NOTE 1 – Description of the Plan

The following description of the Me & My Big Ideas 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan which covers substantially all employees of Me & My Big Ideas, LLC (the Company) who have completed 30 days of service and are age 18 or older. Union employees, nonresident aliens, reclassified employees, and employees acquired as a result of a transaction described in Internal Revenue Code Section 410(b)(6)(C) are excluded from the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Retirement Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may elect to make after-tax (Roth) contributions to the Plan of up to 100% of eligible compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company may make discretionary matching contributions (Company's contributions) to the Plan. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company made discretionary matching contributions of 50% of a participant's deferral to the Plan. The Company's contributions are invested as directed by the participant. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's contributions, and plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

NOTE 1 – Description of the Plan (Continued)

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants who were active employees on January 1, 2022 or terminated employment on or after January 1, 2022 are also vested immediately in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts. For participants who terminated employment prior to January 1, 2022, the Company's contribution portion of their accounts was subject to a graded vesting schedule under which participants were 20% vested after two years of credited service and 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The plan administrator will determine a reasonable rate of interest by reviewing the interest rates charged for similar types of loans by other lenders. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the vested interest in the participant's account.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$57,747, \$18,310, and \$2,683, respectively. These accounts may be used to reduce future employer contributions or to pay administrative expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2023, employer contributions were reduced by \$126 from forfeited nonvested accounts. No employer contributions were reduced from forfeited nonvested accounts for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 2 – Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Retirement Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from plan participants and the Company's contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024, 2023, or 2022.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2023 and 2022 excess contributions to applicable participants in September 2024 and July 2023, respectively.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value investments.

Subsequent Events

On March 11, 2025, the Board of Managers Committee elected to terminate the Plan effective March 11, 2025. In connection with the Plan termination, the Plan was frozen to new entrants, participant contributions and loan repayments were no longer permitted, and all participants became 100% vested in their accounts. The Plan has not yet fully distributed its assets as of the date of the report.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through February 27, 2026, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – Certified Investments

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya), the custodian of the Plan, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplementary information is complete and accurate with respect to investments:

- Investments at fair value and contract value
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments
- Interest income, except for interest income on notes receivable from participants
- Schedules of assets held at end of year, except for notes receivable from participants

The Plan's independent public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplementary information.

NOTE 4 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022.

Money market fund: Valued on a trade-date basis with accrued interest.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at quoted market prices which represent the number of shares of the respective underlying fund multiplied by the closing net asset value per share quoted by that fund. The use of net asset value as fair value is deemed appropriate as the pooled separate accounts do not have finite lives, unfunded commitments relating to those types of investments, or significant restrictions on redemptions.

NOTE 5 – Guaranteed Interest Contract with Voya

The Plan invests in a benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Voya totaling \$464,472, \$479,598, and \$447,630 as of December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022, respectively. Voya maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1%. The crediting rate is reviewed on an annual basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Voya, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

NOTE 5 – Guaranteed Interest Contract with Voya (Continued)

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 6 – Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are managed by Voya. Voya is the custodian and recordkeeper for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. As described in Note 2, the Plan made a direct payment to the custodian and recordkeeper in 2024 and 2023 of \$1,000 and \$1,300, respectively, which was not covered by revenue sharing. The plan sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

NOTE 7 – Plan Termination

The Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. As discussed in Note 2, the Board of Managers terminated the Plan as of March 11, 2025. In connection with the Plan's termination, participants became 100% vested in the Company's contributions.

NOTE 8 – Tax Status

On June 30, 2020, the IRS stated that the non-standardized pre-approved profit-sharing plan adopted by the Plan, as then designed, qualifies under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself; however, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was designed and was being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

NOTE 8 – Tax Status (Continued)

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2024 and 2023 Financial Statements

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Me & My Big Ideas 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022 and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements (2024 and 2023 financial statements).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the 2024 and 2023 financial statements, is complete and accurate.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

NOTE 1 – Description of the Plan

The following description of the Me & My Big Ideas 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan which covers substantially all employees of Me & My Big Ideas, LLC (the Company) who have completed 30 days of service and are age 18 or older. Union employees, nonresident aliens, reclassified employees, and employees acquired as a result of a transaction described in Internal Revenue Code Section 410(b)(6)(C) are excluded from the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Retirement Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may elect to make after-tax (Roth) contributions to the Plan of up to 100% of eligible compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company may make discretionary matching contributions (Company's contributions) to the Plan. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company made discretionary matching contributions of 50% of a participant's deferral to the Plan. The Company's contributions are invested as directed by the participant. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's contributions, and plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

NOTE 1 – Description of the Plan (Continued)

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants who were active employees on January 1, 2022 or terminated employment on or after January 1, 2022 are also vested immediately in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts. For participants who terminated employment prior to January 1, 2022, the Company's contribution portion of their accounts was subject to a graded vesting schedule under which participants were 20% vested after two years of credited service and 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The plan administrator will determine a reasonable rate of interest by reviewing the interest rates charged for similar types of loans by other lenders. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the vested interest in the participant's account.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$57,747, \$18,310, and \$2,683, respectively. These accounts may be used to reduce future employer contributions or to pay administrative expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2023, employer contributions were reduced by \$126 from forfeited nonvested accounts. No employer contributions were reduced from forfeited nonvested accounts for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 2 – Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Retirement Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from plan participants and the Company's contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024, 2023, or 2022.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2023 and 2022 excess contributions to applicable participants in September 2024 and July 2023, respectively.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value investments.

Subsequent Events

On March 11, 2025, the Board of Managers Committee elected to terminate the Plan effective March 11, 2025. In connection with the Plan termination, the Plan was frozen to new entrants, participant contributions and loan repayments were no longer permitted, and all participants became 100% vested in their accounts. The Plan has not yet fully distributed its assets as of the date of the report.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through February 27, 2026, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – Certified Investments

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya), the custodian of the Plan, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplementary information is complete and accurate with respect to investments:

- Investments at fair value and contract value
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments
- Interest income, except for interest income on notes receivable from participants
- Schedules of assets held at end of year, except for notes receivable from participants

The Plan's independent public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplementary information.

NOTE 4 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022.

Money market fund: Valued on a trade-date basis with accrued interest.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at quoted market prices which represent the number of shares of the respective underlying fund multiplied by the closing net asset value per share quoted by that fund. The use of net asset value as fair value is deemed appropriate as the pooled separate accounts do not have finite lives, unfunded commitments relating to those types of investments, or significant restrictions on redemptions.

NOTE 5 – Guaranteed Interest Contract with Voya

The Plan invests in a benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Voya totaling \$464,472, \$479,598, and \$447,630 as of December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022, respectively. Voya maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1%. The crediting rate is reviewed on an annual basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Voya, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan’s investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 6 – Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are managed by Voya. Voya is the custodian and recordkeeper for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. As described in Note 2, the Plan made a direct payment to the custodian and recordkeeper in 2024 and 2023 of \$1,000 and \$1,300, respectively, which was not covered by revenue sharing. The plan sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan’s operations.

NOTE 7 – Plan Termination

The Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. As discussed in Note 2, the Board of Managers terminated the Plan as of March 11, 2025. In connection with the Plan’s termination, participants became 100% vested in the Company’s contributions.

NOTE 8 – Tax Status

On June 30, 2020, the IRS stated that the non-standardized pre-approved profit-sharing plan adopted by the Plan, as then designed, qualifies under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself; however, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was designed and was being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

NOTE 8 – Tax Status (Continued)

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
