Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2025 Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Hudson Community Enterprises, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. 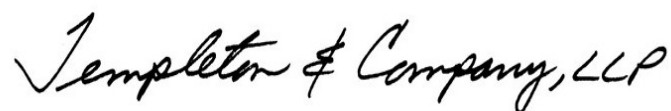

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 – Description of Plan

The following description of the Hudson Community Enterprises, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General and eligibility

The Plan was established on January 1, 2009, as a defined contribution plan. The Plan has been amended and restated over the years to comply with tax legislation, and the most recent restatement was on April 4, 2022. The Plan covers all eligible employees of Hudson Community Enterprises, Inc. (the Organization, Employer or Plan Sponsor). Eligible employees are full-time employees who have completed six (6) consecutive months of credited service with 500 hours and have reached age twenty-one (21), as defined in the Plan document. Eligible employees may enter the Plan on the day service requirements are met.

The Plan's management determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Organization is the Plan Administrator.

Contributions

Each year, participants in the Plan may voluntarily contribute up to 100% of their annual compensation, as defined by the Plan, within the limits prescribed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollover). Roth 401(k) deferrals are permitted under the Plan's provisions.

The Organization makes safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of a participant's deferrals that are not in excess of 3% of the participant's eligible compensation, and 50% of a participant's deferrals that are between 3% and 5% of the participant's eligible compensation, as defined. For the year ended December 31, 2025, the Organization's safe harbor matching contributions totaled \$170,857.

The Organization may also make additional discretionary profit-sharing contributions as directed by management. The Organization made no discretionary profit-sharing contributions for the year ended December 31, 2025.

Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and an allocation of: (a) the Employer's contributions (if any) and (b) Plan earnings or losses thereon. Participants are charged with his or her withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or losses, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. All participant contributions are participant-directed and may be invested into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their individual contributions and their Employer's safe harbor matching and profit-sharing contributions, plus actual earnings or losses thereon.

Note 1 – Description of Plan, Continued

Forfeitures

Forfeited nonvested accounts may be used to offset Plan administrative expenses or reduce future Employer contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2025, forfeitures totaling \$2,918 were used to offset Employer contributions. At December 31, 2025 and 2024, unallocated nonvested forfeited accounts totaled \$2,294 and \$2,334, respectively.

Notes receivable from participants

Plan participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years unless the loan is used to acquire the principal residence of the participant. Loans are secured by the vested account balance in the participant's account. Interest determined by the Plan Administrator as of the date of the loan request. A participant may have one (1) loan outstanding at any given time. Principal and interest are paid ratably through regular payroll deductions and remitted to the Plan. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as distributions, under the Plan's provisions. Principal and interest are paid ratably through regular payroll deductions. All loans are required to be repaid within a period of five years, except loans to acquire the participant's principal residence which must be repaid in a reasonable period of time (5 years), not to exceed thirty years.

Payment of benefits

In most cases, upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant, or his or her designated beneficiary, may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in the form of a lump-sum payment, installment payment plan or partial withdrawal. In-service withdrawals are permitted upon the participant attaining the age of 59 ½, disability, as outlined in the adoption agreement, and as a qualified reservist distribution.

Plan administration

The Organization is the Plan Administrator, and as such, controls and manages the operations of the Plan. The Plan's investment assets are maintained by Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company (Transamerica or the Custodian), the Plan's recordkeeper and custodian. Transamerica invests cash received, interest and dividend income and makes distributions to participants (subject to the direction of the participants). The Plan allows certain administrative expenses to be paid from Plan investment assets.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts which are valued at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan management and its advisor determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and the Custodian.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, Continued

Investment valuation and income recognition, continued

Interest income is recognized when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from such estimates, and those differences could be material.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, market risk, and credit risk. Due to the high level of risk associated with certain investment securities, including the uncertainty related to changes in the values of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in such risks in the near-term would materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual method. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and expensed as incurred. If a participant ceases to make scheduled repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant note receivable to be in default, the note receivable balance is reduced and a benefit payment recorded. There was no allowance for doubtful collection as of December 31, 2025 and 2024.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the participant contributions are withheld from compensation.

Payment of benefits

The Plan records benefits when paid.

Administrative expenses

The Plan allows certain administrative expenses to be paid from Plan investment assets. Certain administrative expenses are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and are not reflected in the financial statements.

Uncertain tax positions

U.S. GAAP requires the Plan management to assess its uncertain tax positions for the likelihood they would be overturned upon examination by the IRS. In accordance with this guidance, the Plan management has determined it does not have any positions at December 31, 2025, that it would be unable to substantiate.

Note 3 – Certified Investment Information

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company, the Custodian, a qualified institution, has certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown on the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2025 and 2024;
- Net investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2025; and
- Investment information included in Schedule H, line 4i – schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2025, as shown on the ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

At the request of the Plan's Administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified information, except for comparing such certified information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and disclosures related to the investments to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP, and in the ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including assessing whether the supplemental schedule is in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements

Accounting guidance provides a framework for measuring fair value and establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1	Unadjusted quoted prices for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities in active markets that a plan has the ability to access.
Level 2	Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.
Level 3	Significant unobservable inputs.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There have been no changes in the applicable methodology used at December 31, 2025 and 2024. During the year ended December 31, 2025, there were no transfers of financial instruments into or out of Level 3.

Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements, Continued

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value:

Pooled separate accounts – Valued at net asset value (NAV) based upon the units of such pooled separate accounts held by the Plan at year-end multiplied by the respective unit value. The unit values of the pooled separate accounts are based upon significant observable inputs but are not based upon quoted market prices in an active market and are therefore considered Level 2 investments within the fair value hierarchy.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodology or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 – Investment Contract with Insurance Company

The Plan invests in a fully benefit-responsive investment contract (FBRIC) issued by Transamerica (the issuer) with a contract value of \$24,765 and \$265,917, as of December 31, 2025 and 2024, respectively. The contributions are maintained in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Transamerica is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The effective rate of interest is established every January 1 and July 1 and is based on the daily balance, at a rate that is the daily equivalent of the effective annual rate of interest applicable for the six-month period. The average crediting rate for the year ended December 31, 2025, was 1.60%. Per the contract's terms, Transamerica may not terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

The contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measurement for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because it is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Transamerica, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on Transamerica's ability to meet its financial obligations. Transamerica's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Note 5 – Investment Contract with Insurance Company, Continued

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with Transamerica. Such events include amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA or premature termination of the contract.

The Plan Administrator does not believe any events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with Transamerica and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow Transamerica to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, a breach of a material obligation under the contract, a material misrepresentation, or a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of Transamerica.

Based on ongoing credit evaluations of its guaranteed investment contract, Plan management does not expect payment defaults on delinquencies and has not recorded an allowance for credit losses for these investments as of December 31, 2025.

Note 6 – Party-In-Interest Transactions

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering services to the Plan, the Employer, and certain related entities. The Plan's investments are managed, administered and issued by Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company (Transamerica), the Plan's custodian. Transamerica and its affiliate, Transamerica Retirement Solutions, LLC (TRS), also provide recordkeeping and administrative services to the Plan. Accordingly, transactions with Transamerica and TRS qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Such transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction provisions of ERISA, provided applicable statutory and administrative exemptions are satisfied.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers and employees of the Employer. No officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan for these services.

Note 7 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all participants' accounts will become fully vested in the Employer's contribution portion of their accounts.

Note 8 – Tax Status

On June 30, 2020, the IRS stated that the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit-Sharing Plan with CODA adopted by the Plan, as then designed, qualifies under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), and therefore, the Plan and its related trust is tax-exempt. The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself. The Plan has been amended since receiving the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved letter, however, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9 – Delinquent Participant Contributions

The Plan Sponsor is required to segregate participant contributions from its general assets as soon as it is practicable in accordance with ERISA Section 2510.3-102. For the year ended December 31, 2025, the Plan Sponsor failed to timely remit to the Plan certain participant contributions and loan payments totaling \$58. The Plan Sponsor corrected the delinquent participant contributions for lost earnings during 2026.

Note 10 – Subsequent Events

The Plan evaluated events occurring subsequent to December 31, 2025 through May 5, 2026, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued, for matters that should be recorded in the financial statements or disclosed in the footnotes thereto.
