Independent Auditor's Report

To the Participants and Administrative Committee of
The Geneva School 401(k) Retirement Plan:

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of The Geneva School 401(k) Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2025 and 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended June 30, 2025, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Geneva School 401(k) Retirement Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended June 30, 2025 and 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of The Geneva School 401(k) Retirement Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about The Geneva School 401(k) Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are issued.

(1) Description of Plan

The following description of The Geneva School 401(k) Retirement Plan (“the Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

(a) *General*

The Plan was originally established July 1, 2004, and was amended and restated effective January 12, 2021. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of The Geneva School (“the School”). All full-time employees are eligible to participate in the Plan the first day of each month after three months of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

(b) *Contributions*

Each year, participants may elect to make before-tax or roth contributions up to limits established by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch- up contributions as permitted by the IRC. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (“rollover contributions”). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investments options offered by the Plan. Participant contributions are transferred to the Plan throughout the year.

The employer makes matching contributions on a contributing participant’s elective contributions as determined by the School each year. For the year ended June 30, 2025, the School matched contributions to eligible employees equal to 50% of participant’s elective deferrals not to exceed 2% of participant’s qualified compensation. During 2025, the total employer contributions to the Plan were \$102,022.

All participant and employer contributions are subject to the limitations specified by the Plan and the Internal Revenue Code and Regulations.

(c) *Participant Accounts*

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, and employer matching contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant contributions, eligible compensation, participant account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Each participant directs the investment of his or her account to any of the investment options available under the Plan.

(d) *Vesting*

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the School's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100 percent vested after three years of credited service. Participants of the age of 55 or older become immediately vested at 100%.

Vesting rights accrue as follows:

(e) *Notes Receivable from Participants*

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms are usually a maximum of five years except for the purchase or construction of a primary residence, which may be longer. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest as of the date the loan is granted. Interest rates are commensurate with those used by the local commercial lenders for loans granted under similar circumstances. Loans outstanding at June 30, 2025 have interest rates ranging from 5.75% - 9.50%.

(f) Retirement, Death, and Disability

A participant is entitled to 100% of his or her account balance upon retirement, death, or disability.

(g) Payment and Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or installment payments as requested by the participant.

(h) Forfeitures

Any matching contributions and earnings credited to an employee's account that have not vested upon that employee's termination are used to first pay plan administrative cost and then to reduce future employer matching contributions. At June 30, 2025 and 2024, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$1,223 and \$1,074 respectively. During 2025, no forfeitures were used to reduce future employer matching contributions and administrative costs.

(i) Administrative and Investment Management Expenses

Investment management fees are charged to the Plan as a reduction of investment return and included in the investment income (loss) reported by the Plan. All other expenses of the Plan are paid by the School.

(j) Hardship Withdrawals

Subject to certain limits set by the Plan, hardship withdrawals will be considered for participants for certain medical expenses, to pay the costs related to the purchase of a principal residence, payment of tuition and related educational fees for the next twelve months of post-secondary education, and payments to prevent eviction from a principal residence. Hardship withdrawals may be made once in a twelve-month period and will be paid as soon as practical following the receipt of all information necessary to make payment. Participants will be suspended from making Elective Contributions to this Plan or any other qualified or nonqualified plan(s) of their Employer for six months following the hardship withdrawal. The withdrawal may not exceed the amount necessary to meet the need but may include amounts necessary to pay federal, state or local income taxes and penalties resulting from the withdrawal. The withdrawal may be subject to both the additional 10% federal tax penalty described below and ordinary income tax.

(j) *Hardship Withdrawals (Continued)*

Hardship withdrawals may be made only if there are no other resources available to meet the financial need, including loans from this Plan (if provided under the Plan) or any other plan(s) maintained by the Employer. Hardship withdrawals may not be rolled over to another qualified employer plan or an Individual Retirement Account.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) *Basis of Accounting*

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

(b) *Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes in net assets and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(c) *Notes Receivable from Participants*

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their amortized cost. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis.

(d) *Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

Investments are reported at fair value, except for the Key Guarantee Portfolio Fund, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

(d) Investment Valuation and Income Recognition (Continued)

Interest income is recognized when earned. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Realized gains and losses on investments are recognized upon the sale of the related investment and unrealized appreciation or depreciation is recognized at period end when carrying values of the related investments are adjusted to their fair values. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis.

(e) Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the high level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

(f) Benefits Paid

The Plan records benefit payments when paid.

(3) Fair Value Measurements

FASB Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value and enhances disclosures about fair value measurements required under other accounting pronouncements, but does not change existing guidance as to whether or not an instrument is carried at fair value. The fair value of our financial instruments is based on the closing market prices of the instruments when applicable, or alternatively, valuations utilizing market data and other observable inputs, inclusive of the risk of nonperformance. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

(3) Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2025 and 2024.

Mutual funds - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ('NAV') and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

(4) Group Annuity Contract

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment group annuity contract with Empower Life & Annuity Insurance Company of New York (the "insurance company"), which is called the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund and totaled \$259,899 and \$310,247 at June 30, 2025 and 2024, respectively. The insurance company maintains the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The insurance company is contractually obligated to pay the principal and specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the insurance company but may not be less than 0.10%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

(4) Group Annuity Contract (Continued)

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

(5) Certification of Investment Information

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held and notes receivable from participants at June 30, 2025 and 2024; net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of the investments and interest and dividends for the year ended June 30, 2025, were obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Empower Trust Company, LLC, the trustee of the Plan.

(6) Tax Status

The Company has adopted a Great-West Trust Company Defined Contribution Prototype Plan and Trust that received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated June 30, 2020. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, however the Company and its counsel believe the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with the IRC and that, therefore, the Plan is tax exempt.

(7) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

(8) Party-In-Interest

Certain Plan investments are managed by Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company, who is the parent company of Empower Retirement (the Plan Trustee). These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan's participants for the investment management and recordkeeping services amounted to \$45,253 for the year ended June 30, 2025.

(9) Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through January 27, 2026, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
