Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Michael Hohl Administrative Group Medical Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net deficit available for benefits and statements of benefit obligations as of June 30, 2025 and March 31, 2025, and the related statements of changes in net deficit available for benefits and statements of benefit obligations for the period April 1, 2025 through June 30, 2025 and the year ended March 31, 2025, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Michael Hohl Administrative Group Medical Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan provides health benefits to eligible employees of Michael Hohl Administrative (the Company) and covered dependents. Eligible employees are all regular employees of the Employer scheduled to work 30 or more hours per week on a full-time basis. Effective April 1, 2024, certain Plan assets are held in a trust. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Contributions

In addition to deductibles and copayments, participants contribute specified amounts based on applicable monthly premiums for their respective benefit elections. The Company makes contributions to the Plan as needed to fund claims and expenses in excess of participants' contributions. Any deficiency of the Plan's net assets over benefit obligations is funded by the Company on a pay-as-you-go basis.

Benefits

The Plan provides medical and prescription drug benefits to all eligible enrolled employees and enrolled dependents. The Plan also provides continuation of certain benefits upon termination of employment through the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA).

Self-insured Benefits

All Plan benefits are self-insured, including medical and prescription drug benefits. The claims for self-insured benefits are processed by Meritain Health, Inc. under administrative services only (ASO) arrangements. Meritain Health Inc. pays claims directly to or on behalf of participants and is then reimbursed by the Plan's trust. Veris Benefits Consortium, LLC (Veris) pays claims directly to or on behalf of participants from the claims funding account held by Veris. Despite the Plan's utilization of third-party claims processors, ultimate responsibility for payments to providers and participants is retained by the Plan.

Stop-Loss Coverage

The Company has entered into a stop-loss insurance arrangement in an effort to limit their exposure for self-insured benefits (individual participant claims over a specified dollar amount, as well as aggregate exposure for all claims). The premiums are being paid by the Plan. The Company has elected to deposit all stop loss reimbursements into the trust. These reimbursements are included in contributions on the Statements of Changes in Net Deficit Available for Benefits.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, benefit obligations, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Contributions

Contributions from the Company to cover administrative expenses are recorded in the period in which such expenses are incurred. Contributions from the Company to cover claims are recorded in the period in which the claims are paid by the Plan. Contributions from the Company are paid based upon the amount required to be funded under the provisions of the Plan. Employee contributions are recorded in the period in which they are withheld from payroll.

From time to time, management may prefund the Plan and deposits are held in an account owned by Benecon (service provider) until claims and expenses are incurred. This may result in a receivable at year end. At June 30, 2025 and March 31, 2025 there were \$1,414 and \$0 receivables from service provider, respectively.

Benefits

Claim payments are recorded when paid by the Plan.

Benefit Obligations

As of June 30, 2025 and March 31, 2025, there are self-funded claims that have been incurred on which benefit payments have been and/or will be made subsequent to that date. Estimated claims payable represents unpaid claims at year-end that have been reported to the claims administrator and is based on information available regarding claims paid subsequent to the Plan year-end. Estimated claims incurred but not reported is based on information available to Benecon regarding claims incurred during the year, claims history of the plan, and other trend factors. The Plan does not provide postretirement benefits.

Any deficiency of the Plan's net deficit available for benefits over benefit obligations is funded through future employee and Employer contributions on a pay-as-you-go basis.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Administrative Expenses

The Plan pays administrative expenses that consist primarily of administrative fees paid to third-party claims administrators. These expenses are reported on the statements of changes in net deficit available for benefits as administrative expenses. All other administrative expenses, such as professional fees, are paid by the Employer on behalf of the Plan and are excluded from these financial statements.

Concentration of Credit Risk

The Plan's cash balances are held at one financial institution. Accounts at this institution are insured by a government agency up to \$250,000. At times the balances in these accounts may exceed the insured limit.

Subsequent Events

Effective July 1, 2025 the Plan began fully insuring all benefits of the Plan. All subsequent activity of the Plan flows through the general assets of the Plan sponsor.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through April 8, 2026, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 TAX STATUS

The trust of the Plan is structured as a taxable trust to serve as a funding vehicle for the Plan under appropriate sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The trust has not generated taxable income during the period April 1, 2025 through June 30, 2025 or the year ended March 31, 2025.

Accounting policies generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 4 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to modify the benefits provided to, and contributions required of participants, to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, remaining assets will be applied in a uniform and nondiscriminatory manner toward the provision of benefits or for on account of the participants. No assets of the Plan may revert to the Company or be used for purposes other than for the exclusive benefit of the Plan's participants.

NOTE 5 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

As described in Notes 1 and 2, the Plan has several arrangements with service providers. These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 6 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The liability for claims incurred but not reported (IBNR) at June 30, 2025 and March 31, 2025 were estimated by management using reporting from Benecon, who used a reserve factor to a credible best estimate volume measurement of paid claims. Benecon utilized information available regarding claims incurred during the year, claims history of the plan, and other trend factors. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.
