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## INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Plan Administrator  
Scott Bridge Company, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Scott Bridge Company, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan (Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of May 31, 2025 and 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended May 31, 2025, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of May 31, 2025 and 2024, and for the year ended May 31, 2025, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### Opinion on the Financial Statements

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### Basis for Opinion on the Financial Statements

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

### 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Scott Bridge Company, Inc. (Sponsor) Profit Sharing Plan (Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the official plan documents for complete information.

**General** - The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Sponsor who have completed one month of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Sponsor and Plan Administrator are responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Sponsor, utilizing the recommendations of advisors, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

**Contributions** - Participants may contribute a portion of pretax or post tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Such transfers from other qualified plans are reported as rollover contributions. After one month of service, eligible employees are automatically enrolled with a contribution of 3% of compensation, as defined by the Plan, in the absence of making an election not to participate. The participant's deferral amount will increase 1% each Plan Year up to a maximum of 10% of plan compensation, in the absence of making a different election. The Sponsor may make discretionary matching contributions and additional discretionary profit sharing contributions to the Plan. During the year ended May 31, 2025 the employer made both a discretionary matching contribution and a profit sharing contribution (\$300,000). The profit sharing contribution was allocated among the eligible participants during the third quarter of 2025. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations. Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

**Participant Accounts** - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's and the Sponsor's contributions, an allocation of net Plan earnings, and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting** - Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and any income or loss thereon. Participants are fully vested in the Sponsor's discretionary contributions, and any income or loss thereon, after six years of service.

**Payment of Benefits** - Upon termination of service, due to death, disability, retirement or separation of service, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or other payments under various options. The Plan also permits in-service withdrawals when a participant attains the age of 59 ½ or due to circumstances of financial hardship in accordance with provisions specified in the Plan document.

**Forfeitures** - Forfeitures may be allocated to the accounts of qualifying participants or pay Plan expenses. Unallocated forfeiture balances totaled approximately \$312,000 and \$227,000 for the Plan years ended May 31, 2025 and 2024, respectively.

### 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

**Basis of Accounting** - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP). Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. In preparing the financial statements, management evaluated subsequent events through the date of the independent auditors' report, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**Use of Estimates** - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition** - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Sponsor determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and trustees. See note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

**Concentration of Market Risk** - As of May 31, 2025 approximately 49% of the Plan's net assets were invested in one mutual fund and one fixed account. As of May 31, 2024, approximately 54% of the Plan's net assets were invested in one mutual fund and one fixed account. The underlying value of the investments are dependent on the performance of the individual investment holdings and the market's evaluation of such performance. It is at least reasonably possible that changes in the fair value of the investments and their investment holdings in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**Notes Receivable from Participants** - The Plan does not permit loans to be made to participants.

**Payment of Benefits** - Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses** - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Sponsor and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. Administrative expenses include fees related to administration of payment of benefits that are charged directly to the participant's account and certain trustee fees, investment advisory fees, other plan fees, and other recordkeeping fees paid by the Plan. Certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments.

### 3. CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments held at May 31, 2025 and 2024, and net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments, and interest and dividends for the year ended May 31, 2025, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower Annuity Insurance of America at May 31, 2025 and 2024.

### 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs which are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There were no changes in the methodologies used at May 31, 2025 or 2024.

Mutual funds: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded at the close of every business day.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**5. INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY**

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive group annuity contract / group funding agreement with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the investment contract at May 31, 2025 and 2024, was \$8,086,410 and \$9,838,728, respectively. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer. The crediting rate at May 31, 2025 and 2024 was 2.91% and 3.98%, respectively.

Certain events, such as the premature termination of the contract by the Plan or the termination of the Plan, would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. The plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

### **6. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, the trustees of the Plan during the years ended May 31, 2025 and 2024. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. As described in note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are considered related party transactions.

### **7. PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right, under the Plan, to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants' accounts would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

### **8. INCOME TAX STATUS**

The Plan adopted a standardized form of a volume submitter plan. The prototype plan has received a determination letter dated June 30, 2020 from the IRS as to the prototype plan's qualified status. The prototype plan opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. Although the plan has been amended since the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code, and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, including the IRS; however, there are currently no examinations for any tax periods in progress.

### **9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amount reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
