NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Endeavor Consulting Group, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. The Plan was established on July 1, 2006 and was most recently restated on January 1, 2021 and terminated on April 18, 2024. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement and/or the Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code covering full and part-time employees of Endeavor Consulting Group, LLC (the Company) who have reached the age of twenty-one and completion of 500 hours of service in a six month period. Participants enter the plan on the first day of the first month after meeting eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA).

Contributions

Participants may elect to defer up to 92% of their annual compensation up to the maximum contribution allowed by law on a pre or post tax basis. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). The employer may elect to make a matching discretionary contribution during the plan year. The Plan will only take into account elective deferrals up to 6% of compensation in applying the matching contribution; and the maximum discretionary matching contribution that can be made on behalf of any participant is 4% of compensation. The employer will make a safe harbor nonelective contribution during the plan year to eligible participants in an amount equal to 3% of each participant's compensation.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers several pooled separate accounts as investment options for participants.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and employer matching contributions, and allocations of Plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate plus 1%, which is commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator at the time the loans are made. Loans must be repaid by the participant within five years unless the loan is used to acquire a participant's primary residence. Loans used to acquire a primary residence must be repaid by the participant within 30 years. A participant may only have 1 outstanding loan at a time. Principal and interest are repaid through payroll deductions. The interest rates during 2024 ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement at or after age 65, a participant shall receive all amounts credited to such participant's account. Participants are permitted to receive a distribution from the vested portion of their individual account balance for a proven hardship or an in-plan Roth rollover, at attainment of age 59-1/2 while still employed. Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts may be used to pay any administrative expenses, reduce Company contributions, or be reallocated as contributions. Unallocated forfeitures at December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$0 and \$0, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2024, \$0 of forfeitures were allocated to reduce employer contributions.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

Due to the Plan termination, management determined that liquidation of the Plan is imminent and the financial statements for 2024 have been prepared using the liquidation basis of accounting. Under the liquidation basis of accounting, assets are measured at expected cash proceeds from liquidation and liabilities are measured in accordance with the applicable reporting framework that otherwise apply to those liabilities. The 2023 financial statements were prepared on the ongoing basis of accounting.

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities and changes therein. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments in pooled separate accounts are stated at net asset value as reported by the insurance company which include a mix of mutual funds and managed accounts. Net appreciation or depreciation of investments is reported on the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits and consists of realized gains and losses and the unrealized appreciation or depreciation of these investments. All underlying investment options are valued daily. This daily price is considered the selling price for transfers and withdrawals and is calculated each day the principal market is open and are available to any participant in the Plan.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses have been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. The company determines that a loan is in default if loan repayment is not made by the end of the calendar quarter following the calendar quarter in which the missed payment was due. If a loan is deemed to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded. At year end, there is one participant loan that is deemed to be in default.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Operating Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in administrative expenses.

Date of Management's Review

Management has evaluated subsequent events through January 29, 2026, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE C - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Investments of the Plan are managed by the custodian, and, therefore, all transactions involving these investments qualify as allowable party-in-interest transactions. In addition, the Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions allowable under ERISA guidelines.

The Company provides certain accounting and administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged. Certain accounting and administrative fees are paid by the Company on behalf of the Plan.

NOTE D - PLAN TERMINATION

On April 18, 2024, the Plan Sponsor adopted a resolution to terminate the Plan on the day prior to the consummation of the acquisition of the Company by UST, after which time the plan sponsor became a wholly owned subsidiary of UST. The acquisition was finalized on April 19, 2024, and the Plan was terminated effective April 18, 2024. All participants became fully vested in their account balances on that date. The TPA finalized the liquidation of account balances and processed final distributions to participants in December 2025. The Plan has been inactive since April 18, 2024, and the only transactions processed are participant distribution requests. As a result, the 2024 financial statements have been prepared using the liquidation basis of accounting. This had no impact on the values of the assets reported in the financial statements. No liabilities were recognized in connection with the termination.

In connection with the Plan's termination, participants were permitted to withdraw their account balances out of the Plan and could no longer make contributions or make loan payments via payroll deduction. In addition, participants became eligible to participate in the UST Retirement Savings Plan after the acquisition was finalized on April 19, 2024.

NOTE E - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S CUSTODIAN

The Plan management has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Under that section, no auditing procedures are required to be performed with respect to the investment information certified by the custodian of the Plan, John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, other than comparing such information to that contained in the financial statements and schedules.

NOTE F - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan utilizes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include: Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Pooled Separate Account

Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units held by the Plan at year end. The NAV, as provided by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.), is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The methods described above may produce fair value calculations that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

(1) Target date funds seek high total return through its target retirement date, with a greater focus on income beyond the target retirement date.

(2) Asset allocation funds seek returns commensurate with the amount of risk that a participant has selected.

(3) Aggressive growth funds seek long-term growth of capital consistent with prudent investment risk.

(4) Growth funds seek long-term growth of capital.

(5) Growth and income funds seek long-term growth of capital. Current income is also a consideration.

(6) Income funds seek a high level of current income.

(7) Money markets are invested in highly liquid money market accounts.

NOTE G - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE H - TAX STATUS

The Plan participates in a pre-approved profit sharing/Cash or Deferred Arrangement plan sponsored by Ascensus LLC. Ascensus LLC has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service, letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since that date, the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, management believes that the Plan was qualified and was tax-exempt as of the financial statements date.

Accounting principles accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Department of Labor and Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

The Company is aware of certain operational failures of the Plan, which were discovered during the 2024 audit. The Company is working with the Plan's legal counsel and third-party administrator to correct these failures in accordance with Department of Labor guidelines.
