NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

May 31, 2025 and 2024

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Liberty Diversified International, Inc. Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan originally effective June 1, 1994. Employees of Liberty Diversified International, Inc. ("LDI," the "Company," "Plan Administrator" or the "Plan Sponsor") are immediately eligible to participate in the deferral and match components of the Plan. Participants are eligible for the profit sharing if they are employed on the last day of the Plan year. The Plan excludes residents of Puerto Rico. The Plan covers employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement, and the Plan includes interns. The Non-Union Employees are excluded from the Union Non-elective contribution and the Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") Match contribution; Union Employees are excluded from the Safe Harbor Match contribution and the Non-Union Non-elective contribution.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended. The Plan's Investment Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 50% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan document, up to the maximum limits of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Participants may designate all or a portion of their deferral contributions as after-tax contributions into a Roth account. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Effective January 1, 2025, the catch-up limit increased to \$11,250 for participants ages 60-63. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Participants' pre-tax elective deferrals increase by 1% per year up to a maximum of 10% of plan compensation.

The Company makes a safe harbor contribution to the Plan for the Non-Union participant and CBA match contribution for Union employees and may, at its discretion, elect to make a non-elective profit sharing contribution to the Plan. For the year ended May 31, 2025 and 2024, the Company matching contribution was 100% of the first 2% of eligible compensation and 50% of the next 4% of eligible compensation deferred that a participant contributes to the Plan. The Company made a discretionary profit sharing contribution to the Plan of approximately \$1,335,000 after the used forfeitures as discussed below, for the year ended May 31, 2025.

Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's matching contribution, an allocation of the Company's non-elective profit sharing contribution. Participants are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their salary reduction and rollover contributions plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company matching and profit sharing contribution portion of their accounts, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of credited service. A participant is 100% vested after two years of credited service. Notwithstanding the above, a participant is fully vested upon reaching the normal retirement age, death or permanent disability.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance reduced by the largest outstanding note of the previous 12 months. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of the U.S. Federal Reserve bank prime rate plus 1%. Participants are limited to one outstanding loan at a time. As of June 1, 2019, principal and interest for all loans, except those originating prior to June 1, 2019, must be paid via Automated Clearing House ("ACH"). As of January 1, 2022, principal and interest for all loans must be paid via direct billing only. Terms range from zero to five years, or greater for the purchase of a primary residence.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, termination or retirement, a participant may elect to receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account in the form of a lump-sum distribution or installments. The Plan allows for in-service distributions if a participant reaches age 59½ and hardship distributions subject to Plan provisions. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the Plan Administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. If the balance of the terminated participant's account is between \$1,000 and \$5,000, the Plan Sponsor may authorize the benefit payment to be rolled into an individual retirement account in the participant's name.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested amounts are used to either offset administrative expenses or to reduce future Company contributions. As of May 31, 2025 and 2024, forfeited non-vested account balances total approximately \$131,000 and \$319,000, respectively. There were approximately \$145,000 of forfeitures used to reduce Plan expenses and approximately \$47,000 of forfeitures used to reduce the discretionary profit sharing contribution made subsequent to year end and related to contributions for the year ended May 31, 2025.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, custodians and insurance companies. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of May 31, 2025 and 2024. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value in investments.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

NOTE 3 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE AND INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA for 2025 and 2024. Accordingly, Empower Annuity Insurance Company, and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the Trustee and Insurance Company of the Plan, have certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value and contract value and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of May 31, 2025 and 2024;
- Investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended May 31, 2025 and;
- Schedule H, line 4i - schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of May 31, 2025.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under authoritative guidance are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted market prices for identical assets in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observables and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of May 31, 2025 and 2024.

Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled separate accounts are investments in pooled separate accounts that are valued using the NAV of units, which are based on observable market prices for the underlying assets, held by the Plan at year-end.

The Collective Trust is valued at NAV, as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on net asset values reported by the fund manager. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily with no redemption frequency restrictions or redemption notice period restrictions, if the plan decided to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust.

NOTE 5 - FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

In 2010, the Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company ("PRIAC"). As of May 31, 2025, the Plan had exited this investment contract. Below is a description of the contract during the time the Plan held the investment:

This product was backed by the full faith and credit of PRIAC. PRIAC maintained the contributions in a general account. The account was credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer was contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate was based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0%, and was 1.50% during the year ended May 31, 2025. The crediting interest rate was

reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan is contract value and earnings less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Generally, there are no events that could limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value within 90 days, or in rare circumstances, contract value paid over time. There are no events that allow the issuer to terminate the contract, or which require the Plan Sponsor to settle at an amount different than contract value paid either within 90 days or over time.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the IRC or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the IRC;
2. Premature termination of the contracts;
3. Plan termination or merger;
4. Changes to the Plan's prohibition of competing investment options; and
5. Bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or signoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact a contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact a contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines;
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract;
3. A material misrepresentation; and
4. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 6 - ADMINISTRATION OF PLAN ASSETS

The Plan's assets are administered under a contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company, and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the Trustee and Insurance Company of the Plan. The Trustee and Insurance Companies invest funds received from contributions, investment sales, interest and dividend income, and make distribution payments to participants.

NOTE 7 - RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain of the Plan's investments are managed by the Trustee and Insurance Company as defined by the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment manager services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. Additionally, the Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participant's account balances. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

NOTE 8 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their company contributions.

NOTE 9 - TAX STATUS

The Plan is placing reliance on an opinion letter dated September 16, 2022, received from the IRS on the prototype plan indicating that the Plan is qualified with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

U.S. GAAP require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 10 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
