Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Safe-Harbor 401(k) for Employees of The Lord's Place, Inc. (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2025 and 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended June 30, 2025, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 – Description of Plan

The following description of the Safe-Harbor 401(k) for Employees of The Lord's Place, Inc. (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General and eligibility

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established on January 1, 1994, for the benefit of eligible employees of The Lord's Place, Inc. (the Agency, the Employer or Plan Sponsor). The Plan has been amended and restated over the years to, among other things, comply with certain tax legislation. Eligible employees may enter the Plan upon full time employment with the Agency, as defined in the Plan document. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Mutual of America Life Insurance Company (Mutual of America or the Custodian) is the Plan's Custodian and recordkeeper. The Agency is the Plan Administrator. Mutual of America holds all investment assets of the Plan in accordance with the service provider contract with the Agency. The Plan Administrator and the Custodian determine the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitor investment performance.

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of their annual compensation, as defined, within the limits prescribed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollover). The Plan also allows for Roth 401(k) contributions.

The Plan includes an auto enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 1% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Automatic enrollment deferral contributions are increased by 1% each year subsequent to enrollment up to 3%. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Agency makes safe-harbor nonelective contributions to the Plan. Participants who meet the eligibility requirements to participate in the Plan and who have completed two months of credited service are eligible for the Agency's safe-harbor nonelective contributions. For the year ended June 30, 2025, the Agency made safe-harbor nonelective contributions equal to 100% of a participant's elective deferrals contributed during the Plan year that do not exceed 3% of a participant's eligible compensation, as defined. The Agency may also make discretionary matching contributions. Participants must complete one year of credited service in order to receive the Agency's discretionary matching contribution. The Agency's contributions totaled \$212,246 for the year ended June 30, 2025. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, and an allocation of (a) Employer's contributions, and (b) Plan earnings or losses thereon, and is charged with his or her withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or losses, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. All participant contributions are participant-directed and may be invested in one fund or allocated among the Plan's investment options.

Note 1 – Description of Plan, Continued

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their individual voluntary contributions and the Employer's safe-harbor nonelective contributions, plus actual earnings or losses thereon. Vesting in the Agency's discretionary matching contribution portion of their individual accounts (if any), plus earnings or losses thereon, is based on years of credited service. A participant is 100% vested in their Employer's discretionary matching contributions after two (2) years of credited service.

The Agency's discretionary matching contributions, plus actual earnings or losses thereon, vest according to the following schedule:

Participants become fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age (65), death, disability, or Plan termination. Participants who terminate for any other reason are entitled to the vested amount of their accounts.

Forfeitures

Forfeited nonvested accounts are used to reduce the Agency's future contributions or pay Plan administrative expenses. No forfeitures were utilized for the year ended June 30, 2025. As of June 30, 2025 and 2024, available forfeited nonvested balances totaled \$6,215 and \$2,943, respectively.

Payment of benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum distribution, or in monthly installments or a rollover into another qualified plan. Funds may also be accessed prior to the date they become distributable by way of a financial hardship in accordance with the Plan's specified provisions and IRS guidelines. Participants may also withdraw their vested account balances at any time on or after age 59½, if certain criteria are met.

Notes receivable from participants

Plan participants are permitted to borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years unless the loan is used to acquire the principal residence of the participant which must be repaid in a reasonable period of time not to exceed ten years. Loans are secured by the vested account balance in the participant's account, and bear interest at the prime rate plus 1%. A participant may only have two (2) loans outstanding at any time. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. Principal and interest are repaid through regular payroll deductions.

Plan administration

The Plan is administered by the Agency pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Plan document. Mutual of America serves as the Custodian of the Plan, provides recordkeeping, reporting, and Plan accounting services, and holds the Plan's investment assets. Participant and Plan Sponsor contributions are held and managed by the Custodian who invests cash received, and makes distributions to participants (subject to participants' directions). Fees from covered service providers of the Plan are in compliance with the Department of Labor's (DOL) regulations regarding ERISA Section 408(b)(2).

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit responsive investment contract which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's Custodian and advisor.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates and those differences may be material.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the high level of risk associated with certain investment securities, including the uncertainty related to changes in the values of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in such risks in the near-term would materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. If a participant ceases to make repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant note to be a distribution, the note receivable balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of June 30, 2025 and 2024.

Payment of benefits

The Plan records benefits when paid.

Plan expenses

Administrative expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Agency and are excluded from these financial statements. Certain administrative expenses paid by the Plan consist of record keeping, custodial, and third-party administrator fees. Certain participant directed transactions such as withdrawal processing fees are charged directly to the participants' accounts.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Agency are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Uncertain tax positions

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to assess its uncertain tax positions for the likelihood they would be overturned upon examination by the IRS. In accordance with this guidance, the Plan has determined it does not have any positions at June 30, 2025, that it would be unable to substantiate.

Note 3 – Certified Investment Information

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Mutual of America Life Insurance Company, a qualified institution, has certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown on the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2025 and 2024;
- Net investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended June 30, 2025; and
- Investment information included in the Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (held at end of year) as of June 30, 2025, as shown on the ERISA-required supplemental information.

At the request of the Plan's Administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified information, except for comparing such certified information to the related investment information included in the financial statements, including the disclosures related to the investments to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP, and in the ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including assessing whether the supplemental schedule is in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements

Accounting guidance provides a framework for measuring fair value and establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There have been no changes in the methodology used at June 30, 2025 and 2024. During the year ended June 30, 2025, there were no transfers of financial instruments into or out of Level 3.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value:

Pooled separate accounts (PSAs) – are measured at the net asset value of the mutual funds in which the PSAs solely invest, these mutual funds are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission and are actively traded on national securities exchanges. Accordingly, the PSAs are classified as Level 1 within the fair value hierarchy.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 – Group Annuity Contract with Mutual of America Life Insurance Company

The Plan invests in a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract issued by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company (Mutual of America or the Issuer) with a contract value of \$245,516 and \$300,934 as of June 30, 2025 and 2024, respectively. The Mutual of America Interest Accumulation Account (the Account) is issued and guaranteed by Mutual of America. Contributions made to the Account are maintained in the Interest Accumulation Account which is a group annuity contract issued by Mutual of America.

The Account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Mutual of America is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. Mutual of America may not terminate the contract prior to the scheduled maturity dates.

The contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. Contract value is the relevant measurement for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because it is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported by Mutual of America, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and expenses.

Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of Mutual of America or otherwise. The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on Mutual of America's ability to meet its financial obligations. Mutual of America's ability to meet its obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with Mutual of America. Such events include amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial termination or merger with another plan), changes to the Plan's prohibition or competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor, or other Plan Sponsor events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA or premature termination of the contract.

The Plan Administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the Plan's participants are probable of occurring.

In addition, certain events allow the Issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, a breach of a material obligation under the contract, a material misrepresentation or a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the Issuer.

Based on ongoing credit evaluations of its guaranteed investment contract investments, Plan management does not expect payment defaults or delinquencies and has not recorded an allowance for credit losses for this investment as of June 30, 2025 and 2024.

Note 6 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in Agency's contribution portion of their accounts.

Note 7 – Tax Status

On November 30, 2020, the IRS stated that the non-standardized pre-approved profit-sharing plan adopted by the Plan, as then designed, qualifies under Section 401(a) of the IRC and, therefore, the Plan and the related trust are tax exempt. The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself, however, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan, and related trust, are being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for plan years prior to 2022.

Note 8 – Party-In-Interest Transactions and Related Parties

The Plan's investments are administered, issued and managed by Mutual of America. Mutual of America is the Plan's recordkeeper. Participant loan and processing fees are paid to the Custodian. These transactions with the Custodian qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Such transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA. Certain management, recordkeeping and investment fees in the form of an expense ratio fee to each investment option are paid by the Plan and deducted from earnings on investments.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers and employees of the Employer. No officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan for these services.
