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## INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Plan Administrator  
Crossroads Community Services Board Profit-Sharing Plan

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Crossroads Community Services Board Profit-Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2025 and 2024, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of Crossroads Community Services Board Profit-Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from Principal Life Insurance Company as of and for the years ended June 30, 2025 and 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

## **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Crossroads Community Services Board Profit-Sharing Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

## **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Crossroads Community Services Board Profit-Sharing Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note 1. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting:

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and when applicable, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Accordingly, actual results could vary from these estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition:

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, the trustees, and insurance company. See Note 6 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Appreciation (depreciation) in the fair market value of investments includes currently realized gains and losses on the sale of assets as well as unrealized gains and losses resulting from yearly changes in market values of assets held in the portfolio.

Payment of benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses:

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Agency. Expenses that are paid by the Agency are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Risks and uncertainties:

The Plan invests in registered investment companies, which in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with these securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near-term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements.

#### Note 2. Plan Description

The following description of the Crossroads Community Services Board (the Agency) Profit-Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

##### General:

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of the Agency who have one year of service (defined as 1,000 hours). A minimum age is not required. It is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA). Some administrative costs of the Plan are absorbed by the Agency.

##### Contributions:

Each year, the Agency contributes to the Plan amounts as determined at the option of the Agency's Board of Directors.

##### Participant accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with allocations of the Agency's contribution and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Subject to an investment policy established by the Plan Administrator, participants can direct how some (or all) of their account will be invested. The participants can choose from any investment options approved by the Plan, including, but not limited to, savings and/or money market accounts, stocks, bonds, mutual funds, and insurance company funds. The participants can switch between investments as often as is permitted under the investment options they choose. All earnings and losses on their directed investments will be credited directly to their account. Investment results will reflect any fees and investment expenses for the investments they select. The participants may request more information on fees associated with an investment option from the Plan Administrator. At the appropriate time, the Plan will provide each participant with more detailed information about the directed investment options permitted under the terms of the Plan's investment policy.

The Plan intends to comply with Section 404(c) of ERISA. This means that if participants are permitted to exercise independent control over the investment of their account and they are offered a reasonably diverse selection of well managed investment options, then the fiduciaries of the Plan, including the Plan Administrator and the Agency, may be relieved of certain liabilities for any losses which occur because the participants exercise control.

Note 2. Plan Description (Continued)

Vesting:

Vesting of Agency contributions in participant accounts plus earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100 percent vested of Agency contributions after five years of credited service.

The participants' vesting schedule, as detailed in the Plan, is as follows:

<u>% Vested at Year End</u>	
Year 1 = 20%	Year 4 = 80%
Year 2 = 40%	Year 5 = 100%
Year 3 = 60%	

Rollover contributions are fully vested at the time of contribution.

Payment of benefits:

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum amount or in optional installments as requested by the participant or beneficiary based on the Plan provisions. For participants that work beyond normal retirement age, they will continue to fully participate in the Plan. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution and may defer the payment of nonvested benefits for five consecutive one-year breaks in service, after which the nonvested portion of the account will be forfeited. Also, participants may withdraw any part of their vested account after attaining age 59½.

Participant-directed investments in funds:

Each participant can choose to invest contributions of the Agency or rollover contributions from a former employer's qualified retirement plan into a variety of funds offered under the Plan. Each participant's account is credited with the Agency's contribution, rollovers, and allocation of (a) Plan earnings and appreciation in value of direct investment account, and (b) forfeitures of terminated participants' balances and charged with trustee expenses. Each participant's account is reduced for any withdrawals or distributions and direct investment losses or depreciation in value of investments.

Forfeited accounts:

The amount of forfeited non-vested accounts was \$20,394 and \$30,967 for the years ended June 30, 2025 and 2024, respectively. These accounts may be used to reduce future agency contributions. Agency contributions were reduced by \$20,394 and \$30,967 for the years ended June 30, 2025 and 2024, respectively.

Amendments:

The Plan was amended July 1, 2024 to change vesting from a six-year schedule to a five-year schedule.

Note 3. Tax Status

The Agency has been informed by Principal Life Insurance Company that the Plan is part of a prototype plan for which the trustee has an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 issued by the Internal Revenue Service as evidence that the Plan is qualified under Section 401 of the *Internal Revenue Code*. Therefore, the Plan is not subject to tax under current income tax law. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the *Internal Revenue Code*, and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the *Internal Revenue Service*. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for the years prior to June 30, 2022.

Note 4. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Agency has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

#### Note 6. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is based on the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

The established framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

##### *Level 1 Fair Value Measurements*

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

##### *Level 2 Fair Value Measurements*

Inputs to the valuation methodology that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

##### *Level 3 Fair Value Measurements*

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

A financial instrument's categorization within the valuation hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for the Plan's instruments measured at fair value, including the general classification of such instruments pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of June 30, 2025 and 2024.

*Mutual Funds.* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Security and Exchange Commission (SEC). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Principal Life Insurance Company provides certain administrative services to the Plan and receives revenue from mutual fund service providers for certain services. This revenue is used to offset certain administrative charges to the Plan.

There were no exempt investments in Mutual Funds of the trustee through related party and party-in-interest transactions at June 30, 2025.

Note 8. Administrative Fees

In accordance with Plan Administration, the trustee, the Principal Life Insurance Company, charged trustee and administrative fees directly to participants' accounts and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Expenses paid by the Agency are excluded from these financial statements.

Note 9. Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through February 6, 2026, the date which the financial statements were available for issue.



