Opinion

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND

The Northern California Bakery & Confectionery Health and Welfare Fund (the "Fund"), a multiemployer employee benefit plan, was created on May 1, 1985 by Bakers 119 and Bakers 85 of the Bakery and Confectionery Workers International Union of America. The purpose of the Fund is to provide health and welfare benefits to members covered under the collective bargaining agreements between the above parties.

The Fund self-insures medical, hospital, prescription drug, dental and rehabilitation benefits unless a participant has elected coverage with a health maintenance organization. Vision, life insurance and AD&D benefits are provided by group insurance policies. The Fund has a stop loss policy for medical coverage which provides for payment of specified claims up to certain limits that are in excess of the Fund's liability limits. Retired employees are covered under the Plan and are required to contribute toward the premium costs.

THE PLAN DOCUMENTS INCLUDE DETAILED RULES FOR EACH SITUATION. PARTICIPANTS SHOULD REFER TO THE PLAN AGREEMENT AND ANY AMENDMENTS REGARDING SPECIFIC PROVISIONS OF THE PLAN.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Fund are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

B. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Fund administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affects certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

C. Contributions

Employer contributions as reported are contributions made by employers on behalf of employees for the hours worked during the year. Employer contributions receivable is based on contributions received subsequent to the end of the year. No allowance is provided for estimated uncollectible accounts. COBRA and retiree contributions vary depending on the type of benefits and level of participation.

The contribution rates in effect during the period vary with amount to be contributed in accordance with collective bargaining agreements negotiated by the participating unions with various employer groups.

D. Payroll Compliance Program

Employer remittance reports were accepted as submitted, without examination or verification of employers' payroll records. The system of internal control provides for examination of employers' records under a separate payroll compliance program.

E. Benefits

Benefits to members may vary in accordance with collective bargaining agreements negotiated by various employer groups.

F. Tax-Exempt Status

No provision for federal and state income tax is made. The Fund has received tax-exempt status from the federal government under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(9) and the state of California under Revenue and Taxation Code Section 23701i. The Fund administrator and the Fund's legal counsel believe that the Fund as designed is currently operating in compliance with the applicable requirements of the federal and state codes.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Fund and recognize a tax liability if the Fund has taken a tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a tax authority. The Fund is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC 820 provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

- Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at April 30, 2025 and 2024. The money market fund and mutual funds are valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which securities are traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Fund believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The Fund did not have any transfers into or out of Levels 1, 2 or 3 for the years ended April 30, 2025 and 2024.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the trade date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date and interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Realized and unrealized gains and losses are computed using investments' costs for financial statement purposes. For Form 5500 reporting, realized and unrealized gains and losses are computed using investments' market values as of the beginning of the year.

NOTE 4 - PRIORITIES UPON TERMINATION

Except as may be otherwise provided by law, in the event of termination of Agreement and Declaration of Trust, the Fund provides that any and all monies remaining in the Trust after payment of all expenses and obligations of the Trust shall be expended and used for the continuance of purposes of the Fund until such monies are exhausted.

Amounts currently payable to or for participants, beneficiaries and dependents are recorded on the Form 5500 for benefit claims that have been processed and approved for payment prior to April 30, but not yet paid as of that date.

NOTE 6 - CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The Fund places its cash with financial institutions deemed to be creditworthy. Cash balances may at times exceed the federally insured deposit limit of \$250,000 per bank.

NOTE 7 - POSTRETIREMENT BENEFITS OBLIGATIONS

The postretirement benefit obligations represent the actuarial present value of those estimated future benefits that are attributed to employee service rendered to April 30. Postretirement benefits include future benefits expected to be paid to or for: (1) currently retired or terminated employees and their beneficiaries and dependents, and (2) active employees and their beneficiaries and dependents after retirement from service with participating employers. Prior to an active employee's full eligibility date, the postretirement benefit obligation is the portion of the expected postretirement benefit obligation that is attributed to that employee's service in the industry rendered to the valuation date. The calculation of the postretirement benefit obligations does not imply that there is any legal liability to provide the benefits valued, nor is there any implication that the Fund is required to implement a funding policy to satisfy the projected expense.

The actuarial present values of the expected postretirement benefit obligations were determined by actuaries and are the amounts that result from applying actuarial assumptions to historical benefits cost data to estimate future annual incurred benefits costs per participant; and to adjust such estimates for the time value of money (through discounts for interest), and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as those for death, disability or withdrawal) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

The significant actuarial assumptions and methods used were as follows for 2025 (2024): (a) Discount Rate: 5.50%, (b) Mortality: PRI-2012 Private Retirement Plans Mortality Tables with Blue Collar adjustment for "Employee", "Healthy Annuitant", sex distinct Projected fully generationally using Scale MP-2021 (RP 2000 projected to 2022 Table for Blue Collar Annuitants was used after retirement), (c) active employees are assumed to retire as follows: age 55-59, 5%; age 60-61, 10%; age 62, 40%; age 63, 10%; age 64, 20%; age 65-66, 50%; age 67, 100%, (d) expenses included in assumed costs of benefits, and (e) other assumptions and methods for retirement rates, funding methods, and per capita cost assumptions.

The health care cost-trend rate and retiree contribution trend rate have a significant effect on the postretirement benefit obligations. A 1% increase in the health care cost-trend rate would increase the net postretirement benefit obligation to \$196,081,727 and \$194,614,646 as of April 30, 2025 and 2024, respectively, an increase of \$29,166,645 and \$28,685,880, respectively, over the reported number.

The foregoing assumptions are based on the presumption that the Fund will continue. Were the Fund to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of the postretirement benefit obligation.

NOTE 8 - MEDICARE DRUG SUBSIDY

The Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement and Modernization Act of 2003 (the Act) includes a prescription drug benefit under Medicare as well as a federal subsidy to sponsors of retiree health care benefit plans providing a benefit that is at least actuarially equivalent to Medicare Part D. Under the Act, for multiemployer plans, any Medicare subsidy is received directly by the Fund and not the individual employers participating in the Fund. The gross subsidies received were \$1,178 and \$63,678 for the years ended April 30, 2025 and 2024, respectively.

NOTE 9 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Fund investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rates, market fluctuations and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The actuarial present value of benefit obligations is reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, health care inflation rates and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.
