Notes to Financial Statements
September 30, 2025 and December 31, 2024

DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the HHDLA 401(k) Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of Rama Associates LLC dba Home Helpers and Direct Link of Amsterdam, the "Company", who are age twenty-one or older and are employed by the Company on the last day of the Plan year. There is no service requirement for employee 401(k) deferral contributions, but there is a requirement of one year of service, that is greater than 1,000 hours of service, for employer safe harbor and discretionary contributions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to a statutory limit of \$23,500 of pretax annual compensation in 2025 and \$23,000 of pretax annual compensation in 2024. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan years are eligible to make additional catch-up contributions of up to \$7,500 for 2025 and 2024. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans.

The Internal Revenue Code contains limitations on the amount of contributions which can be made to the Plan by and on behalf of a participant. Specifically, there are limitations on contributions made on behalf of highly compensated employees to ensure that no prohibited discrimination takes place under the code.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan has offered 21 mutual funds and cash equivalent funds as investment options for participants. The Company is required under the plan agreement to make annual safe harbor nonelective contributions of 3% of participants' base compensation. The Company may also make an additional discretionary contribution at the option of the Company's board of directors. Both of these contributions, if made, are invested in a portfolio of investments as directed by each participant.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's safe harbor and discretionary contributions and, (b) Plan earnings (losses), and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and company safe harbor contributions plus actual earnings thereon. For discretionary employer contributions and earnings, participants are vested according to a six-year vesting schedule.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates equal to regional bank rates for similar loans. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. The maximum term of the loan is 5 years.

Notes Receivable from Participants (continued)

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is reported on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses had been recorded as of September 30, 2025 and December 31, 2024. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan agreement.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, as defined, or upon attaining age 59 ½ while still employed (in-service), a participant may elect to distribute an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account as a lump-sum payment or rollover payment into another qualified plan or account, or annual installments over a ten-year period.

A participant may also withdraw money from their account in the event of financial hardship. Hardship withdrawals may not exceed the amount of the participant's cumulative deferral and the participant may not make additional deferrals for a period of six months after the date of the withdrawal.

A participant with an account balance less than \$1,000 must take a lump-sum payment as soon as practicable following termination. A participant with an account balance less than \$5,000 but greater than or equal to \$1,000 will receive a rollover payment into an individual retirement account unless the participant otherwise instructs the administrator and receives a lump-sum payment as soon as practicable following termination.

Forfeited Accounts

At September 30, 2025 and December 31, 2024, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$-0- and \$2,774, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and are included with the American Funds US Government Money Market Fund balances for 2024 in the schedule of assets (held at end of year) accompanying the respective Forms 5500. Employer contributions were reduced by \$0 in 2025 and 2024 from forfeited non-vested accounts.

SECURE 2.0 Act

On December 29, 2024, the SECURE 2.0 Act was signed into law. It includes mandatory and optional provisions impacting defined contribution plans. Key provisions that may affect plan participants in the future include increasing the age for Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs), long-term part-time employee (LTPTE) eligibility, and self-certification for hardship distributions. Applicable provisions outlined in the SECURE 2.0 Act will be adopted when required.

SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting, except for payments of benefits, which are recorded when paid.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Shares of mutual funds are valued at the quoted net asset values, or closing market prices, of the shares held by the Plan at year-end. This is known as Level 1 fair value measurement. Participant loans are valued at their outstanding balances, which approximate fair value.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Employer and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Presentation of Financial Statements

The financial statements for December 31, 2024 have been presented in conformity with the September 30, 2025 format.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through January 28, 2026, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. All of the Plan's assets have been distributed as of the report date due to the Plan terminating on September 30, 2025.

FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

The Plan's investments in mutual funds are valued utilizing Level 1 inputs.

- Level 2 - Level 2 inputs consist of than quoted priced included within Level 1 that are observable

for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

The Plan currently has no assets using Level 2 inputs.

- Level 3 valuations are based on inputs that are unobservable and significant to the overall fair value measurement.

The Plan currently has no assets using Level 3 inputs.

The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily net asset value and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded. The fair values of common stocks are based on the closing price reported on the active market where the individual securities are traded.

The Plan's investments in mutual funds (including gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year) appreciated in value \$92,098 during 2025 and \$125,700 during 2024.

PLAN TERMINATION

The Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions. The Company had expressed an intent to terminate the Plan in late 2025 in conjunction with the Company ceasing business operations. The Plan was formally terminated effective September 30, 2025, and all Plan assets were distributed.

TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the prototype sponsor by a letter dated March 31, 2008, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan sponsor and administrators believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2022.

RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of assets available for benefits.
