- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Freed-Hardeman University 403(B) Retirement Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Freed-Hardeman University 403(B) Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements, including omissions, are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing audits in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audits.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Freed-Hardeman University 403(B) Retirement Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Freed-Hardeman University 403(B) Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

Other Matter – Supplementary Information

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements, but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE 1 – PLAN ADMINISTRATION AND DESCRIPTION

The following brief description of the Freed-Hardeman University 403(B) Retirement Plan is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for more complete information.

A. General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering certain employees of Freed-Hardeman University (the “University”). The Plan was created on June 1, 2011 by the merger of the Freed-Hardeman University Defined Contribution Retirement Plan (Plan #001) and the Freed-Hardeman University Tax Deferred Annuity Plan (Plan #002). The University is a not-for-profit entity as defined by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan is subject to the 403(B) provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). 403(B) plans require universal availability; therefore, participation is not subject to minimum age, hours or years of service requirements.

B. Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute any amount, up to the legal limit, of their pretax annual compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investments of the contributions to their account to various investment plans offered by the Plan. The Plan also allows for Roth contributions. The University determines the percentage it will match at the end of each Plan year. For the years ended May 31, 2025 and 2024, the University matched 50 percent of deferrals up to 3.5 percent of compensation. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

C. Participants’ Accounts

Each participant account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocation of the University’s contribution and plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative fees. Allocations are based on participant compensation, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

D. Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and employer contributions plus earnings thereon.

E. Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at rates ranging from 3.25 percent to 8.50 percent. Principal and interest is paid ratably through quarterly pay.

F. Payments of Benefits

A participant’s entire interest in the Plan is payable upon death, attainment of normal retirement age, becoming disabled, as defined, or termination of service. A participant may elect to receive a lump-sum, partial lump-sum, or installment amount equal to the vested portion of the participant’s account. Participants may elect to rollover their vested balance to another qualified retirement plan or IRA. Immediate lump-sum distributions may be made to terminated participants if the participant’s vested account balance is \$1,000 or less. For terminated participants with vested balances greater than \$1,000, their vested balance may be automatically rolled into an IRA unless

otherwise elected. Withdrawals from the Plan may also be made upon circumstances of financial hardship or disability, in accordance with provisions specified in the Plan. Participants may also withdraw an amount at age 59½ if certain criteria are met.

G. Forfeited Accounts

As of May 31, 2025 and 2024, there were no forfeited nonvested accounts. As of May 31, 2025 and 2024 no forfeitures were used to pay administrative expenses.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

B. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

C. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and investment custodian.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

D. Contributions

Participant contributions and any related employer matching contributions are recognized in the period during which the Company makes the respective payroll deduction from the participant's compensation. Employer contributions are recorded in the relevant period in accordance with the terms in the Plan document.

E. Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

F. Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

G. Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Sponsor. Expenses that are paid by the Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation (depreciation) of the fair value of investments.

H. Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through January 16, 2026, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION

Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, related to investments and notes receivable from participants held as of May 31, 2025 and 2024, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the years then ended, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America and College Retirement Equities Fund (“TIAA-CREF”) and Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, qualified institutions.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include

- quoted prices for similar assets in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used on May 31, 2025 and 2024.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Insurance contract: The investment contract with insurance company is valued based on a formula in the contract with the credited rate being the significant other observable input. The fixed account is valued at the approximate amount that would have been paid if the contract had been terminated as of May 31, 2025 and 2024 and potential surrender charges and market value adjustments were applied as of such date.

Annuities: The TIAA Traditional Annuity is reported at contract value. The contract value of the TIAA Traditional Annuity equals the accumulated cash contributions, interest credited to the plan's contracts and transfers, if any, less any withdrawals and transfers, if any.

The TIAA Traditional Annuity is not available for sale or transfer on any securities exchange. Accordingly, transactions in similar investment instruments are not observable. While transactions involved in the purchase / sales of individual TIAA contracts are not observable in a public marketplace, contract value may provide a good approximation of fair value. The unobservable significant input is the discount rate.

NOTE 5 – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are administered by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company and Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America and College Retirement Equities Fund (“TIAA-CREF”). Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company and TIAA-CREF are the Plan asset custodians. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Administrative services to the plan provided by TIAA-CREF and Voya (recordkeepers) and included in the statements of changes of net assets were \$161,594 and \$153,888 for the years ended May 31, 2025 and 2024, respectively.

NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS

Effective October 16, 2019 the Employer adopted a Volume Submitter Plan. That Plan received a favorable determination letter on June 30, 2020. The Plan has been amended since that date to remain in compliance with Internal Revenue Code revisions. Management believes the amendments would not affect the qualified status of the Plan and therefore, the Plan qualifies under Internal Revenue Code Section 401(a) and the trust is exempt from federal income taxes.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
