The Society of Actuaries (SOA) is an actuarial organization that periodically reviews mortality data and publishes mortality tables and improvement scales. In October 2019, the SOA released the Pri-2012 Mortality Tables for private-sector retirement plans in the U.S. The Pri-2012 report contains different sets of mortality tables based on complete dataset or various subsets. The Total dataset base rate table was selected based on information provided by the plan sponsor.

Pri-2012 section 12.4. provided three approaches for designated beneficiaries in the calculation of joint-and-survivor annuities. We believe "Approach 1" is reasonable for this plan.

Interest rate used to value liabilities

6.25%

The interest rate used to value ASC 960 liabilities is developed as long-term expected geometric return on plan assets. Arithmetic expected return is calculated as the weighted average of broad asset classes' arithmetic returns of the plan's target asset allocation, and then converted to the geometric under lognormal distribution assumption. For details, see Long-Term Capital Market Assumptions link.

Treatment of administrative expenses

No adjustments are made for administrative expenses, either through a reduction in the discount rate or by calculating a present value of future expenses.

Plan sponsors may change their administrative expense handling at any time. Our approach provides consistent handling of ASC 960 liabilities from year to year, whether expenses are paid with plan assets or directly by the employer.

Note - expenses paid with plan assets are required to be included in funding normal cost. As a result, the plan is reimbursed annually through required funding. Exception – contributions are not required due to assets sufficiently in excess of liabilities to fund both expenses and normal cost. In this case, administrative expenses are taken from the excess assets.

The following is a summary of plan provisions and does not alter the intent or meanings of the provisions contained in the contract or plan document. This report reflects the provisions of the 01/01/2014 plan restatement signed 12/05/2014, updated through the legislative amendment, effective 04/01/2018 and signed 07/17/2018.

Plan eligibility

Service One year of service in which at least 1,000 hours worked.

Frozen eligibility Eligibility into the plan is frozen on and after 07/31/2010.

Normal retirement benefit

Age Attained age 65.

Form Monthly annuity payable for life (optional forms may be elected in advance of retirement).

Amount Equal to the product of (a) and (b) below:

(accrued benefit)

- a) 1.40% of Average Compensation, multiplied by expected Accrual Service on the date he reaches normal retirement age, plus 0.45% of Average Compensation in excess of his Integration Level, multiplied by expected Accrual Service (not to exceed 35 years)

- b) Accrued Benefit Adjustment

The accrued benefit for a participant (who is a highly compensated employee as of 12/31/2015) is frozen effective 12/31/2015 and no additional benefits shall accrue after such date.

The accrued benefit for a participant (who becomes a highly compensated employee after 12/31/2015) is frozen effective the December 31 before becoming a highly compensated employee and no additional benefits shall accrue after such date.

No individual whose accruals cease on account of being a highly compensated employee shall again accrue additional benefits even if such individual later ceases to be a highly compensated employee.

Pursuant to Code Section 410(b), a one-time benefit will be credited to each eligible employee who is a non-highly compensated employee equal to 0.4% of his compensation for the period beginning 01/01/2014 and ending 12/31/2014 and 0.88% of his compensation for the period beginning 01/01/2015 and ending 12/31/2015.

Cost of living supplement

Cost of Living Supplements shall be provided to any retired Participant of this Plan who became a Participant on or after January 1, 1981. A retiree's benefits under this Plan are increased each year that the Consumer Price Index increases more than 1% from the preceding year, subject to a maximum increase of 2% annually.

Early retirement benefit

Definitions

Average compensation	The average of an employee's monthly compensation for the five consecutive years out of ten latest compensation years prior to retirement date which gives the highest average. An employee's average compensation shall be his frozen average compensation determined as of the date his accrued benefit is frozen.
Accrued benefit adjustment	The quotient of the participant's Accrual Service as of a given date divided by the participant's potential Accrual Service as of the date he reaches normal retirement age.
Accrual service	An employee's period of service. This period of service shall count a partial month as a complete month and shall be expressed as years and fractional parts of a year. Service accrued after the date the accrued benefit is frozen is excluded.
Integration level	1/12th of his Covered Compensation for the plan year.

Covered compensation

The monthly average of the Social Security Taxable Wage Bases (in effect under Section 230 of the Social Security Act) for each year in the 35-year period ending with the year the employee attains Social Security retirement age.

Totally and permanently disabled

A participant is unable to engage in any substantial gainful activity by reason of a medically determined physical or mental impairment that can be expected to result in death or that has lasted or expected to last for a continuous period of at least 12 months. The disability shall be determined by either a written opinion of a licensed physician or a letter from the Social Security Administration that the disability has been awarded.

Optional forms of benefit payments

The optional forms of benefit payments are:

- Monthly annuity payable for life, or 3, 5, 8 1/3, or 15 years certain and life.
- Monthly annuity payable as a survivorship life annuity with survivorship percentages of 50, 66 2/3, 75, or 100.
- Monthly annuity payable as a survivorship life annuity with survivorship percentages of 50, 66 2/3, 75 or 100 and a certain period of 3, 5, 10, or 15 years.
- Single life annuity with full cash refund of the present value of the participant's vested accrued benefit.

The participant may select any of the annuity forms with a cost of living adjustment in any multiple in excess of the cost of living multiple. However, in no event shall the multiple applied for such adjustment be greater than 1.08. Any such annuity form selected by the participant shall be actuarially reduced for such adjustment.

Lump sum provisions

Small amount force out (SAFO) – allowed up to \$5,000.

Lump sums in excess of SAFO - are allowed at termination of employment and retirement.

The optional form conversion basis is 8.5% interest and the 1983 Individual Annuity Mortality Table for females for payments other than lump sums. The optional form conversion basis uses the applicable interest rate and applicable mortality table as set forth in Code Section 417 for lump sum payments. The applicable interest rate uses the second calendar month preceding the first day of the stability period which is the successive quarter that contains the annuity starting date.

Changes in Principal Eligibility or Benefit Provisions

There have been no changes in principal eligibility or benefit provisions since the last valuation.

Significant Event

The enrolled actuary has not been made aware that any significant events have occurred during the year.

Certain non-prescribed assumptions have been changed since last year. These assumptions were changed to better reflect the anticipated experience of your plan. See the attachment, Part V – Statement of Actuarial Assumptions/Methods, for the rationale for each assumption.

The assumed asset return for the current year has increased from 6.25% to 6.50%. This rate is used in the calculation of the actuarial value of plan assets.
