Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2022 Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of Alliance Entertainment 401K Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements (2022 Financial Statements).

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the 2022 financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Alliance Entertainment 401K Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan effective October 8, 2010 and amended March 29, 2022, covering eligible employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA. All employees of Alliance Entertainment (the "Company") or (the "Plan Sponsor") are eligible to participate in the plan after 1 month of service except employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement and nonresident aliens at the age of 18.

Contributions

Each year participants may contribute up to 75% of their compensation to the Plan not to exceed the maximum allowable IRC 402(g) limit of \$20,500 for 2022. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set to 3 percent of eligible compensation.

The Plan may make a discretionary matching contribution and a discretionary nonelective contribution. The maximum IRC 415 limit for total contributions made on behalf of a participant (deferrals and employer contributions) is \$61,000 for 2022. Catch-up contributions can be made in excess of this limit.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the plan. The plan currently offers various mutual funds for participants.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and Company matching contributions as well as allocations of plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that were paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested balance.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and earnings thereon. Vesting in company matching contributions are on a 5-year graded scale.

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (continued)

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan must bear a reasonable amount of interest. The interest rate for 2022 ranged from 4.25% to 6.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution, or installments. In-service withdrawals allowed for hardships and at age 59 ½.

The distributable amount is equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Employees who elect to have their benefit payments deferred continue to share in allocations of investment income and losses but do not share in subsequent allocations of discretionary contributions.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2022 and 2021, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$169,644 and \$136,838, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and administrative expenses. In 2022, employer contributions were reduced by \$0 from forfeited non-vested accounts.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

For plan years 2016 through 2022, management has accrued a liability related to unresolved ADP test failures. The final amount of this liability may differ based on the method of correction ultimately applied, including the potential use of Qualified Non-elective Contributions (QNECs) to satisfy the nondiscrimination requirements.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded in the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses have been recorded as of December 31, 2022 or 2021.

Excess Contribution Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan did not distribute the 2016 - 2022 excess contribution in a timely manner. See note 11.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investments related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of the fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 2, 2025 the date of the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 as described as follows:

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish at their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at the price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Money Market Fund: Valued at quoted prices in the active market of identical securities

NOTE 5. NONPARTICIPANTS-DIRECTED INVESTMENTS

The Plan's participants direct all investments. There are no non-participant directed investments as of December 31, 2022 and 2021.

NOTE 6. RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company. Fidelity Management Trust Company is the custodian for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. The Plan also made direct payments to third party administrators of \$30,415. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the plan's operations. The Plan Custodian receives fees from administration and investment management.

NOTE 7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the rights under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 8. TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by letter June 30, 2020 in which the Internal Service stated that the Plan, is designed, in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9. RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant's account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 11. FAILURE TO CORRECT EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE

The plan did not pass the Actual Deferral Percentage (ADP) nondiscrimination test for the plan years 2016 through 2022. As of the date of these financial statements, the excess contributions for the designated highly compensated employees (HCEs) related to those years have not been distributed, and no Qualified Non-Elective Contributions (QNECs) have yet been made to correct the failures.

The Plan Sponsor is aware of the testing failures and may correct them through QNECs to eligible non-highly compensated employees (NHCEs) for each of the affected plan years. However, the specific QNEC amounts have not yet been calculated or funded. Accordingly, a liability has been recorded in the accompanying financial statements for the estimated excess contributions that would otherwise be required to be distributed to HCEs in the absence of a QNEC correction.

The Plan Sponsor intends to quickly initiate any corrections under the IRS Employee Plans Compliance Resolution System (EPCRS), which may include submission under the Voluntary Correction Program (VCP), to address the failures in accordance with any applicable regulatory guidance.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2022 and 2021

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Alliance Entertainment 401K Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan effective October 8, 2010 and amended March 29, 2022, covering eligible employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA. All employees of Alliance Entertainment (the "Company") or (the "Plan Sponsor") are eligible to participate in the plan after 1 month of service except employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement and nonresident aliens at the age of 18.

Contributions

Each year participants may contribute up to 75% of their compensation to the Plan not to exceed the maximum allowable IRC 402(g) limit of \$20,500 for 2022. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set to 3 percent of eligible compensation.

The Plan may make a discretionary matching contribution and a discretionary nonelective contribution. The maximum IRC 415 limit for total contributions made on behalf of a participant (deferrals and employer contributions) is \$61,000 for 2022. Catch-up contributions can be made in excess of this limit.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the plan. The plan currently offers various mutual funds for participants.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and Company matching contributions as well as allocations of plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that were paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested balance.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and earnings thereon. Vesting in company matching contributions are on a 5-year graded scale.

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (continued)

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan must bear a reasonable amount of interest. The interest rate for 2022 ranged from 4.25% to 6.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution, or installments. In-service withdrawals allowed for hardships and at age 59 ½.

The distributable amount is equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Employees who elect to have their benefit payments deferred continue to share in allocations of investment income and losses but do not share in subsequent allocations of discretionary contributions.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2022 and 2021, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$169,644 and \$136,838, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and administrative expenses. In 2022, employer contributions were reduced by \$0 from forfeited non-vested accounts.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

For plan years 2016 through 2022, management has accrued a liability related to unresolved ADP test failures. The final amount of this liability may differ based on the method of correction ultimately applied, including the potential use of Qualified Non-elective Contributions (QNECs) to satisfy the nondiscrimination requirements.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded in the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses have been recorded as of December 31, 2022 or 2021.

Excess Contribution Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan did not distribute the 2016 - 2022 excess contribution in a timely manner. See note 11.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investments related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of the fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 2, 2025 the date of the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 as described as follows:

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish at their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at the price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Money Market Fund: Valued at quoted prices in the active market of identical securities

NOTE 5. NONPARTICIPANTS-DIRECTED INVESTMENTS

The Plan's participants direct all investments. There are no non-participant directed investments as of December 31, 2022 and 2021.

NOTE 6. RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company. Fidelity Management Trust Company is the custodian for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. The Plan also made direct payments to third party administrators of \$30,415. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the plan's operations. The Plan Custodian receives fees from administration and investment management.

NOTE 7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the rights under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 8. TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by letter June 30, 2020 in which the Internal Service stated that the Plan, is designed, in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9. RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant's account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 11. FAILURE TO CORRECT EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE

The plan did not pass the Actual Deferral Percentage (ADP) nondiscrimination test for the plan years 2016 through 2022. As of the date of these financial statements, the excess contributions for the designated highly compensated employees (HCEs) related to those years have not been distributed, and no Qualified Non-Elective Contributions (QNECs) have yet been made to correct the failures.

The Plan Sponsor is aware of the testing failures and may correct them through QNECs to eligible non-highly compensated employees (NHCEs) for each of the affected plan years. However, the specific QNEC amounts have not yet been calculated or funded. Accordingly, a liability has been recorded in the accompanying financial statements for the estimated excess contributions that would otherwise be required to be distributed to HCEs in the absence of a QNEC correction.

The Plan Sponsor intends to quickly initiate any corrections under the IRS Employee Plans Compliance Resolution System (EPCRS), which may include submission under the Voluntary Correction Program (VCP), to address the failures in accordance with any applicable regulatory guidance.
