NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 and 2023

(1) DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Overbrook Friedlander Programs 403(b) Plan (“*Plan*”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

A. General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Overbrook Friedlander Programs (the “*Programs*”). The Plan was adopted January 1, 1990. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (*ERISA*). All employees who complete a minimum of 20 hours per week and have completed a minimum of four months of service are eligible to participate in the Plan.

B. Contributions

The Plan provides for employer and employee contributions. The Plan documents stipulate that the Programs may elect to make discretionary and/or matching contributions to the Plan. Eligible employees are not required to participate in the plan (make elective deferrals) to receive the discretionary contributions. In 2024, the Programs elected to match 60% of employee elective deferrals, capped at 5% of employees’ gross compensation and contribute 3% of an employee’s gross salaries for all eligible employees who complete a minimum of four months of service.

C. Participants Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution, the Programs’ match, and allocation of the Plan’s earnings. The Plan had \$9,745 and \$9,315 in an unallocated account as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

D. Vesting

Participants are fully vested in employer and employee contributions immediately upon contribution to the Plan.

E. Participant Loans

The Plan’s permits participants to borrow funds against vested account balances. In general, the maximum amount that can be borrowed is the lesser of 50% of a participant’s vested interest or \$50,000, at a reasonable rate of interest. Loans are generally repaid within five years. Interest is charged at prime rate plus 1%.

F. Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, and at any time during the plan year, a participant may direct all future employee and employer contributions into any of the investment options available under the Plan.

G. Payment of Benefits

A participant’s vested benefits will normally be distributed to the participant or the participant’s beneficiary upon retirement, disability or death of the participant.

H. Administration

The Programs is the administrator of the Plan. Nationwide Financial has been designated as the custodian and trustee of the Plan. Nationwide Financial maintains individual participant account records and advises the Plan on other matters related to the operation of the Plan.

(2) SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Shares of registered investment companies are valued at quoted market prices which represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Benefits are recorded when paid.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(3) INVESTMENTS

The Plan's investments are held in directed trusts. There are several investment options available to the participants at the time of this report. Participant accounts are allocated based on the decisions of the individual participants. The following information included in the accompanying financial statements was obtained from data that has been prepared and certified as complete and accurate by the Plan's trustee:

The Plan utilized various methods to measure the fair value of its investments on a recurring basis. Generally accepted accounting principles establish a hierarchy that prioritizes inputs to valuation methods. The three levels of inputs are described below:

Level 1 – Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Observable inputs other than quoted prices included in Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly. These inputs may include quoted prices for the identical instrument on an inactive market, prices for similar instruments, interest rates, prepayment speeds, credit risk, yield curves, default rates and similar data.

Level 3 – Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability, to the extent relevant observable inputs are not available, representing the Plan’s own assumptions about the assumptions a market participant would use in valuing the asset or liability, and would be based on the best information available.

The inputs methodology used for valuing securities are not necessarily an indication of the risk associated with investing in those securities.

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Programs has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

(5) TAX STATUS

The trust, established under a prototype plan to hold the Plan's assets, is qualified pursuant to the appropriate section of the Internal Revenue Code, and, accordingly, the trust's net investment income is exempt from income taxes. Although the Plan has been amended, the Plan sponsor believes that the Plan continues to qualify and to operate as designed. Management has reviewed the tax positions for each of its open tax years (2021 – 2023) or expected to be taken in the Plan's 2024 tax return and has concluded that there are no uncertain tax positions that would require recognition in the financial statements.

(6) RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in shares of registered investment companies which employ various investment strategies. The investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

(7) PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain administrative costs of the Plan are paid by the employer/sponsor.

(8) SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events after the balance sheet date through the date that the financial statements were available for issuance, February 27, 2026, have been evaluated in the preparation of the financial statements.
