Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Curtain Wall Design & Consulting, Inc. Employees Savings Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis as of August 31, 2025 and 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis for the year ended August 31, 2025, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of Curtain Wall Design & Consulting, Inc. Employees Savings Plan ("Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of Curtain Wall Design and Consulting, Inc. ("Company" or "Employer") and Williamson & Associates, Inc., a participating related employer, other than those nondiscriminatory classifications specified in the Plan agreement, who has two months of service and are age 20 or older, with entry dates as of the first day of each month. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Board of Trustees is responsible for the oversight of the Plan, including determining the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitoring investment performance.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of pre-tax or after-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, up to the maximum percentage allowable not to exceed the limits of IRS code sections 401(k), 402(g), 404 and 415. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions, as well as any Company matching or profit-sharing contributions, into various investment options offered by the Plan. For 2025, the Company made qualified automatic matching contributions of 100% of the first 1% of compensation contributed to the Plan, plus 50% of the remaining contribution. For 2025, employer matching contributions totaled \$1,068,860. The Company may, at its sole discretion, contribute and allocate to each eligible participant's account a profit sharing contribution in proportion to their compensation for the fiscal year ending August 31. For 2025, the Company made profit sharing contributions totaling \$1,275,004. Contributions are subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Automatic Enrollment

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at six percent of eligible compensation of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit sharing contribution and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested in the Company's safe harbor nonelective contributions after two years of credit service and 100% vested in discretionary matching or profit sharing contributions after six years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at prime rate plus 1% at the time the loan is made, with rates currently ranging from 4.25% to 10.5%, which is commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution, or annual installments under the terms defined in the Plan. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Forfeited Accounts

At August 31, 2025 and August 31, 2024 forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$72,856 and \$81,372, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or Plan expenses. Also, in 2025, employer Plan expenses were reduced by \$9,000 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the modified cash basis of accounting; consequently, contributions and investment income are recorded as received and expenses when paid. Investment transactions are recorded as cash is received and disbursed, rather than at the trade-date, as required by generally accepted accounting principles.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded as cash is received and disbursed. Dividends are recorded when received. Net appreciation includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are remitted to the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of August 31, 2025 or August 31, 2024. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through April 29, 2026 the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at August 31, 2025 and August 31, 2024.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common/collective trusts: The collective trust funds are public investment vehicles valued using the NAV as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liability. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Gains and losses included in changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended August 31, 2025 and 2024, are reported in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

The Plan's policy is to recognize transfers between Levels 1 and 2 and into and out of Level 3 as of the date of the event or change in circumstances that caused the transfer. For the year ended August 31, 2025, there were no significant transfers between Levels 1 and 2 and no transfers into or out of Level 3.

Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at August 31, 2025 and 2024, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended August 31, 2025, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Empower Trust Company, LLC (the trustee of the Plan).

Note 4 - Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the sponsoring organization by a letter dated June 30, 2021, that the prototype plan adopted by the Company was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

The modified cash basis of accounting requires the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 5 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Employer contributions.

Note 6 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis.
