Opinion

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of the Magic Valley Growers, LTD. Employee Stock Ownership Plan and Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan operates as an employee stock ownership plan and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) of 1986, as amended and is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). All employer stock under the Plan is the common stock of Magic Valley Growers, LTD (the Company.) As of March 31, 2016, all stock was allocated to participants. The Plan is administered by the Board of Directors of the Company. Robert Rietveld is the Plan's trustee.

Eligibility

Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first entry date of April 1 or October 1 after attaining age 21 and completing a 12-month period of service providing they worked at least 1,000 hours during such period.

Entry Date

Employees may enter the Plan on the first day of April or October coinciding with or following the date they satisfy the Plan's eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Contributions to the Plan are made by the Company at the discretion of the Company. The contributions are allocated according to the pro rata share of each participant's compensation to total eligible compensation. Participants must have completed at least 1,000 hours of service and be actively employed at the end of the year, unless terminated due to retirement, death or disability, to receive an allocation of the contribution. In 2025 and 2024, the Company made discretionary contributions of \$3,080,161 and \$0, respectively.

Voting Rights

Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to their account and is notified by the Trustee prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. The Trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated share for which instructions have not been given by a participant.

Put Option

The employer stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the appraised value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

Participant Accounts

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited with allocations of (a) the Company's contribution (when made), (b) the Plan's earnings or losses, and (c) forfeitures, which are reallocated to participants in the same manner as employer contributions. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the Plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants vest in the stock allocated to their account at the rate of 20 percent per year once obtaining 2 years of credited service. If participation in the Plan is terminated by reason other than resignation or dismissal before retirement, the participant will become fully vested in the balance in their account. Participants are 100% vested in their account balances upon retirement, death or disability.

Forfeitures

At March 31, 2025 and 2024, there was no balance in the forfeited non-vested account as all forfeitures are used in the same year they are forfeited. Forfeited accounts are used to reduce employer contributions or allocated to eligible participants. During the years ended March 31, 2025 and 2024, forfeited non-vested accounts totaling \$60,779 and \$37,000, respectively, were allocated to eligible participants. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to the total eligible compensation.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution. Amounts allocated to accounts of persons who have elected to withdraw from the Plan, but have not yet been paid, were \$3,394,662 and \$3,241,249, at March 31, 2025 and 2024, respectively. An employee or designated beneficiary may elect to receive a distribution no more than \$250,000 annually as defined in the Plan document in the case of death, disability and normal retirement. A terminated employee with a balance up to \$5,000 will receive a distribution in the first year following termination. For balances greater than \$5,000 the distribution does not begin until the 6th year following termination and follows the normal distribution policies.

The amount to be distributed is based upon the immediately preceding valuation date. Distributions are made in cash or, if a participant elects, in the form of Company common stock plus cash for any fractional share of common stock, except that any distribution eligible for floor price protection are distributed in shares only. Under the provisions of the Plan, the Company is obligated to repurchase participant shares, which have been distributed under the terms of the Plan if the shares are not publicly traded or if the shares are subject to trading limitations.

Diversification

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company common stock into investments, which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55, with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan, may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25 percent of shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50 percent. Participants electing to diversify receive a cash distribution.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their account. Upon termination of the Plan, the ESOP committee directs the Trustee to pay all liabilities and expenses of the ESOP. Subsequently, the interest of each participant in the trust fund will be distributed to such participant or his or her beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the IRC.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income, if any, is accrued on an ex-dividend date.

The classification of investment earnings reported above and in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits may differ from the classification of earnings on Form 5500 due to different reporting requirements on Form 5500.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Expenses

All Plan's expenses are paid by the Company, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through February 16, 2026, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Investments

The investment in the Company's common stock is valued in the accompanying financial statements based on an independent appraisal using financial data as of March 31, 2025 and 2024. As of March 31, 2025 and 2024, the price was valued at \$7.65 and \$7.55, respectively, per share for common stock:

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at March 31, 2025 and 2024.

Common stock: The fair value of the Company common stock held in the Plan is valued at estimated fair value based upon an independent appraisal. The appraisal was based upon a combination of the market and income valuation techniques consistent with prior periods. The appraiser took into account historical and projected cash flow and net income, discount rates, return on assets, return on equity, market comparable and estimated fair value of Company assets and liabilities, including discounts for lack of control and lack of marketability.

The valuation process involves Plan management's selection of an independent appraiser on an annual basis. Plan management accumulates the data for the appraiser from the audited financial statements of the Company. The appraiser prepares a preliminary report which Plan management, along with the ESOP committee and ESOP trustee, review in detail, discuss, and approve. The results of this process are documented in the minutes of the ESOP committee.

Note 5 - Tax Status

The Plan received its latest determination letter dated September 19, 2017, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code, and the Plan and related trust continue to be tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 6 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan’s investments consist primarily of the Company’s common stock, which is exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows and other such techniques. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investments, such as pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in the common stock and to uncertainties inherent in estimates and assumptions, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of the common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 7 - Party-in-Interest

The Plan investments are shares of common stock in the Plan Sponsor. One corporate officer of the Company is the Trustee as defined by the Plan Document and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest, of which there were none during the years ended March 31, 2025 and 2024. No fees were paid by the Plan to the Trustee or other services provided during the years ended March 31, 2025 and 2024.

Note 9 - Right of First Refusal

Any shares of the Company's stock distributed by the Plan shall be subject to a "right of first refusal." The right of first refusal shall provide that, prior to any subsequent transfer, the shares must first be offered for purchase in writing to the Company, and then to the Plan, at the then Fair Market Value. A bona fide written offer from an independent prospective buyer shall be deemed to be the Fair Market Value for this purpose. The Company and the Plan shall have a total of fourteen (14) days to exercise the right of first refusal on the same terms offered by a prospective buyer. The Company may require that a Participant entitled to a distribution of Company stock execute an appropriate stock transfer agreement (evidencing the right of first refusal) prior to receiving a certificate for Company stock. The Company's Board of Directors may establish reasonable procedures relating to this right of first refusal.
