### ***Opinion***

**Notes to Financial Statements**

July 31, 2025 and 2024

**Note 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**Method of Accounting** - The accompanying financial statements of Local Union 531, I.B.E.W. & N.E.C.A. Money Purchase Pension Plan (the Plan) have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

**Investments** - Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. For all other investments, the fair value of a financial instrument is the amount that would be received to sell that asset (or paid to transfer a liability) in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (the exit price). Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Purchases and sales of the investments are reflected on a trade-date basis.

Dividend income is recorded on the ex dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis.

**Contributions Receivable** - Contractor contributions, including reciprocal contributions, due and unpaid prior to year end, are recorded as contributions receivable. Contractor contributions due as determined by payroll compliance audits are recorded upon settlement with the contractor. An allowance for uncollectible accounts is considered unnecessary and is not provided.

**Contractor Contribution Income** - Contractor contributions are recognized in the period in which covered work is performed, based on the number of hours worked in covered employment and the contribution rate set forth in the collective bargaining agreement. Contractors are required to remit contributions monthly. The Plan carries out its purpose described in Note 2 within a jurisdiction primarily located in La Porte, Porter, Jasper, Pulaski and Starke counties in Indiana.

## **Note 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)**

**Reciprocal Contributions** - The Plan has entered into reciprocity agreements with various other multiemployer retirement plans for its participants who perform work outside the geographic jurisdiction of the local union. Participants who are normally employed within the territory of one local union (home local) may be temporarily employed within the territory of another local union. When a participant works in the territory of a reciprocating local union, the Plan is required to make contributions to the participant's home local benefit plans on the participant's behalf. The Plan's contribution revenue includes monies received pursuant to reciprocity agreements. The Plan uses the same recognition and measurement criteria for such revenue as for all other contractor contribution revenue. Amounts paid to other plans under the terms of reciprocity agreements are not reflected in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits, as the amounts received are not revenue earned by the Plan, and the corresponding payments are not an expense of the Plan. The Plan recognizes a liability upon receiving reciprocal contributions on behalf of non-participants working within the jurisdiction of the local union, and recognizes a decrease in that liability upon remitting those contributions to the appropriate plan. Contractor contributions included reciprocal contributions of \$1,524,128 and \$1,157,212 for the years ended July 31, 2025 and 2024, respectively, from various other retirement plans under the terms of reciprocity agreements. The Plan remitted a total of \$1,657,268 and \$1,404,623 in reciprocal contributions to various other retirement plans under the terms of reciprocity agreements for the years ended July 31, 2025 and 2024, respectively.

**Payment of Benefits** - Benefits paid to participants are recorded upon distribution. There were no participants who elected to withdraw from the Plan but were not yet paid at either July 31, 2025 or 2024.

**Expenses** - Certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

**Estimates** - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Subsequent Events** - Subsequent events have been evaluated through February 17, 2026, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

## **Note 2. Description of the Plan**

The Plan was established during 1986 as a result of collective bargaining agreements between the union and various contractor associations to provide retirement, disability and survivor benefits for eligible participants. The Plan is primarily funded by contractor contributions as specified in the collective bargaining agreements. The Plan is a multiemployer defined contribution retirement plan and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. Benefits under the Plan are not insured by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation.

**Note 2. Description of the Plan (continued)**

Under current Plan provisions, each participant's account is immediately vested in all contractor contributions received on the participant's behalf. Upon death, disability, retirement or separation from service for more than one year, participants are entitled to receive their account balance subject to the payment provisions of the Plan.

Each participant's account is credited with contractor contributions made on their behalf, as well as allocations of Plan earnings or losses. Investment income or loss is credited to participant accounts on a daily basis based on the participant's investment options. An administrative fee is deducted from each participant's account on a quarterly basis. The benefit to which participants are entitled is the benefit that can be provided from their account.

Participants may direct contributions made on their behalf in a variety of investment options. In the absence of participant direction, contributions are invested in default investment funds. Participants may change their investment options as permitted under the Plan provisions. Participants must evaluate their own investment goals and objectives and choose the investment options best suited to achieve those goals and objectives. Poor investment performance by the investment options selected by the participants may cause their vested account balance to be lower than the contractor contributions made to the Plan on their behalf.

Included in net assets available for benefits is an administrative reserve, which is available to pay administrative expenses and establish participant accounts for contractor contributions that are deemed delinquent. At July 31, 2025 and 2024, a total of approximately \$142,000 and \$124,000 respectively, was held in the administrative reserve.

Participants should refer to the summary plan description for more complete information.

**Note 3. Priorities upon Termination**

It is the intent of the Trustees to continue the Plan in full force and effect; however, the right to discontinue the Plan is reserved to the Trustees. Termination shall not permit any part of the Plan assets to be used for or diverted to purposes other than the exclusive benefit of the participants and their beneficiaries, except that provision may be made for the payment of necessary expenses resulting from termination of the Plan.

In the event of termination, the net assets of the Plan will be allocated to pay benefits in priorities as prescribed by ERISA and its related regulations. Whether or not a particular participant will receive full benefits should the Plan terminate at some future time will depend on the sufficiency of the Plan's net assets at that time and the priority of those benefits.

#### **Note 4. Tax Status**

The Plan's determination letter is dated March 1, 2016, in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code and was, therefore, exempt from federal income taxes under the provisions of Section 501(a). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. The Plan's administrator and the Plan's legal counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code, and therefore believe that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by tax authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

#### **Note 5. Funding Policy**

Contractor contributions are made under various negotiated collective bargaining agreements. The contribution rate per hour worked ranged from \$3.25 to \$10.70 for the years ended July 31, 2025 and 2024.

#### **Note 6. Guaranteed Income Fund**

The Plan has a traditional insurance contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower) with a contract value of \$19,070,889 and \$18,956,970 at July 31, 2025 and 2024, respectively. Empower maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The group annuity contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and crediting interest rates that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rates are declared in advance and are guaranteed for six month periods (January 1 through June 30 and July 1 through December 31). The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer but may not be less than 1.5%.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower, represents deposits made to the contract, plus earnings at guaranteed crediting rates, less withdrawals and fees. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

## **Note 6. Guaranteed Income Fund (continued)**

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity was provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or the other Plan sponsor events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, and (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

## **Note 7. Fair Value Measurements**

The *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures* Topic of the FASB Accounting Standards Codification established a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

### Basis of Fair Value Measurement

Level 1	Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities
Level 2	Quoted prices in markets that are not considered to be active or financial instruments for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly
Level 3	Prices or valuations that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable

## Note 7. Fair Value Measurements (continued)

The following tables set forth by level within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's investment assets at fair value as of July 31, 2025 and 2024. As required, assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. In accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, certain investments that are measured at fair value using the net asset value per share (or its equivalent) practical expedient have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in the following tables are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the amounts presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

### Level 1 Measurements

The fair values of the mutual funds are determined by reference to the funds' underlying assets, which are principally marketable equity and fixed income securities. Shares held in mutual funds are traded on national securities exchanges and are valued at the net asset value on the last business day of each period presented.

## **Note 7. Fair Value Measurements (continued)**

### Measurements Using Net Asset Value as a Practical Expedient

The collective investment funds and pooled funds are valued at the net asset value per share, used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The net asset value is based on the fair values of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported net asset value.

The collective investment funds and pooled funds are direct filing entities (DFEs) and file a Form 5500 annual report with the U.S. Department of Labor. The Plan is not required to disclose the significant investment strategies of DFE investments. Redemptions are available on a daily basis without notice.

## **Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments securities it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Due to inherent uncertainties involved in the valuation of investments that are not publicly traded, estimated fair values may differ materially from the values that would have been used had a ready market for the underlying securities existed.

## **Note 9. Related Organizations**

The Plan is related to a pension plan and a local union. At July 31, 2025, the Plan owed \$1,002 to the related pension plan for a refund that was inadvertently deposited into the Plan's checking account.

## **Note 10. Major Contractors**

Contributions from one contractor accounted for approximately 10% of total contributions for the year ended July 31, 2025. Contributions from two contractors accounted for approximately 49% of total contributions for the year ended July 31, 2024. In the event these contractors were to suspend contributions, the Plan would retain the risk of meeting certain fixed administrative expenses until the appropriate adjustments were made.

**Note 11. Party-in-Interest Transactions**

The Plan incurs expenses under several arrangements with service providers, and receives contributions from contractors under the terms of collective bargaining agreements.

All Plan investments are managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company (Empower). Empower is the recordkeeper for the Plan, and provides certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to an Administrative Services Agreement (ASA) between the Plan and Empower.

These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.
