Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 – Description of Plan

The following description of the Redi Service, LLC (the Sponsor) 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of the Company (and the affiliated company Redi Project Services, LLC) who have completed 3 months of service and are age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan was originally established as of January 1, 2007, and has been subsequently amended and restated effective January 1, 2022. The Plan trustees are responsible for oversight of the Plan. They determine the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitor investment performance.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan and subject to limitations. The Company makes matching contributions equal to 100% of the first 4% of annual compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The Company may make discretionary profit sharing contributions at the option of the Company's board of directors. No discretionary contributions were made by the Sponsor for the period January 1, 2023 to June 7, 2023.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's contribution, account earnings, and may be charged with an allocation of certain administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. All participant accounts are participant-directed, including any Company contribution.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment to the Plan, a participant may direct deferrals and employer contributions in any of the funds offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their account balances.

Payment of Benefits

Withdrawals are allowed in the event of termination, disability, death, retirement, or attainment of age 59.5. Depending on the event, the withdrawal may be subject to early withdrawal penalties imposed by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Payments are made in the form of a lump-sum distribution or installment payments. In-service and Hardship distributions are allowed if certain criteria is met.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Notes receivable repayment terms generally may not exceed five years. The notes receivable are secured by the balance in a participant's account and bear an interest at rate which is commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions. Effective June 7, 2023, the Plan was terminated. See Note 6 for additional information.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are presented under the accruals method of accounting in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is based on quoted prices for identical assets in active markets. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid by the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the Plan document. Management of the Plan estimates that these notes are fully collectible and therefore has no reserve for bad debt.

Concentrations of Credit Risk

Financial instruments, which potentially subject the Plan to concentrations of credit risk, consist primarily of marketable securities. Marketable securities are subject to daily changes in market valuations. The Plan believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk on cash and cash funds.

Subsequent Events

Management of the Plan has evaluated subsequent events through February 24, 2026, which is also the date the financial statements were available to be issued. No subsequent events were noted during this evaluation that require recognition or disclosure in these financial statements.

Expenses

Certain operating expenses of the Plan are deducted from participant accounts and the remaining expenses paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of those investments.

Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements

The Plan discloses and recognizes the fair value of its assets and liabilities in accordance with Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurement and Disclosures (ASC 820) which among other things, defines fair value and provides enhanced disclosures about investments that are measured and reported at fair value. ASC 820 establishes a hierarchal disclosure framework, which prioritizes and ranks the level of market price observability used in measuring investments at fair value. A number of factors, including the type of investment and the characteristics specific to the investment, impact market price observability. Investments with readily available active quoted prices generally will have a higher degree of market price observability and a lesser degree of judgment used in measuring fair value.

Investments measured and reported at fair value are classified and disclosed in one of the following categories:

- Level 1 inputs, which have the highest priority, are quoted prices for identical assets in active markets.
- Level 2 inputs are observable inputs other than quoted prices included in Level 1, such as quoted prices for similar assets in active markets or quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not active.
- Level 3 inputs, which have the lowest priority, are unobservable inputs that reflect the Plan’s own assumptions, consistent with reasonably available assumptions made by other market participants.

Inputs are used in applying the various valuation techniques and broadly refer to the assumptions that market participants use to make valuation decisions, including assumptions about risk. Inputs may include price information, volatility statistics, specific and broad credit data, liquidity statistics, and other factors. An investment’s level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value, including the general classification of such instruments pursuant to the valuation hierarchy.

Pooled Separate Accounts - Valued at NAV based on account’s underlying investments as determined by the fund’s issuer. Redemptions from these accounts generally can be made daily and are determined to have a readily determinable fair value.

Note 4 – Certified Information

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at June 7, 2023 and December 31, 2022, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest income for the period from January 1, 2023 to June 7, 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (the trustee of the Plan).

Note 5 – Investments at Contract Value

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with John Hancock Life Insurance Company (John Hancock). John Hancock maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. John Hancock is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, the contract is measured at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by John Hancock, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawals or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. There are no reserve against contract value for credit risk.

Certain events, such as the premature termination of the contract by the Plan or the termination of the Plan, would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with John Hancock. The plan administrator believes the occurrence of such events is not probable.

Note 6 – Plan Termination

The Sponsor, according to its right under the Plan, discontinued its contributions and terminated the Plan following the spin-off to a Pooled Employer Plan on June 7, 2023. As of June 7, 2023, all Plan assets had been transferred out from the Plan.

Note 7 – Income Tax Status

The Plan participates in a prototype plan sponsored by National benefits Services LLC. The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed National Benefits Services LLC by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has not obtained a separate determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service. Although the Plan has been amended since the date of the determination letter received by National Benefits Services LLC, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan as then designed was in accordance with the requirements to qualify for tax-exempt status.

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Note 8 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9 – Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan received custodial services from John Hancock Life Insurance Company (the trustee), auditing services from Richey, May & Co, LLP, and recordkeeper services from John Hancock. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The majority of the fees for administration are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investments as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. Also, several employees of the Company provided various services to the Plan (at no cost to the Plan) including a portion of the administrative functions of the Plan, plan operations, and investment review. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.
