We have performed an audit of the financial statements of Daily Express, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for plan benefits as of May 31, 2025 and 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements (2025 financial statements).

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of Daily Express, Inc., Daily Brokerage, Inc., Claremont Properties, Inc., Plant Site Logistics, Inc. and Daily Underwriters of America, Inc., Employee Benefit Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan provides health benefits covering substantially all eligible employees of Daily Express, Inc., Daily Brokerage, Inc., Claremont Properties, Inc., Plant Site Logistics, Inc. and Daily Underwriters of America, Inc. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Benefits: The Plan provides health (hospital, surgical, major medical, and prescription drugs) and dental benefits covering eligible employees of Daily Express, Inc., Daily Brokerage, Inc., Claremont Properties, Inc., Plant Site Logistics, Inc. and Daily Underwriters of America, Inc., after completion of 90 days of continuous, active service. Generally, no benefits are provided for terminated or retired employees. Under certain circumstances, former employees may obtain post-employment coverage through self-funded contributions for a limited period. Effective June 1, 2017, the Plan was amended to waive the waiting period for plan entry for employees transferring from a part-time to full-time position within any of the participating companies.

All Plan benefits are self-insured. The claims for self-insured benefits are processed by the Plan's third-party claims processors under administrative services only (ASO) arrangements. The claims processors pay claims directly to or on behalf of participants and are then reimbursed by the Plan. Despite the Plan's utilization of third-party claim's processors, ultimate responsibility for payments to providers and participants is retained by the Plan.

Stop Loss Coverage: The Plan has entered into a stop-loss insurance arrangement in an effort to limit its exposure for self-insured benefits (individual participant claims in excess of the stop loss deductible, as well as aggregate exposure for all claims). The insurance arrangement limits the Plan's liability for individual annual claims to a maximum of \$280,000 for the years ended May 31, 2025 and May 31, 2024, per each participant. Premiums for stop loss reinsurance are paid by funds deposited into the Plan. Refunds due as of the financial statement date, if any are reported as a receivable, with the offset being netted against claims paid. Stop-loss refunds totaling \$-0- and \$254,573 for the years ended May 31, 2025 and 2024, respectively, have been netted with claims paid in the accompanying statement of changes in benefit obligations and net assets (deficit) available for benefits.

Company Contributions: The Plan Agreement provides that Daily Express, Inc., Daily Brokerage, Inc., Claremont Properties, Inc., Plant Site Logistics, Inc. and Daily Underwriters of America, Inc., make contributions to the Plan in such amounts as become necessary to provide for the benefits expected to become payable under the Plan. Employee contributions for dependent coverage and self-funded contributions are received by the Plan.

Note 1. Description of the Plan (Continued)

COBRA Contributions: The Plan has provisions to comply with the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1986 (COBRA). COBRA requires employers to provide continuation coverage at group rates to former employees whose coverage would otherwise end.

Administrative Fees: The Plan pays administrative expenses that consist primarily of administrative fees paid to the third-party claim's administrator. These expenses are reported on the statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits. All other administrative expenses, such as professional fees, may be paid by the Company.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting which recognizes income as earned and expenses as incurred.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, benefit obligations and changes therein, incurred but not reported eligibility benefit credits, claims payable and disclosure of contingent assets, and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis.

Claims Incurred but not Reported: The Plan's liabilities for claims incurred but not reported as of May 31, 2025 and 2024, were estimated based on information provided to management by the Plan's third-party administrator. These amounts are paid by the Plan only if claims are submitted and approved for payment.

Payment of Benefits: Claim payments are recorded when paid by the third-party claim's processor. Amounts due to claims processors that have yet to be reimbursed by the Plan are recorded as claims payable in the accompanying Statements of Net assets Available for Plan Benefits and Plan Benefit Obligations.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Subsequent Events: In preparing these financial statements, the Plan Administrator has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through January 30, 2026, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3. Information Certified by the Trustee

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments held at May 31, 2025 and 2024, and investment transactions and related income and the fair value of these investments for the year ended May 31, 2025, was obtained by management and agreed to information certified as complete and accurate by Manufacturers and Traders Trust Company, (the trustee of the Plan).

Note 4. Investments and Fair Value Measurements

The Plan measures on a recurring basis its investments at fair value in accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) codification topic *Fair Value Measurements*, which provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that are accessible to the Plan. These generally provide the most reliable evidence and are used to measure fair value whenever available.

- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include significant inputs, other than Level 1 inputs, which are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full term of the asset through corroboration with observable market data. Level 2 inputs include quoted prices for similar assets in active markets, quoted market prices in markets that are not active for identical or similar assets, and other observable inputs.

- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The inputs or methodology used for valuing investments are not an indication of the risk associated with investing in those securities.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at May 31, 2025 and 2024.

Money market funds: Shares of money market funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the funds. The funds held by the Plan are money market funds registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. Money market funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. Inputs used to determine the fair value of the Plan’s investments are considered to be Level 1.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain investments or financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5. Benefit Obligations

Health costs incurred by participants and their beneficiaries up to \$280,000 for the years ended May 31, 2025, and May 31, 2024 per illness are covered by contributions from the Plan Sponsor. Health costs incurred by participants and their beneficiaries that exceed the covered amounts per illness are then covered by insurance contracts maintained by the Plan. The Plan generally provides no post-employment benefits. Under certain conditions, a former employee may obtain coverage by contributing at pre-determined rates for a limited time. Therefore, the Plan has no post-retirement benefit obligation.

Plan obligations on May 31, 2025, and 2024, for claims incurred by participants but not reported at that date are measured at the estimated ultimate cost to the Plan of settling the claims. Estimated ultimate cost reflects the Plan's obligation to pay claims to or for participants, regardless of status of employment beyond May 31, 2025, and 2024, pursuant to the provisions of the Plan. The method used to derive the estimated unpaid claims liability applies the completion factor to a monthly average of the past several months of medical and drug claims, which is then adjusted as needed based on actual subsequent period claims paid.

Note 6. Termination of the Plan

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to modify the benefits provided to and contributions required of participants, to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, remaining assets will be applied in a uniform and nondiscriminatory manner toward the provision of benefits for or on account of the participants. No assets of the Plan may revert to the Company or be used for purposes other than for the exclusive benefit of the Plan's participants.

Note 7. Tax Status

The Trust established under the Plan to hold the Plan's assets is qualified pursuant to Section 501 (c) (9) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), and accordingly, the Trust's net investment income is exempt from income taxes. The Plan has obtained a favorable tax determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service. Although the Plan has been subsequently amended, management believes that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and that the Trust continues to be tax exempt.

Note 7. Tax Status (Continued)

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of May 31, 2025, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in a money market fund. Money market funds are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the minimal level of risk associated with money market funds, it is unlikely, but remotely possible, that changes in the values of the money market fund could occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

The Plan's estimate of benefit obligations is reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, health care inflation rates and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near-term would-be material to the financial statements.

Note 9. Related Party Transactions

Plan investments are shares of a money market fund managed by Manufacturers and Traders Trust Company Trust Company, Trustee of the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.
