounts due is dependent on the issuer, which could be impacted by economic and regulatory changes. Currently, there is no probability of the issuer not being able to fulfill its contractual obligations at contract value.

7. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

The group annuity contract and pooled separate accounts are with Principal who is one of the Plan's investment custodians. Administrative expenses are paid to the Investment Custodians who act as the recordkeeper of the Plan. These transactions with the Investment Custodians qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The above transactions are not, however, considered prohibited transactions under CFR 408 (b) of the ERISA regulations.
