Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2025 Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of EEI Pension Program, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of June 30, 2025, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year then ended and the related notes to the financial statements (modified cash basis) (2025 Financial Statements).

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of EEI Pension Program's 2025 financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of and for the year ended June 30, 2025, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 8 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion on the 2025 Financial Statements

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2025 Financial Statements section

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying 2025 financial statements, other than

those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2.

- The information in the accompanying 2025 financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by qualified institutions agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by institutions that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion on the 2025 Financial Statements

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2025 Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of EEI Pension Program and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter- Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 to the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements and supplemental schedule are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the 2025 Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2, and for determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. NOTE 1 Description of Plan

The following description of EEI Pension Program (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a tax-sheltered annuity plan covering substantially all employees of Ecumenical Enterprises, Inc. (the "Company") who have completed at least 975 hours of service and are age eighteen or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Board of Directors is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's Board of Directors.

Change in custodian

Empower Trust Company (the predecessor custodian) was the custodian of the Plan's assets as of June 30, 2024 and for the period July 1, 2024 through August 21, 2024.

As of August 22, 2024, Lincoln Financial Group Trust Company, Inc. (the successor custodian) was appointed the custodian of the Plan.

The custodians held and managed the Plan assets subject to the direction of the Plan administrator and Plan participants, for the respective periods as discussed above.

Contributions

Participants can elect to make salary deferral contributions based upon annual compensation to the Plan, subject to certain IRS statutory limits. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Special IRC Section 403(b) catch-up contributions are permitted as well, if a participant has fifteen years of service, as defined. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the plan. The Company makes discretionary matching contributions up to 4% of participants' pretax annual compensation during the plan year. The Company will not match elective deferrals that exceed 4% of participants' pretax annual compensation. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, and the Company's contribution, as well as allocations of Plan earnings (losses). Participant accounts are charged with allocations of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan, if any. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. Participants self-direct the investments in their own accounts. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow from their fund account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance in the Plan, whichever is less. The notes are secured by the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of benefits

On termination of service, death, disability or retirement, a participant or beneficiary is entitled to receive a distribution of the participant's vested account balance.

The participant may elect to receive the distribution as a single lump sum payment, installments, annuity distribution, direct rollover to the participant's individual retirement account (IRA) or to another Company tax qualified plan. If a participant's account balance is greater than \$5,000, he may also elect to receive the distribution in installments, or defer receiving payments until age 70 1/2.

For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service on a scale as follows:

Forfeitures

When certain terminations of participation in the Plan occur, the non-vested portion of the participant's account represents a forfeiture. At June 30, 2025 and 2024, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$9,303 and \$4,398, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or pay plan expenses.

SECURE 2.0 Act

On December 29, 2022, Securing a Strong Retirement Act of 2022 ("SECURE 2.0") was signed into law. SECURE 2.0 includes both required and optional provisions with effective dates through January 1, 2027. In 2023, the Plan began implementing certain provisions of SECURE 2.0, as approved by the Plan Administrator. Management intends to adopt the required amendments within the amendment period as prescribed by Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") guidelines.

NOTE 2 Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The Plan's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the modified cash basis of accounting; consequently, certain revenues and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. However, certain investments are adjusted to fair value under the modified cash basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodian. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the cash basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing

investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract.

The Plan administrator does not believe that any events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Interest income is recognized when received. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Investment management and recordkeeping service fees are borne by the Plan. Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which they are received.

NOTE 4 Fair value measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

The Plan's policy is to recognize transfers of investments into or out of Level 3 as of the date of the event or change in circumstances that caused the transfer. For the year ended June 30, 2025, there were no transfers into or out of Level 3. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 3 inputs for the periods presented.

NOTE 5 Related party transactions and party-in-interest transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by the custodians (see Note 8). Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services amounted to \$15,570 for the year ended June 30, 2025.

The aforementioned custodians provide certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to a service agreement between the Company and the custodians and the custodians' respective agents. The custodians receive revenue from service providers for services the custodians provide to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to the custodians from the Plan for its administrative services to the Plan.

These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 6 Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contributions and related earnings.

NOTE 7 Tax status

The Company has adopted a pre-approved document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated March 31, 2017, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified.

NOTE 8 Information certified by custodians

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at June 30, 2025 and 2024, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended June 30, 2025, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Lincoln Financial Group Trust Company, Inc.
