### *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2024 Financial Statements*

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of The Contractors Retirement Plan Sponsored by Cameron Group, LLC, (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements (2024 Financial Statements).

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the 103-12 IE information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other

additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the 103-12 IE information, we compared such information to the Form 5500 of the 103-12 IE.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the 103-12 IE information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

*December 31, 2024 and 2023*

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**NOTE A – PLAN DESCRIPTION**

The following description of the The Contractors Retirement Plan sponsored by Cameron Group, LLC (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**1. General**

The Plan, established on January 1, 2012, was restated on January 1, 2022 upon adoption of the Contractors Retirement Plan and is a non-standardized defined contribution plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Trustee of the Plan has been designated to hold the assets of the Plan for the benefit of Plan Participants and their beneficiaries in accordance with the terms of this Plan. The Trust Fund established by the Plan's Trustee will be the funding medium used for the accumulation of assets from which Plan benefits will be distributed.

**2. Eligibility**

Eligible individuals consist of employees rendering services for Cameron Group, LLC on contracts subject to the Davis-Bacon Act, Service Contract Act or other federal, state or municipal prevailing wage laws. Other employees whose services are not subject to such prevailing wage laws may be included upon attaining age 20 and 1 year of service. Employees excluded are nonresident aliens (as defined), union employees and residents of Puerto Rico.

**3. Contributions**

Each year, participants may contribute up to the maximum allowed by the applicable laws. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Pretax and Roth (after-tax) contributions are allowed under the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover).

The Sponsor may contribute a discretionary profit sharing contribution, as determined by the Sponsor, to participants who meet the eligibility requirements. During the year ending December 31, 2024, the Sponsor provided profit sharing contributions totaling \$125,000. The employee must have worked at least 1,000 hours during the year and be employed at the end of the year to be eligible for a profit sharing contribution.

The Sponsor may make a discretionary matching contribution equal to a percentage of salary deferrals. The match percentage is decided by the Sponsor each year. During the year ending December 31, 2024, the Sponsor did not provide any matching contributions. The employee must have worked at least 1,000 hours during the year and be employed at the end of the year to be eligible for the employer matching contribution.

**NOTE A – PLAN DESCRIPTION – Continued**

**4. Participant Accounts**

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and Sponsor contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

**5. Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions as well as the Sponsor’s prevailing wage contributions. Vesting in the Sponsor’s discretionary non-elective and matching contributions portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service using the 6 year graded schedule below.

**6. Payment of Benefits**

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or termination of service due to other reasons, a participant or the participant’s estate or beneficiary will receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in the participant’s account. Distributions upon severance of employment must be made at least 60 days after termination of employment. Hardship withdrawals and in-service withdrawals at age 59 ½ are also permitted, subject to provisions defined in the plan document.

**7. Forfeited Accounts**

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$3,768 and \$3,612, respectively. Forfeitures will be used to pay Plan expenses and reduce future Sponsor contributions. Forfeitures occurring during a Plan year shall be used to reduce Sponsor contributions and the remaining forfeitures shall first be used to pay administrative expenses under the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, administrative expenses were reduced by \$3,612 for forfeitures.

**NOTE B – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**1. Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

## **NOTE B – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES – Continued**

### **2. Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### **3. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The fair value of the Plan's interest in the Trust (as defined in Note D) is based on the beginning of year value of the Plan's interest in the Trust plus actual contributions and allocated investment income less actual distributions and allocated administrative expenses.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividend income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

### **4. Contributions**

Contributions from plan participants, prevailing wage contributions, and profit sharing contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

### **5. Excess Contributions Payable**

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding expense deduction. The Plan had no excess contributions payable as of December 31, 2024.

### **6. Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

### **7. Administrative Expenses**

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Sponsor. Expenses that are paid by the Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to certain benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

### **8. Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through March 12, 2026, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

## **NOTE C – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN’S CUSTODIANS**

Certain information related to investments in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information provided to the Plan administrator and has been prepared and certified as complete and accurate by ERISA SMART, the Trustee of the Plan.

## **NOTE D – FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets:
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets:
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability:
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Group Trust - 103-12 Investment Entity: The investment is valued based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. The Net Asset Value (“NAV”) is based on the market value of the underlying investments. The NAV is not a publicly quoted price in an active market.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflected of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

## **NOTE D – FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS – Continued**

Investments, at fair value, that are valued using NAV as a practical expedient totaled \$1,861,781 and \$1,644,446 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

## **NOTE E – INVESTMENT IN RETIREMENT PLAN GROUP TRUST**

The Plan invests in a group trust, The Contractors Retirement Plan Master Trust (Trust), sponsored by Transamerica. Under the terms of the plan document, all assets of the Plan are maintained in the Trust.

The Trust files a Form 5500 as a 103-12 Investment Entity.

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-12 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following information was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the Plan's independent auditor other than comparing such information provided by the Trust to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule:

- Investments, at fair value, as shown in the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Total investment income as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Schedule H, line 4i – schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

The Contractors Retirement Plan Master Trust does not meet the definition of a master trust as that term is most commonly used. The Plan's investment in the Trust represents the allocated net portion of the Trust that is attributable to The Contractors Retirement Plan sponsored by Cameron Group, LLC and includes all the Plan's investments.

The Plan's share of the net assets of the Trust is based on the underlying participant account values including the effects of contributions, allocated net investment income, withdrawals, and allocated administrative expenses. Net investment income, gains and losses are allocated to participating plans on a daily basis based on participants' investment choices.

## **NOTE F – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Effective January 1, 2024, Transamerica Retirement Solutions (TRS) was assigned certain transactional and recordkeeping duties of the Plan. Various administrative expenses and asset charges of the Trust are paid to Transamerica and are allocated to the Plan. The Plan Administrator for the Plan is the employer, or any other individual, committee or group appointed by the employer to serve in that capacity.

The Plan Administrator, Investment Manager and the Trustee are named as fiduciaries under the Plan. All the above-named service providers for the Plan are considered parties in interest under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and are subject to ERISA rules concerning transactions with the Plan.

## **NOTE G – PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their allocation of Sponsor contribution accounts.

## **NOTE H – TAX STATUS**

The Master Plan Sponsor obtained its latest opinion letter, dated August 24, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Master Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Such an opinion is not a determination as to whether The Contractors Retirement Plan sponsored by Cameron Group, LLC itself qualifies under IRC Section 401(a); however, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe the Plan was qualified as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

## **NOTE I – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
