NOTE 1 – PLAN DESCRIPTION

General: The Plan, established effective August 1, 1966, as a profit-sharing plan and amended August 1, 1988 to include the 401(k) provision, is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of FESCO, Ltd., (the “Partnership”) who are age eighteen or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions: Participants may contribute up to \$23,000 (\$30,500 for employees age 50 or over) of annual compensation as an elective deferral. Participants may elect to have elective deferrals before tax or as a Roth elective deferral (after-tax). Participants may enter the Plan upon beginning employment, if at least 18 years of age.

The Partnership may make discretionary matching contributions and nonelective employer contributions for eligible employees who have completed six months of service and are 18 years of age.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various mutual fund options offered the Plan.

Participant Accounts: Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of:

- Partnership matching contributions, if any
- Account earnings
- Administrative expenses, if any

Allocations of discretionary Partnership-matching contributions are based on the amount of participant compensation. Allocation of earnings is based on the investments held in each participant’s account. Certain expenses are allocated based on the nature of the expense.

Vesting: Participants vest immediately in their contributions and actual earnings thereon. Except for certain participants, vesting in Partnership matching contributions and non-elective contributions is based on years of service with no credit for vesting until three years of service when participants are fully vested in Partnership contributions. For those participants who received top-heavy contributions in a year that the Plan is determined to be top-heavy (as defined), the vesting period is over a five year period at 20% each year beginning in the second year of employment.

Benefit Payments: On termination of services due to separation, death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the participant’s vested interest in the account, or periodic distributions required for minimum distribution purposes. Under certain circumstances, participants may receive in-service or hardship distributions. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. For accounts that did not exceed \$5,000, the account balance is distributed to former participants as a rollover or rolled into an IRA account as determined by the plan administrator.

Forfeited Accounts: Forfeited, non-vested accounts may be used to pay Plan expenses or reduce future employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, forfeited, non-vested accounts totaled \$38,580 and \$74,000.

Participant Notes Receivable: Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to the lesser of (1) \$50,000 less the highest outstanding note balances during the previous 12-month period or (2) 50% of their account balance. Participants may have two notes based on the above limits. Note receivable transactions are treated as a transfer between the investment account and note receivable account. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant’s account. Note terms generally range from 1 to 5 years for loans unless the note

is for the purchase of a principal residence in which case the term of the note may not extend beyond 15 years. The notes bear interest at money center prime rate (7.50% at December 31, 2024) plus 1%. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions under a level amortization schedule. Interest rates on notes receivable outstanding as of December 31, 2024 range from 4.25% to 9.50%. The maturity dates for the notes receivable range from February 2025 to January 2036.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value. The investments consist of mutual funds at December 31, 2024 and 2023. The mutual funds are valued at the net asset value of shares held. Purchases and sales of mutual funds are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

The purchase and sale of investments are determined and directed by Plan participants.

Participant Notes Receivable: Participant notes receivable are valued at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued interest, if any. Notes in default are treated as distributions for IRS purposes but remain as a participant note receivable in the financial statements, pursuant to the Plan document. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Related administrative fees are recorded as expenses and are expensed when incurred.

Excess Salary Deferral Contributions Refundable to Participants: Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to participant contributions. The Plan distributes the excess contributions to the applicable participants within the statutory requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Subsequent Events: Subsequent events have been evaluated by Plan management through the date of the independent auditor’s report.

NOTE 3 – INVESTMENTS

Certain information related to investments from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including the investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net investment gains, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by an authorized signatory of Fidelity Workplace Services LLC, Plan recordkeeper, on behalf of Fidelity Management Trust Company (Plan trustee).

The Plan’s mutual fund investments are reported at fair value and participant notes receivable are carried at the unpaid principal balance plus accrued interest in the accompanying statement of net assets available for plan benefit.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value.

Level 1: The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net assets values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Level 2: Inputs other than Level 1 prices that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, including quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, inactive markets, or inputs.

Level 3: Inputs that are not observable.

NOTE 5 – TAX STATUS

Effective April 1, 2018, the Company adopted a volume submitter document provided by Fidelity Management Trust Company. The Plan adopted a restated and amended Plan document effective November 15, 2021 and April 20, 2022. The Plan has not obtained a separate determination letter from the IRS. The volume submitter plan document has been submitted to the IRS for approval previously. The most recent volume submitter plan was approved by the IRS by letter dated June 30, 2020 for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The Plan Administrator and Trustees believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, they have concluded that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the U.S. federal, state, or local tax authorities. Plan management is not aware of any tax positions that would have a significant impact on the Plan financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by the Federal tax authorities. Currently, there are no tax examinations in progress.

NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION

Though it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan sponsor has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become fully vested in any employer contributions made prior to that time.

NOTE 7 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The mutual fund investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to these risks, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the mutual fund investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for Plan benefits. The concentration of credit risk with respect to investments is reduced as a result of the diversity of the underlying investments.

NOTE 8 – RELATED PARTY TRANSACTION AND PARTIES-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

During 2024, the Plan paid \$60,526 in investment management fees, professional fees and recordkeeping fees. Certain of these fees were paid to affiliates of Fidelity Management Trust Company, Plan trustee, for investment advisory services, recordkeeping services and loan transactions services. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by affiliates of the Plan Trustee. Transactions with the affiliates are considered related party and parties-in-interest transactions. The mutual funds managed by the affiliates include expenses which are recorded as part of net increase or decrease in the fair value of Plan investments.

NOTE 10 – CORRECTION OF EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTION OPERATIONAL ERROR

On March 27, 2022, the Plan Sponsor approved a discretionary non-qualified contribution of \$210,000 to eligible plan participants which was funded from forfeitures. The allocation did not conform to the requirements of the Plan Document and certain ineligible Plan participants received a share of the nonqualified contribution. During 2024, the Plan administrator completed correction of this error (\$36,493) under the IRS's Employee Plans Compliance Resolution System using the Self-Correction Program.

NOTE 11 – NON-EXEMPT TRANSACTION CORRECTION

During 2024, the Plan Sponsor did not remit certain participant contributions and participant note receivable repayments timely. Delinquent contributions and participant note receivable repayments are considered prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA. The delinquent participant contributions and participant note receivable repayments totaled \$154,232. The Plan sponsor is in process of correcting the non-exempt transactions using the Department of Labor's Voluntary Fiduciary Correction Program.
